The Hammer

In the October issue of *The Board Talk*, we published two features we thought would insure player feedback (and that's what we thrive on) — Rita Yank's article on the challenges women face in The World of Shuffleboard and the Top 20 Players in the U.S.A.

Everyone we've talked to, by phone or in person, has made reference to the fact that both are common topics of conversation whenever two or more shuffleboarders get together, but nobody (to date) has submitted their opinions for publication. Maybe by the time the next issue goes to press, the shock waves will have settled and we'll get that expected reaction.

We indicated when we printed the first Top 20 that it was a place from which to start and that's what it was. It was compiled from known reputations of players and research on finishes in the top third of recent tourneys of substantial size.

From now on, the finishes in tournaments will carry the most weight with known reputations still a factor. With that first list, we also tried to spread the "glory" over our major shuffleboard states, but that will no longer be part of the criteria.

We also have to take into consideration that some players enter more tournaments than others because (1) there are more tournaments in their area than others; (2) full-time jobs and/or lack of finances prohibit them from long travel to enter tourneys.

Until A.P., UPI or USA Today starts publishing results of shuffleboard tournaments, we must rely on you as readers and reporters to help us develop a list that has credibility.

* * * * *

Speaking of reporters, who can report for *The Board Talk*? Anyone who has something to report! We'd rather get six different reports of a tournament than to get none at all.

You don't have to be a professional writer to be a reporter, but we do appreciate: (1) the date, place and address of the tourney site; (2) full names of winners, correctly spelled and printed instead of handwritten so we don't decipher your i's as e's and your o's as a's; everybody likes to see their names spelled correctly; (3) the winners' city and state. In some cases, we can check our mailing list for that information but, alas, not all winners are subscribers. In fact, if being a subscriber was a criteria for the Top 20, we'd have a few different names!

We also appreciate receiving your reports in writing. Taking results over the phone creates too many opportunities for error.






