Las Vegas Team Wins National Tourney

Our Nevada Board Talk reporter, Balboa Ron Schweickert, told you readers how much he was looking forward to having the U.S. Open Amateur Tournament in "his" town, Las Vegas, and that enthusiasm carried his team to victory at the Showboat Casino, Dec. 7-9.

It was a six-man team, sponsored by Gera's Lounge, that won the tournament. The winning players were: captain George Zariphes, Jim Goulden, Frank Zazla, Russ Moppert, "Sheriff" Frank and Balboa Ron. Second place was captured by what Ron calls "a fine and very competitive team" from Phoenix, Arizona, sponsored by the "That Place" Lounge.

The \$2,000 prize money was split 70%-30%. The His & Hers Tournament was won by the Billy Mays family.

"The new frame system was used as opposed to 15 points — 10 frames of play per game, double elimination (except for the final playoff game which was single elimination)," Ron reports. "There are a lot of pros and cons regarding frame play. However, it does lend itself to more timely scheduling of teams in a long tournament of this type."

Ron reminds shuffleboarders of the 32-player Open Pro Singles Championship at the Las Vegas Showboat in January. "We hope to see many players here," he said.

At Bus's 504 Tavern in Marion, Dec. 9 with 15 teams and prize money of \$685, winners were: 1st, Bob Brown and Dennis Borgerding; 2nd, Ron Welborn and Curley McNally; 3rd, Bob Voorhis and Jerry Warr; 4th, Emmett Wilcox and Star.

At the Hog House on Dec. 15, 19 teams vied for prize money of \$1,385. Winners were: 1st, Steve Hart and Emmett Wilcox; 2nd, Tom and Bob Vorndram; 3rd, Bobby Brown Jr. and Mel Sanders; 4th Dave Boaz and John Hume.

Upcoming tournaments are: Jan. 5, Palace Bar, Fairmont; Jan. 12, Hide-A-Way Inn, Anderson; Jan. 19, Sportsmans Bar, Muncie; Jan. 26, Weltz's Place, Anderson; Feb. 2, American Bar, Portland; Feb. 9, Town Tavern, Summitville; Feb. 16, Red Dog, Muncie.

"If the players, along with distributors and companies, continue promoting and supporting shuffleboard, it can only



#### THE BLACK CAT TAVERN

8230 SE 13th, Portland, Oregon Nominated by Evelyn Wechter

There's no question that The Black Cat Tavern shuffleboard action is very much alive. Even during the recent recession, shuffleboard is doing quite well. When you're not working or sleeping, the main recreation in Portland, Oregon, is a good game of shuffleboard.

The players and owners all work together, keeping the boards in top shape. You won't find the Cat's three boards in poor condition!

At one of The Black Cat's big national tournaments in 1979, TV cameras televised the last game with first place going to Bill Melton and Dave Williams and second to Galen Gaunce and Billy Chiles. In 1980, the national tournament was once again televised with first place going to Darrell Nelson and Galen Gaunce.

The Black Cat's Trailpuckers League is lucky to have Al Slechmesser helping out. Players in this league have a handicap. The in-house league starts in September and continues for 10 weeks each Tuesday night, six teams, four players per team. Money from the league is used to help people in need.

Shuffleboard players travel up to 150 miles to play in The Black Cat in-house league on Friday nights, Nov. 9 through Feb. 8, with the owner drawing for each player out of a pea pod. The three-person teams are made up of A, B and C players. Each team plays two Fridays a month, leaving one board open every Friday night. Shuffleboard players traveling to Portland, Oregon, are welcome to drop in and try to beat the best on the open board.

The Black Cat also plays in the Circle Invitation Shuffleboard Portland League. Galen Gaunce is captain of a 10-person team made up of Dick Freer, Eugene Johnson, Bob Miers, Jody Bashaw, Red Foster, Lee Vachter, Lee Stewart, Shirley Johnson and Dole Murphy. You'll find lots of action every Wednesday night.

The Black Cat has won many city championships and has a beautiful display of trophies. When the leagues are over for the year, the tavern holds round robbins every Friday night.

The success of The Black Cat Tavern is due to the wonderful owners, Eugene & Shirley Johnson. They both love the game and play in the leagues. Both have worked hard for 20 years maintaining the boards and are dedicated to making their tavern one of the best in the country.

The Black Cat is located on the southeast side of Portland, with the Williamette River about one-half mile from the tavern. To get there you have to go over the Sellwood Bridge, which gives you a beautiful view of the river. At Christmas time, people drive to see "the city of house boats" all lighted up for the holidays under the Sellwood Bridge.

The street in front of The Black Cat is called Antiques Row. with lots of shops filled with antiques, gifts, handicrafts and woodworking. It's a very interesting street.
