

The Hammer

When we first published the Play Your Way Across the U.S.A. quarterly listing a year ago, the shuffleboard network map took up half the page. In February 1986, there were 37 shuffleboard establishments in 12 states that were Board Talk subscribers and/or advertisers.

In this issue, we have 95 shuffleboard establishments in 20 states and Canada pushing the map off the corner of the page! As always, we urge you to patronize these supporters of The World of Shuffleboard.

Our purpose in publishing the quarterly listing is twofold: (1) to provide shuffleboarders with a directory of places they can visit during their vacations and business trips, and (2) to promote those establishments which are supporting The World of Shuffleboard through their subscriptions and advertising.

This information is public knowledge and we have been aware of occasions when it was used for purposes other than our own. A few tournament directors who prefer to bypass The Board Talk as a means of communication have used it as a mailing list for their notices; an advertiser used it to send out samples of his product. Up to now, as far as we know, that information has been used — not abused.

Recently, a few of the establishments on our listing have notified us that the shuffleboard directory information, which represents three years of our time, labor and money, is perhaps being used to directly compete against us.

One of the things that has made this country so great is its free enterprise system. If somebody has a service or product for which there is a demand and need and can deliver it better than anyone else, they have the right to succeed. Competition is good — necessary, in fact — so consumers of the service or product can exercise their freedom of choice and so producers will keep improving the quality of their product or service. We believe in the free enterprise system; we believe in competition. We also believe in, and live by, integrity.

In the July 1986 issue of The Board Talk, we discussed the idea of expanding the Play Your Way Across the U.S.A. quarterly listing into a printed directory with information on shuffleboard locations that players could carry in their glove compartments when they traveled. We allowed as how it was a "do-able" project that would take some time and money to get published and distributed.

Seems like somebody else thought it was a good idea, too, and has sent out a questionnaire requesting information for a "FREE" listing in a directory. The request announces a "nationwide campaign to stimulate new interest in the world



Texas Action

Although we aren't too much on writing letters, we do sincerely appreciate your monthly newsletter on shuffleboard.

It doesn't seem that anyone else is going to report the results of two fairly good-sized Texas team tournaments, so in fairness to my excellent playing fellow team mates and excellent team opposition, I shall do so to the best of my recollection.

The 1986 Texas Team Championship (non-pro) had 12 teams made up of six men and four women per team from Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston and San Antonio. Tournament play was at P.T.'s in Houston in June. The winners were the San Antonio team made up of Leo Hines, Sam McWilliams, Hal St. Leger, Bill Morton, Terry Moore, Morrie Estess, Candy Webster, Brenda Moore, Naomi Chacon and Sherry Tomacini. I believe that one of the Houston teams came in second and Fort Worth in third.

The 1987 Texas Team Championship (non-pro) Division was held in December at the Gold Mine Lounge in Dallas, Texas. There were a total of 14 teams from Dallas, Houston, Oklahoma, Fort Worth and San Antonio, split in two divisions. Once again, the All Stars from San Antonio won the Division 1 tournament. Participants were: Brenda Moore, Rusty Center, Morrie Estess, Naomi Chacon, Mary Switzer, Candy Webster, Bill Morton, Terry Moore, Hal St. Leger and Jim Mann. The Dallas All Stars came in second. I don't remember who was third, but there certainly were some good teams and excellent players participating.

P.T.'s in Houston is set for the upcoming \$36,000 guaranteed singles. As far as the three out of five is concerned for this event, I think two of three should be the limit on the match. We have played two of three for the last seven years in these tournaments when I brought it in and got it started with the tournaments of the P.S.A. That has been the rule and still is except when Billy Mays brought three of five into the Vegas singles.

All that does is make an endurance test out of the tournament. For all of us older men in this shuffleboard world, I say two of three is enough playing for one tournament. Why not make the finals three of five like we have been doing all along?

I think all the players should voice their views on this to P.T. He is a reasonable man.




