The Hammer

Guest Editorial by Phil McGrew, Toledo, Ohio

Over the years, the largest contributing factor to the decline of the game of shuffleboard has been the deterioration of playing conditions. Nothing can be more discouraging to a new player trying to learn how to play this sometimes frustrating, always challenging, game of ours than to run up against worn-out boards, worn-out weights and tables jammed up against walls.

We, as players, must help the owners realize that in order to keep the sport of shuffleboard growing, we must have the top-notch playing conditions that make this game fun to play. We should teach anyone who will listen the benefits of using paste wax, corner waxing and waxing after each and every game. It's these basic procedures performed religiously that add to the life of a playing surface and to the level of skill at which the game can be played.

We need boards positioned with enough room that every player is free to use his or her own style without ramming into walls, tables, chairs or people. Playing surfaces that have good speed and realistic drifts are important. I believe you should be able to run both rails and shoot both crosses without any shot being an automatic, or for all practical purposes, impossible. Good pucks that, if thrown the same speed, won't stop four or five feet short of one another or leave large trails through the surface wax are vital to good

These are the types of conditions needed if our game is to grow. It is our responsibility as players to educate the owners to the fact that if they want our business, they will have to invest the small amount of time and money that is required to make our game playable in its top form at their establishments. As all of us know, when shuffleboard players show up, they are still around when they bark, "Last call!"

Through the years, top playing conditions will mean more people playing the game, will produce more \$\$ for the owners, and will provide more fun for shuffleboard addicts everywhere.


