Tourney Talk

Benedict's Genesee Open Pays Over \$10,000

One hundred and thirteen entries travelled to Sherburne, New York, for a classic weekend of shuffleboard at Benedict's Genesee Open on Sept. 23-25.

"Milt and Betty Benedict have been working hard to expand their place by adding a new 40 by 60 foot addition to accommodate an area for two boards and viewing area for spectators which met with the high approval of all those attending," reports Dick Gorman. "The three 22-foot boards provided plenty of action with players vying for five trophies provided by Genesee Beer. Thursday, travelers started arriving for large pot round robins with the local shooters while tuning up for the official three-day action tournament. All events were 15 point double elimination and all were completed on the same day they started."

Friday night's draw partner event was limited to 32 players. There were quite a few on the waiting list who didn't get to play, proving early registration is highly recommended. The total prize money for the event was over \$2700. First place went to Jim McDaniel, Darlington, Md., and Dick Gorman, Wilmington, Del. Second place was taken by Steve Bennett and Bill Jones, local Sherburne, N.Y. players. Third place went to Buddy Bramer, Rising Sun, Md., and Scratch Todd, Denton, Md. Fourth place went to Jimmy (the cop) Kumpula, Michigan/Florida, and Dick Losee, Poolville, N.Y.

Saturday's bring your own partner had 28 teams with over \$3900 in the pot. First place went to owner-host Milt Benedict and Dick Losee. Second place was won by Jimmy Kumpula and Russ Reynolds, Sherburne, N.Y. Third place went to Don Casula, Wilmington, Del., and John Lukas, Millington, Del. Fourth place went to first-time tournament players Randy Benedict (son of Bettle and Milt, who said it doesn't help to grow up around a shuffleboard), and Steve Barker, Earlville, N.Y.

Sunday's singles event started off with two of the 29 entries dropping out because of bad backs (Dick thinks it might have been the load they were carrying in the two previous events). There was \$3600 in prizes for this event. First place went to travelling Mickey Baugh of Houston, Texas, followed by Chuck King, Dover, Del. Third place honors went to Bill Jones, Sherburne, NY, and fourth to Colgate University's Dick Losee.

"It was a great weekend with players representing nine states -- Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania and Texas --

Calcutta or "Cal-Cut-Em-Up"?

Thank you for The Board Talk. It's the best thing that ever happened in The World of Shuffleboard. Due to Board Talk, people are in touch throughout the U.S. and Canada.

I'm glad we are because I have something to say to all

shuffleboard players, association presidents, tournament directors, bar owners and calcutta buyers.

Calcutta and greed have always corrupted shuffleboard. Its real name is "cal-cut-em-up." Now, it has spawned a child called "seeding." Seeding is taking the top four or eight calcuttas and placing them in the 32 player field -- No. 1 at 1, no. 3 at 16, no. 2 at 17, and no. 4 at 32. They won't play each other until the fourth round, fifth rounds in the final round, in the front bracket. If you seed the top eight calcuttas, and place

them no. 1 at 1, 3 at 6, 5 at 11, 7 at 16, 2 at 17, 4 at 22, 6 at 27 and 8 at 32, they wouldn't play each other until the third round.

I have a problem with that. The odds are greater that you will draw one of the top players because they can't draw each other. In a blind draw, the odds of you drawing the top players is 31 to 1; seed 2, 30 to 1; seed 4, 28 to 1, seed 6, 26 to 1; seed eight, 24 to 1. What's fair about that?

If you keep shafting the lesser players and lowering their odds, and giving the favored odds to the top players, lesser players may not show up and put in 75% of the entry fee money.

Top guns and big promoters, think about this for awhile. Most of the top players are in their 40s and 50s. Where are the 20s and 30s? Keep shafting them and there won't be any. That would not pose too much of a problem; we can cut the planks up and use them for coffins and head markers. I can see it now. Here lies "Old Shaftem." He died at 82. He was the youngest player in the very last tournament of the magnificent "seeded eight."

Let tennis have the seeding. Let baseball have its spitball. Get shuffleboard by the bootstraps and pull it up out of the corruption of cal-cut-em-up.

I believe constructive criticism should be followed by what the cirtic thinks is a better idea. So here's mine: Blind draw the 32 player field, then sell the calcutta. Another idea would be no brackets. Each team or player play one game each against different teams or players on different boards, and not play the same team or player twice until the desired amount of games are played +1 for win, -1 for loss.

Two out of three double elimination, boards that have 10 to 15 inches drift, 2 to 3 feet differences in speed from each end, or high centers, all favor the top players. The seeded eight only put in 25% of the entry fee money. What else does the top gun want? The losers to send in their 75% of the money, not show and let the seeded eight play for it?

One more suggestion: we need some rules on standardization of the boards -- how far they can drift, high centers, speed from each end, etc.

I stand poised for feedback.
