Let us know. We'd also like to hear from some of you who have welcomed visitors from other parts of The World of Shuffleboard because of your listing in "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A."

Because The Board Talk will remain a sideline venture for a few more years yet before we can devote full time to it, we depend a great deal on our volunteer contributing writers. We'd be a mighty skinny publication without them and truly appreciate their efforts. We think one of the most valuable features that's been added to our pages in recent months is the "Ask the Pros" column by Phil McGrew. He spends a great deal of time and effort developing questions and securing responses from the pros. He does so, not for the big salary we pay him (which is nothing!), but because he hopes the information will be helpful to all players, particularly the amateurs.



NYISL Opens at Amy's Checkered Flag

The New York State Interstate Shuffleboard League opened up the 1991 season in grand style at Amy's Checkered Flag in Waterloo, N.Y. on Feb. 23-24. Over \$3,000 in cash and prizes was shot for by 48 players from around New York over the 2-day, 2-event weekend.

On Saturday, it was the luck of the draw that paired up the top two ISL men from 1990, Steve Bennett from the Classic in Sherburne and Doug Fridley Jr. from the Dew Drop Inn in Waterloo. The pair took home half of the \$1,050 pot. Second spot went to Arlo Johnson and John Canino from Baldwinsville Moose Club. Cashing in third place was first time ISL player Clark "Kent," shooting with Jane Johnson, both from Baldwinsville.




Amy, owner of the Checkered Flag, presents trophies to Steve Bennett (left) and Doug Fredley Jr., winners of the draw partner event.

Sunday's bring partner event bought out some of the toughest shooters in the state with total prize monies and trophies going over \$2,000. The tourney favorites, Dick Losee of Poolville and Russ Reynolds from Sherburne rebounded from a first game loss to come through the loser's bracket and take home half of the prize money. Second spot was earned by Al Smith from Baldwinsville and Marv Smith from Amy's Checkered Flag (currently residing in New Jersey) by going all the way through the winner's bracket. The "Smith Brothers" (not really) did some fine shooting but fell just short. In third place was Jack Enders from B'Ville teaming up with Clark "Kent" (two cashes in his first tourney!), also from B'Ville.

Amy Westfall, owner of Amy's Checkered Flag, provided all players with a luncheon on both days of the tournament.

Shufflers' Notebook

News and Views from The World of Shuffleboard

More from the St. Louis Scene

It was nice reading Dan Kelly's letter about shuffleboard in the St. Louis area (February 1991 Notebook). Dan plays for Magee's and I play for Georges' Place and our teams have competed many times on Monday nights.

I noticed Dan called the league the City League. This isn't the only league in the city of St. Louis. There is also a league on Thursdays. I play in both. The Monday night league is called Southside Shuffleboard Association and Thursday night is called South St. Louis Co-Ed Shuffleboard Association.

As you can tell by the names, both leagues are in the southern part of St. Louis City. I don't know of any boards in north St. Louis, but there are some in North St. Louis County. I've heard there is a league there, too. Some bars in South County have joined the South St. Louis leagues and I also have heard of a league in Jefferson County.

Three bars in our area have two teams playing on Monday and Thursday nights. They are Giesler's, Devonshire Inn, and Georges' Place. The owner of Georges' Place, Dianne Georges, just learned to play this last year when she bought the place and has fast turned into a great player and patron of the sport. Dianne just started running the Thursday night league and is doing a great job. Her team on Monday night came in first and we're in a good position for first on Thursday. She also runs an in-house league on Tuesday nights. Dianne is also a subscriber to The Board Talk. She is into shuffleboard 110 percent! At the end of the season, she takes out an ad in a local newspaper with all the players' names listed. If you are ever in the St. Louis area, come to 5000 Alaska Avenue at the corner of Delor Street and play some shuffleboard with us. The phone number is 314-481-5003.

I'd also like to tell you about another player who happens to play in both leagues. Jim Majewski is secretary of both leagues and along with his computer keeps everyone informed as to team standings. Jim takes the standings to a local paper and they are published weekly. Jim plays for Devonshire Inn, which is owned by another great lady of shuffleboard, Sofia. Devonshire has two teams on Monday and Thursday nights.

I'd also like to tell you about Dave Giesler. Dave runs the Monday night league and his bar, Giesler's, also has two teams on Mondays and Thursdays.

On the Monday night league, every bar has to have two teams, an A team and a B team. The league is divided into two categories -- National and American. There are six boards in each category, a total of 12 teams per category, 24 teams total in the league. With six persons per team, this is 144 players.

On the Thursday night league, the bars only have to put up one team, but can put up two. There are a total of six teams per division. There are two divisions -- the better players and those who only play that one night per week and aren't that experienced. This is also the case on Monday night. That is the reason for National and American leagues. Amyway, this is 72 players on Thursday night. There is one big difference between Monday and Thursday and that is on Thursday, every

We couldn't have pulled it off without you.



Recently, the issue of limiting or not limiting the number of players, and the pros and cons from both points of view have appeared in *The Board Talk*.

We would like to present our thoughts on that subject as well as to explain the invitational nature of our pro events. We would also like to add that if there is anyone who did not receive an invitation and would like to enter any of the pro tournaments, please contact us.

Most of you know of someone who has been "barred" from someplace because the bar owner has made the judgement that the person is a troublemaker or is bad for business. By promoting our tournaments as invitationals, we are protecting ourselves legally and giving ourselves the same control over our tournaments as a bar owner has over their place of business.

Since our first tournament four years ago, the 1987 Michigan Open, we have sanctioned/promoted more than 30 tournaments, most of them in hotels. They have very often been an expensive proposition for us.

When you sign a contract with a hotel, the rental fee for the ballroom or meeting room where the actual tournament takes place is based on the number of rooms purchased by the people who come to the tournament.

While a real good tournament means that we do not have to pay any rental charges, a poor turnout means we are looking at rental charges as high as \$5,000.00, a medium turnout puts us somewhere inbetween. This is why all tournament participants except the local players must stay at the hotel where the tournament is being held.

We would love to have no limits on the number of players. We agree that 64 players is twice as good as 32. As promoters of the game, we would like to have tournaments that require 20 boards instead of 10. Unfortunately, arrangements for these tournaments must be made a year or more in advance. Also, as the amount of tournament space you get from the hotel goes up, the financial risks increase as well because the other factor in determining rental charges is the total amount of space.

This is a subject which has been explained continually to the pro players. You would think then that they would do their part to help us plan by getting their entry fees in on time, making their hotel reservations, etc. After all, they hav everything to gain and nothing to lose if we are successful. Sadly, this has not been the case.

Instead, we find constantly that people are staying at the hotel down the street, wait until the last minute to get in, and even resent our requirement that they have to subscribe to *The Board Talk*. We spend a good portion of our time at any given tournament trying to explain things and answer questions that we are spending thousands of dollars a year to put in *The Board Talk*.

As a result, the pros have gone from being our top priority to last on the list. We are instead concentrating on the amateurs and semi props. The pros are being given whatever time is left over after we schedule the pros and semi pro events.

The amateurs and semi pros are easier to work with, buy more rooms, appreciate what we are doing for the game, and don't seem to find it very difficult to do their part to support us.

At the time we are writing this, only 3 of the 16 Pro Singles spots at the Michigan Open have been taken. On the other hand, the semi pro singles, semi pro doubles, semi pro draw are sold out and paid in full more than six weeks before the tournament. Also, all of the amateur spots in the pro am draw are taken and the N.A.S.L.TM team event is nearly full and should be sold out a month in advance. It's not hard to figure out who should be the top priority and where we should invest our time and money.

We can hear the complaining all the way back in Michigan from the pros about their invitations. They have been told that we need and expect their help this year. All of them are being asked to lend a hand on set up and/or take down at one or two of the tournaments they come to. They must also be available for the free instructional clinics we are going to do for the amateurs at each of the Grand Slam events as well as to occasionally officiate a team match.

Their actions will determine where they fit in as far as our plans for 1992. There could be room for two or three times as many pros – or no pro events at all. They are in a situation they should like, it's their hammer.

In the meantime, we are dedicating our efforts to the pros of tomorrow, the amateurs and semi pros.

N.A.S.L. HANDICAP SYSTEM MODIFIED (CHANGES EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1991)

With the accumulation of more and more statistical information from league and tournament play, it is becoming easier to do a better, more accurate job of rating the players (at this time, we have tournament information on more than 1500 players).

For this reason, we are changing our system from assigning the amateur players a rating of 1, 2, 3, or 4, they will now be rated 1 through 5. The explanation is as follows:

2	Next 20% of amateur players
3	Middle 20% of amateur players
4	Next 20% of amateur players
5	Bottom 20% of amateur players

This sytem will be used to determine if a team roster will qualify for all N.A.S.L.TM tournament play including the team event at the 1991 North American Shuffleboard ChampionshipsTM which features \$7,000 to \$14,000 in added money.

If you are not familiar with the N.A.S.L.TM format and how it works, here is a brief explanation. If

you have questions, please feel free to contact us for additional information.

The goal of the N.A.S.L.TM is to provide team competition in such a way that every team has a chance to win. We do this by using a handicap system.

The handicap system works like this: Each player is rated, the ratings go 1 through 5, with 1 being the best. The team handicap is determined by adding the handicaps of the individual players.

For example, if there are eight players on the team with two of them being rated a "1", two of them rated a "2", two of them rated a "3", and two of them rated a "4", then the team handicpa would be 20 (1 + 1 + 2 + 2 + 3 + 3 + 4 + 4 = 20).

We then establish a range that all teams must fall within. For the **North American Shuffleboard Championships**TM, the team handicap must be between 18 and 21, with no team allowed to have more than two "1's".




David Williams and Bob Shaw of Texas were winners of the open singles. This was Bob's major tournament victory.


