The Hammer

Our quarterly "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A." listing is in this issue. We bid sad farewell to those 20 shuffleboard establishments that did not renew, and extend a warm welcome to the 34 new places on our map.

To the establishment owners on the map, we ask that you check your listing to see if it's correct and complete, and let us know of any changes or additions before the August issue deadline. And, to our readers, we urge you to use the listing when you're travelling. Stop in and say hello, have a game or two, and tell the folks there that you read about their place in The Board Talk.

We've been stalling on making this announcement for a long time, but can't put it off any longer. We started out with a meager 4-page newsletter to a handful of subscribers back in January of 1984. Since then, we've not raised our subscription fee at all and we've lowered our advertising rates. By operating that way, we've grown in both areas — subscribers and advertisers.

We had the boom lowered on us this month with a notice from the Post Office that, effectively immediately, we'll have a substantial increase in our mailing fees. We've been able to increase our number of pages because of our increase in advertising but this latest development leaves us no choice but to raise our subscription fees to \$15 a year, effective Jan. 1, 1989.

Any subscriptions, whether they're due or not, received between now and Jan. 1, 1989, will be accepted at the old rate of \$10 a year. That means that even though you just renewed, if you want an extention for another year, we'll accept your renewal at the old rate if you submit it before Jan. 1, 1989.

We call them the "in-betweeners." They're the new subscribers that come in after we've sent our regular monthly mailing at bulk rate. Rather than waiting until the next month's mailing, we send them a copy of the recent month's issue at 1st class rates so they don't miss all the current action. With this last month's big issue, it cost us 54 per copy to send those "catch-up" issues. It doesn't take long for that expense to add up.

We'll continue to mail those "in-betweeners" a 1st class copy for a week after we go to press. After that, they'll have to wait for the next issue. Your best bet, if you want a new subscriber you signed up to get the current issue, is to get their names in by the end of the month.

We extend a special tip of the editorial cap to:

The Shuffleboard Federation, Inc., for taking "one giant step" for our sport by gaining a major corporate sponsor for an event. The J & B Shuffle, a Texas Amateur Tournament, started April 9 and will conclude the week of May

Travel Tips from Doc

Shuffleboard players are not ordinary travelers. They must have a car because, armed with a copy of the "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A." listing, they will be travelling a lot of back roads in search of boards.

I have travelled extensively myself and have developed a fewbasic guidelines which I call, "The Code of Shuffleboard Players." When you arrive at a new shuffleboard bar, be sure to do the following:

1. Make sure the local players learn the correct rules of play.

2. Tell them about the Magic Glaze silicone spray or Silicone spray from Ace Hardware (Pledge, etc.). You will be surprised how many boards are in terrible shape and they don't know how easy it is to keep them in good shape.

3. Be generous; teach the locals a couple of good plays. If their game, their boards and their rules improve, we all benefit.

4. Be sure to always carry extra copies of The Board Talk. Sign up as many subscribers as you can and eventually there will be a larger network of good, quality games available throughout the United States.

And, above all, remember what an old patient of mine once told me: "Doc, the more and more I have been reading about the bad effects of smoking, drinking, overeating and sex, I have finally made up my mind to give up reading."

Glen Says: "We'd Like to Know"

There are some people, including myself, still in the dark on the Shuffleboard Federation's point system. It seems that no points are being given to the doubles teams. If you will remember, doubles and team events were the frontrunners and backbone of shuffleboard. If everything is going to be run for every player involved, I definitely think that doubles should be the first included in any extra money to be added at the end of the year. Each winner of any event should be treated equal, or winners of the doubles competition get half as much as singles. I also think the money to be given away should be posted at each bar that is involved — how much, to whom, when and where it will all happen. Talk is cheap, but it takes money to buy good whiskey. Let us all know what first place on down to eighth will get in cash. I know the Federation will get the news to us right away.

The ladies were commenting on their rating. I believe they, as well as all the rest, should have the rating in their area just like before. They all can't go to all the tourneys, so what's wrong with keeping the rating system as before? Janet Cook of Amarillo, Brenda Moore of San Antonio, and Diana Hagen of Houston are just a few who would like to know.

Another "we want to know" item is why is it at big tournaments, with rules posted, and with a tournament director, those rules are violated time and time again and not one director will take the first step and tell the violator or go ahead and do their job and give the other player the point or whatever the violation calls for.

We want to know why should we have rules at all if they are not going to be enforced? The rule of standing behind your opponent while or until he shoots is a big joke. Talking while your opponent is shooting or walking down the board and stopping halfway down and bending over talking to a spectator — just as the shooter starts to shoot — all this I have seen and had pulled on me in the singles and doubles, along with unsportsmanship conduct.

We want to know when this is going to stop. Until it does, you can forget about professionals, TV sponsors or anything else. We say enforce the rules or abandon them.

As to your first "we want to know," Glen, we think the Shuffleboard Federation answered that question about the point system in the April issue. They indicated that the Policy Board, headed by Bill Melton, will vote on how to split the \$6,000 in the fund. Watch upcoming issues for that information.

As for the women's ratings, let's not get confused. The Board Talk, until recently, ranked the women separately. This has nothing whatsoever to do with the Shuffleboard Federation point system. You will note that currently, Chris Danke, a formidable competitor, is ranked in the SF point standings. You must recognize that there is a split in the ranks of women players today; some think they should have their own events and standings and others want to be fully



With 12 teams at \$50 per person, this meant that the three top finishers qualified for the doubles on April 22. Top honors went to Jim Long and Jerry Knox of Mishawaka; second to Mickey Baugh and Tony Avery, Fairmount; and third to Blaine Yeagy and Greg Massie, Summitville.

The doubles partner qualifiers may switch partners for the big tourney, if desired.







Suggested Uniform SHUFFLEBOARD TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. All games 15 points.
- 2. Rewax board after each game.
- 3. Dry rails may be sprinkled during game by player shooting. (Note: excessive sprinkling should be brought to attention of an official.)
- 4. Each team shall be ready to play within 5 minutes after waxing of boards. Penalty: 1 point per minute after the 5-minute limit.
- 5. Altering level of the table or adding a foreign substance to a weight shall cause a forfeit of game.
- 6. All entry fees must be paid before sale starts.
- 7. All money must be paid after each sale.
- 8. Tournament Director shall determine if practice weights are to be allowed before each game and if players are allowed practice weights if opponent has previously played the board.
- 9. You may play at same end of the board throughout the tournament.
- 10. Flip for hammer each game. Winner gets choice of hammer or choice of weights. Exception: If 2 of 3 match, loser of first game automatically gets hammer starting the second game.
- 11. If a hanger falls after the release of a weight and before being hit, it shall be replaced and shot stands as is. Ask about exceptions.
- 12. To avoid mush shots, players may have wax wiped off a thrown weight.
- 13. If a weight completely clears the foul line nearest the player shooting (6 feet), it is a legal weight and counts as a point.
- 14. All decisions will be made by the officials and will be final.
- 15. The only way a player can retain the hammer at the opposite end is if the opponent(s) scores.
- 16. A player delivering first weight when having the hammer loses that privilege and must complete frame as is.
- 17. To determine a hanger, use a flat, straight object pressed firmly to end of board and drag slowly across it. If the weight moves, it is a hanger (4 points).
- 18. A weight resting near a line must be determined by looking directly over the weight never from the side and at least 18 inches above the weight. It must clear the line completely to be scored the higher point total. A committee of at least three is suggested to make these decisions. You may wish to use more depending on the significance of the shot. Never divulge your decision verbally; write it down and compare your decisions. Try to use qualified personnel who are not involved dollarwise or have strong ties with the player(s).
- 19. A player may go to opposite end of board to look at weight and may meet with partner to discuss strategy. (Note: excessively slow play may lead to forfeit of points.)
- 20. Any person who plays under an assumed name may be subject to indefinite suspension.
- 21. Any rules that may arise and are not listed here will be dealt with by the officials.
- 22. Courtesy and good sportsmanship are the name of the game. Have fun and good luck to all.







Regarding your concern about the rules, that is one tough problem and will remain so until The World of Shuffleboard recognizes just how far they can stretch a volunteer's efforts and patience with no compensation. Most of the tournament directors (as far as we know) are investing their time and efforts simply because they love the game and somebody's got to do the job. If they were getting some kind of compensation, even just expenses, they might be willing to tackle those confrontations. At this point, who needs them? Just get it over with and let me get home to my family and my job, for which I get paid — is the general feeling. We hope that changes.
