Steffensens honored at Tacoma tourney

TACOMA, Wash. — There was hardly a dry eye Saturday as Jack and Linda Steffensen were inducted into the Evergreen Shuffleboard Association/Pacific Northwest Table Shuffleboard Hall of Fame during the Jack Steffensen Memorial Tournament at Nifty Fifty's.

Jack Steffensen died two years ago after a stellar career as a league and tournament player. Friends remembered him as someone who liked seeing people smile and who enjoyed a good time whether it was fishing with friends, playing a game of shuffleboard or hanging out with family and friends.

There was as much laughter as tears as people recalled Jack in funny situations.

Rob Heidel recalled the time he talked Jack into painting a car. They drank a few beers and mixed up all of the paint in Jack's garage. When Rob took the car home it was a tourquoise color that came too close to matching the color of his house.

California champs to be determined

HUNTINGTON BEACH, Calif. — Finally, after much talk - a beginning to what is hoped will be an annual state championship for shuffleboard players in California is scheduled for the Huntington Beach Moose Lodge on the first weekend in October.

Tournament organizers, sponsors and Moose officials have two amateur doubles events on tap beginning Friday, Oct. 1.

The event is sponsored by Jammin' Jerky who will contribute \$100 of added money for each championship event. Jammin' Jerky

is a tasty new low carbohydrate beef jerky product of Long Beach based Jammin' Foods LLC.

Sponsor sales for both the add-to-three doubles and add-to-five doubles is scheduled for that evening beginning at 7 p.m. Play in the add-to-five doubles will begin immediately following the team sales with the add-to-three doubles scheduled for Saturday, October 2, at a time to be determined. Both events are two out of three double elimination tournaments in both the winners and losers brackets. The format is subject to change based on the number of entries.

Organizers plan on having six shuffleboards available and a \$20 registration fee is necessary to help defray costs of the boards and championship plaques. The add-to-three doubles has a \$100 entry fee per team, while the add-to-five doubles is \$50 per team. The tournament is open to California players rated one and above

First shot at result-based ratings

Several months ago, I wrote a column about the need for an objective rating system to replace the subjective one that is currently in place. The column didn't offer a solution other than something that isn't subjective.

In recent weeks, the gauntlet has been thrown down challenging me to provide something far more specific.

So, after a doctor's appointment on Monday to see if they can figure out a cure for this damned sinus infection that makes me sound like I'm talking out of bubbles, I sat down at the computer to mull the answer.

Pretty soon mulling was interspersed with napping as the bright fall sun reflected off the bay and through the window next to the computer.

Mull.

Nap.

Mull.

Nap.

Nap

Thankfully Bob Davidson from Pacific Coast Shuffleboard News in California called to see if I'd received an email from him. Too bad Bob couldn't understand me very well either. Sorry Bob.

Computers are the answer to a performance-based rating system. At least the one that mulled through my mind while I wasn't napping. Or maybe it was the other way around.

When I first started thinking about performance-based ratings, the dilemma was how to rank each tournament. Winning an A/B bring partner at Jim's House of Shuffleboard Tavern couldn't carry as much weight as winning the A/B at the North American Shuffleboard Championships in Reno. If people ranked the tournaments,

then we'd be back to a subjective system again.

The answer to that problem is relatively simple.

Each tournament would rank itself by the field of participants.

Let's say there were 16 players at Jim's House of Shuffleboard ranging from -.97 to 3.50. The average rating in the field would be 1.42. Multiply that by the placing in the field would give the rating for that tournament. The champs would be rated 1.42, second place 2.84 and so on.

A player's overall rating would be determined by adding all of the tournament ratings together and dividing by the number of tournaments played.

The ratings, of course, wouldn't look anything like the -1 to 5 that is currently in place.

It would take a someone with computer program writing experience to put it together, but California's Eddie Brayman may have done at least some of that work with his "Shuffleboard Peas" software that generates pairings, teams in draw events, and brackets. The software, according to Brayman, has a repository feature that would allow storage of tournament results.

I haven't talked with Eddie about whether his software — which drew rave reviews from Steve Fisher during the Winston, Ore., tournament — could be modified to accommodate the rating system.

Using a computerized system would mean a players' rating could change from week-to-week. Players who weren't competing would essentially "freeze" their rating.

So there it is.

One idea about how an objective rating system might be set-up.

It isn't perfect, or even close.

I welcome your thoughts about an objective rating system or staying with the current system.

Meanwhile, I'll be mulling or napping

Ratings get better when more raters are involved

Good opening article and request for info. I was happy to see your comments on the Bowers and explaining your difference of opinion. That may go a long way in helping your cause.

My personal opinion on the Bower's System is that it works well for 90% of the tournament players. It requires a minimum of effort by a few raters, no effort by most players and a lot of effort by the Bowers. It is subjective but gets better as the number of raters increases. It does not cover all players, and it tends to have a bias in lowering ratings vs raising ratings. There are really no good guidelines for what makes a -1 or a 2 or a 4. It seems that this can be based on experienced players (raters) comparisons to their memories, other people with like ratings or a performance in a tournament close to the rating season.

I've given some thought to a performance based rating system. Golf is an good example of performance based ratings, with data generated by the golfers themselves and kept by the Golf Club or Organization. But golf has a final score that differentiates an individual performance and is primarily a singles game. Shuffleboard is primarily a partner's game and always ends at a score of 15. In addition I have noticed that the difference in the winning and losing score does not generally match the handicap difference.

First the goal of the handicapping system would have to be de-

finied. Is it to try and make opponents of different skill levels play an even game (whole numbers)? Is it to rank players in a certain order (decimal numbers). Should it be fast enough to keep pace with quick learning or declining players? Should it be based on positive or negative use of handicap values? How should it be applied when playing partners (added or added/2).

To be successful it should:

Be easy to generate and submit player ratings input data.

Be Consistent

Be Repeatable

Cover all levels of players

Include all players (not just major tourney players)

Be Recalculated Monthly or Quarterly at a minimum

Make handicaps easily available

Be used

To be done efficiently it would need a real time database of ratings input data such as players/games/tournaments/position placed, updatable over the web by locals. It would need some kind of algorithm to calculate ratings considering # of competitors, were handicaps used, skill of competitors, skill and contribution of partners and opposing team if not a singles match (which most aren't).

Who would rate them?

Your suggestion that players need not be rated unless they want to be rated puzzles me.

If a player were to decline to be rated, then how would you propose that she be paired or handicapped in tournaments?

Would you require her to play as a pro? Would you instead have each tournament rate each player? If so, would you have replaced an admittedly subjective system with an even more subjective system but one based on far less information about the player who has declined to be rated?

This can be simplified but may then become less performance based.

The database and web interface are easy to develop for entering data, calculating results and displaying ratings. We could probably even develop some kind of ratings calculation that made some sense.

BUT!! What would keep it from working is Shuffleboard Players are an inherently lazy group. Keeping a performance based rating system requires a lot of work and effort by a lot of local players and the keepers of the centralized rating system data.

A performance based system may be possible but it will take a lot of thought, a lot of work and acceptance by a majority of players. If you get a discussion started maybe something that makes sense will materialize.

Fifty-six players competed with 12 Division 1 teams and 16 in Division 2.

ESA points leader Jim Tribble, Mud Bay, built on that lead as he and Don "Mitch" Mitchell, Olympia, won the Division 1 doubles.

Joanie Millar, Vancouver BC, and Dennis Smith, Seattle, grabbed second place while Tommy Campbell and Rick Shaw, both Seattle, finished third. Mitchell, Millar and Campbell are all Hall of Fame members.

In Division II, Ted Ausbun, Tacoma and Justin Kasa, Port Orchard, grabbed first place.

The win was the first-ever for Ausbun but marked the continued excellent play of Kasa who teamed with Alvin Orcutt two weeks ago to win the A/B bring partner doubles at the Red Dog in Port Orchard.

Mike and Ryan Strayer, Shelton, finished second with Jeanette Hohn-Bob Hurst, also from Shelton in third and Paulette McKinney, Shelton, and Judy George, Tacoma, in fourth place.
