Hurricane Hugo Doesn't Stop Benedict's Classic

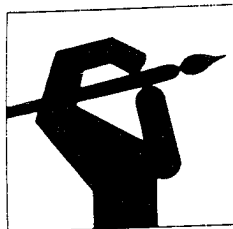

I had a little insurance but am having trouble collecting it. Von couldn't get any insurance because of her high blood pressure and sugar diabetes. With my hospital stay and Von's two, it wiped us out. At 68 years old, having to start over again is rough, but you have made it a lot easier, not only with your contributions, but with your caring and support.

After reading the names in The Board Talk who gave, we just had trouble believing that this many people cared -- and so many people we didn't even know!

We do want to add a couple more names: My son, Carl from Oregon, \$100; my sister and her husband Frances and David, \$100; my brother and his wife Ella -- when it took so long to cash in my ERA account, he had his bank wire \$6,000 from Arlington, Texas, to my bank so I could get a deposit to the hospital for Von; last but certainly not least, our grandson Steve who drove the truck on his days off and kept our lawn mowed, then left his job and came to work for me at a lot less money because I couldn't do it by myself anymore (he's learning and will take over soon).

And, of course, there are just not any words to express how we feel about the people who got it started and spent many long hours doing the leg work and getting it all together (the Al Stewart Benefit). What a super job! There were so many donations for the raffle drawings, it was unreal; seemed like it would never end. The steak dinner was great; the limo ride to Bellflower was the greatest. We could go on and on and fill this whole month's Board Talk, but better not.

When the doctors said Von would not make it without surgery and that it had to be now (they wouldn't even take the chance of moving her to another hospital), there were no questions or worrying about the money. The worrying came later. The total hospital bills for the two of us was \$89,000.

Thanks to all of you, we hope to live long enough to pay the rest off. Von is now working a few days a week and feeling great.

Who's Who in The World of Shuffleboard:

Diana Hagen: She's Come a Long, Long Way!

Diana Hagen of Houston, Texas, is the top-ranked woman shuffleboard player in the nation. She's also one of the youngest looking grandmothers in The World of Shuffleboard, and you have only to look into her eyes when she's playing a tough game to know that she's one of the most determined players on the pro circuit. And -- even though the stats don't indicate it -- she's a relative newcomer to the sport.

"When Howard Mouton first brought her into the Sports Arena, she didn't even know how to hold a weight. Six months later, they were winning tournaments together," said Tony Howard, also of Houston. "I've been playing for 12 to 13 years and I'm not as good as she is. I've always been amazed at how quickly she learned the game and became a big winner."

That was four short years ago and chances are, few at the Sports Arena then would have predicted that Diana would be the first woman to win an open event in a major national tournament. Yet, that's exactly what she did at the Great Arizona Open last March when she and partner Sam Summers of Oklahoma took first in a tough doubles event. That moment, Diana says, was the highlight of her shuffleboard career, not the many firsts she's had in women's tournaments. Since The Shuffleboard Federation started its national point standings for women eight months ago, Diana has been at the top of the list seven times and second once.

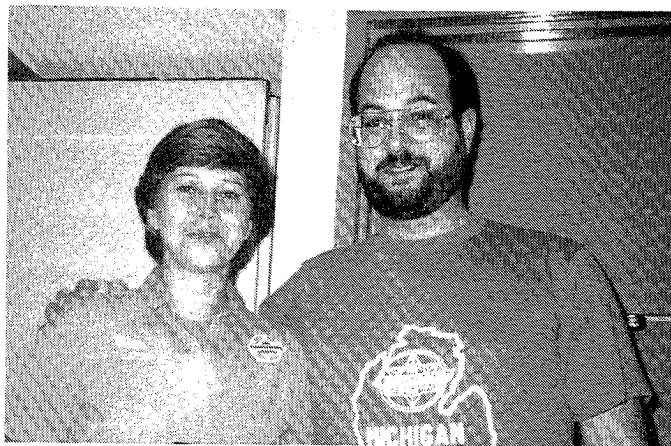
She was first introduced to the game by watching Howard and his friends play "crazy eights" at Duane's in Houston. It

was Howard who taught her the basics of the game and his faith in her abilities have taken her a long, long way.

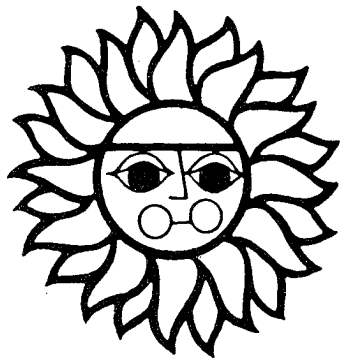
Diana has high hopes for the future of shuffleboard. "I hope it will grow because I love the game so much," she said. "I think there are a lot of problems that need to be worked out. We need everyone!"

What does she enjoy most about the game? "I like winning and competing, and I enjoy seeing all the nice people in shuffleboard," she said.

Diana Hagen collects one of her many first place trophies from John McDermott of the Shuffleboard Federation.

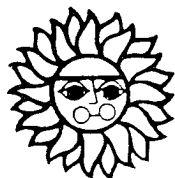

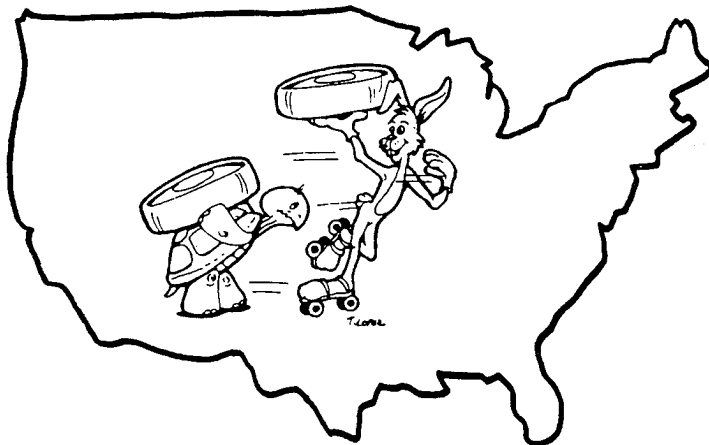

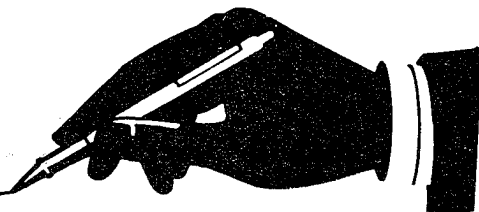
