#### Woodie Gets Rule Clarification

(Editor's Note: In the March issue, Missouri Reporter Woodie Cockrum asked Board Talk readers for clarification of a rule governing the long foul line or the foul line nearest the shooter. Here are two responses.)

The professionals who are playing in the big leagues all play the short foul line. If the puck doesn't cross the foul line, it is called between the two players if it should stay on or come off the board. The professionals call this shot "the courtesy shot."

In the Northwest, some of my favorite places to play shuffleboard are Pink Elephant, Duffy's, McGoos, 50/50 West Salem in the town of Salem, Oregon. Their shuffleboard league has 22 teams. Lots of good competition. All of these taverns and the Northwest regional tournaments play the foul line nearest the shooter.
