The Hammer

Every month, new subscribers join our ranks, shufflers who wonder about our "roots," who we are and how we started. Since there's no burning issues to address this month, we're going to devote this space to some history and some projections for the future of The Board Talk...

1983 — There was a lot of "pillow talk" going on in the Wilber household. George, a player and secretary of the Greater Lansing Area Shuffleboard League, was totally committed to the game. Donna was not a player, but she was an enthusiastic spectator and she was a professional writer. Both felt there was an information void in The World of Shuffleboard and believed they could fill that void. However, they had failed once in the publishing business and weren't anxious for a repeat of that experience. Should they go for it or play it safe?

1984 — Vol. 1, No. 1 of The Board Talk rolled off the presses in January. Designed to be a local or state shuffleboard publication, it contained results of tourneys in Detroit, Pontiac and Lansing, a column by the Lansing State Journal's sports writer Bob Gross, some league standings, and announcement of a qualifying tournament in Pontiac

for a really big tourney in Las Vegas.

In February, the editors accompanied the winner of that qualifying tournament, Lee McDonald of Lansing, to Las Vegas. They took along some copies of the first issue of The Board Talk and recorded the names of some of the participants who were interested in receiving the next issue. Overnight, The Board Talk "went national," a move that caused many sleepless nights for the editors. The new publication limped through the year with a meager list of subscribers and a couple faithful advertisers. The editors were glad to see 1984 become a part of history.

1985 — The World of Shuffleboard took a "wait and see" attitude about *The Board Talk*. If it was going "belly up," why invest \$10 for a subscription? Potential advertisers waited until its audience was large enough to make an investment. A "no-win" situation for the publishers. The mailing list was slowly growing, but so were the print bills and the

first-class postage charges.

In July, The Board Talk sponsored its first annual tournament. Participation was gratifying, but it was a costly venture

for the sponsors.

Numbers of subscribers finally reached the point that allowed the editors to obtain a more affordable mailing permit, but the future of the publication remained uncertain at the close of *The Board Talk's* second year.

Yesterday, my copy of The Board Talk arrived and as I was reading the results, there was something missing. You don't get the flavor of the event in the box scores. There are the characters and situations that develop...

Picture Bobby Goldsmith, white beard flowing, teamed up with the old pro, A.Z. Turnbo, reaching back for that extra effort to finish in the money — not for the monetary reward but for his personal goal of appearing in The Board Talk in the list of top finishes. Mission accomplished!

Chris Monahan, the only female entry in the singles, waiting anxiously and not at all disappointed, at having drawn the powerful Darrol Nelson in the first round. 





We would like to begin this month by thanking Glen Davidson for sharing his thoughts concerning the Michigan Open. The only way that we can continue to improve our tournaments is by inviting and listening to feedback from the players. We have not figured out how to run a perfect tournament yet, but with continued hard work and plenty of input from the players, we think we can get there.

Anyone reading this who has some ideas concerning rules and tournament formats that they would like to share should write them down and send them to the Shuffleboard Federation. We will organize them and make copies which will be sent to your player representatives. On Oct. 9-12, the Corporate Image (Fort Worth, Texas) is hosting a mixed doubles and pro-am doubles. There will be a players' meeting on Oct. 8, at which time all of the written suggestions we have received will be distributed to the players and voted upon. All decisions made there will be incorporated into tournaments sanctioned by the Shuffleboard Federation.

1988 PRO TOUR

We have been working out the details for a professional tour which will include a point standings system to determine a national champion. There will be at least eight tournaments and possibly as many as 10.

If you are a bar owner or a player and would like to have one of these tourneys in your area, you need to contact the Federation as soon as possible. The requirements are simple: a facility that will accommodate four boards, an agreement to run the tournament by the Federation's rules, and a \$500 donation to the point standings fund. The money collected will be distributed to the top finishers in the point standings contest.

We have four tournaments lined up already and will announce a complete schedule in our ad in the November Board Talk. In addition to earning cash prizes, the top eight

players will also be awarded a spot on the national team which will represent the United States in a challenge match against a Canadian team.

Before we finalize the format for 1988, we hope that players everywhere will share their ideas with us so we can do the best job possible. Among the things we want your input on are: the rules published in the August Board Talk, entry fees, seeding of the players, and distribution of the prize monies.

Another area we want to address is tournament officials and committees. A suggestion was made that a group of players be nominated at the beginning of the year to act as a standing committee to be used at all of the major tournaments. We think that is an excellent idea and intend to incorporate it into tournaments sanctioned by the Federation.

In the August issue of The Board Talk, a question was raised in The Hammer concerning compensation for the people who run the brackets, handle entry fees, prepare the boards, etc. What do you think?

Congratulations to tournament director Don Valk for another successful tournament. It was played in a beautiful banquet room with a nice view of Town Lake on one side and a pool on the other.

The State of Michigan continued to establish itself as one of the new leaders in The World of Shuffleboard with six players and another six spectators making the trip to Texas.

It is always nice to meet new people who were previously just a name in The Board Talk and this trip many of us got to meet a player from Phoenix, Arizona, who made quite an impression — Peggy Richards. She has a good combination of skill and composure and has established herself as a force to be reckoned with in the future.

subscribers was introduced in February. March marked a "turnaround" for the publication. Subscribers, advertisers, and news from all parts of the country started rolling in. For the first time, it appeared that *The Board Talk* would become a viable publication that would not have to be subsidized by the full-time jobs of its publishers.

In July, the 2nd Annual Board Talk Tournament drew participation from seven states and Canada. In October, the first listing of the U.S.A.'s Top 20 Players was published, creating more feedback than any previous feature.

1987 — The February quarterly "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A." listing had grown from 37 establishments in 12 states a year ago to 95 in 20 states and Canada. The Board Talk's mailing list broke the 600 mark and its largest issue — 16 pages — was published in May. The Top 20 players listing changed to a Top 40 with ratings by division. A Top 10 Women's players list was added.

In July, the 3rd Annual Board Talk tournament attracted players from 11 states. It was a good one!

There's still a lot of shufflers who like to read *The Board Talk* — other's copies, that is — but have chosen not to in-

vest their own \$10. And there's some advertisers who put their Board Talk invoices at the bottom of the pile. The midnight and weekend oil keeps burning to put the publication together in our spare time without any salary. It's still a "kitchen table" enterprise but the future, we strongly believe, is bright!

1994 — The Board Talk has grown from a 4-page newsletter 10 years ago to a 48-page slick magazine with 4 color ads from every major company in the USA that manufactures products shuffleboarders consume. There's feature stories on the events and people who make up The World of Shuffleboard. Leagues in every city have a special insert with standings, announcements and other local "color" for their particular area.

The Board Talk's main office is occupied by a staff who actually answer the telephone in daytime hours. A travelling "office" takes the editors to major tourneys across the country so they can cover the events, in words and color photos, for their 10,000 subscribers.

Our grandson, who has been working for us part-time since 1990, is entering college, majoring in business so he can take over the reins when the time comes.

There are 500 shuffleboard establishments from 50 states on the "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A." listing. Each of them sponsors a qualifying tournament to send a representative to *The Board Talk*'s national tournament, which is covered by all the major TV networks. Site of the tournament is a huge Shuffleboard Dome with an adjoining hotel

complex and lots of attractions for participants' families. Closed circuit TV brings the action to hotel rooms so players taking a needed break know when they "on deck."

The Shuffleboard Dome is also the site of Shuffleboard's Hall of Fame. Pioneer Sol Lipkin was the first to be inducted and his photo was on the cover of the January issue of "Sports Illustrated." In conjunction with the national tournament in July, three more inductees — Billy Mays of Texas, Al Stewart of California, and Ed Estep (posthumously) of Michigan — will be in the spotlight.




