#### THE HAMMER

(We don't have our own system at this point in time; we rent "space" on the system at Donna's place of employment.) Luckily, we had "hard" copy to feed back into the computer but any time you rebuild something that's grown as much as our mailing list has in recent months, there's room for error. On the other side of the scale, a lot of good things happened. Because of the volume of advertising and news, we had our biggest issue ever — 16 pages! That's four times our lightweight 4-page issues! This subscription growth is very important to us in terms of attracting advertisers.

In last month's issue, our ad for the subscription blitz listed June 15 as the cut-off date because we planned to make the presentation of prizes at our 4th of July tournament. However, Jerry sure did want to use his new weights at the Michigan Open and we didn't want to deny him that! Bill is signed up for the Michigan Open so we'll probably give him his T-shirt there. Both of which kind of takes any punch out of a big presentation at our tourney. Therefore, we're extending the blitz another month. We hope you get involved!

During our first tentative steps the first year of our publication, 1984, we only published 10 issues, with a June-July recess "because not much was going on in The World of Shuffleboard in the summer months." We found out, as we grew to become the "voice" of tournament shuffleboard, that this is not the case. Shufflers, we discovered, shuffle year 'round.

As we go to press with this issue, two big tournaments are underway — the Michigan Open in Dearborn and the Memorial Day tourney at the Ace of Clubs in Marysville, Calif. In June, we have the Colorado Coors Open at Bliner's in Denver and the amateur team event at the Corporate Image in Fort Worth. In July, we have The Board






