### The "Nuts and Bolts" of Our Sport

The last time I renewed my subscription to The Board Talk, I enclosed a letter containing some ideas for discussion in the newsletter. Your reply said you thought they merited discussion, too. It's been a year, and I'm still interested in seeing them discussed.

The Board Talk is mainly tournament information, an editorial and some letters, which is fine. I would like to see some articles concerning the nuts and bolts of the game — things like shuffleboard care and maintenance.

I've been to numerous places that have boards, but have no idea how to maintain them. How about a comparison of currently manufactured boards?

I feel that, to a degree, shuffleboard is on the rise and there are many new players and board owners who would like to know more things about the game. We've got our first new board in town in probably 10 years and the owner didn't know a thing about the game or caring for it.

### A Salute for the Austin Open

### 1988 Pro Tour Update

The first order of business is to thank those who have responded about having a pro tour stop in their town. As of press time, we have signed up seven first-class events (see schedule below) and have room for three more.

For those who are not aware of the details, the goal is to run a series of events by a uniform set of rules. Points will be awarded to the top finishers at each tourney. At the end of the year, the top players will receive a cash bonus for their efforts.

This will be a system that will benefit both the players and the people hosting the tourney. For the players, it will allow them to leave home and compete, using a format that represents the best ideas and rules as established by a committee of their fellow players. For the tournament hosts, there are several benefits. Top players have much more of an incentive to attend their tourney. Through the use of their monthly ad in The Board Talk, the Federation will help to promote these events. Last, but not least, The Board Talk has agreed to give a discount of 10% to any ads for sanctioned events. This includes all Federation sanctioned events, not just those on the pro tour.
