





## 8th Annual Shufflers' Reunion: Another Joyous Event

Step into our Time Machine and take a nostalgic trip with us. The year is 1985. The Board Talk is one year and seven months old. Publishers George and Donna Wilber have decided to hold their 1st Annual Shufflers' Reunion Tournament. The place was set -- the Log Cabin Bar in Howell, Michigan....but all was not well....

"Two weeks before the big event, postponement -even cancellation -- was under consideration. The Board
Talk Editors -- Donna in the hospital with emergency
surgery and George depressed by a "to do" list that kept
growing instead of shrinking -- took a look at the event we
had promoted for several months and at the strikes that
were against us." (August 1985 Hammer column)

Those strikes included the fact that no national distributors nor suppliers had responded to our invitation for sponsorship of this first. The Ryan brothers from New York and their party from the East were the only preregistered participants. We decided to go ahead and were gratified by the help and participation we had to make this first a success.

Over the July 1992 4th of July weekend, the 8th Annual Board Talk Shufflers' Reunion Tournament was held at the Holiday Inn, King of Prussia, Pennsylvania. There were many new faces, which we enthusiastically welcomed, and a few "old" faces who have supported this annual reunion throughout the past years. We pay special tribute to those special people who were there for our first and for our eighth. The winners in our 8th that are bold-faced mean they participated in our 1st. A salute to them for their continual support!

Taking the largest share of the nearly \$2700 pot was **John McDermott** of Michigan, who not only had to spend his energies setting up the 10 Dynamo boards for play in this tournament at the Holiday Inn in King of Prussia, Pennsylvania, but as the only ranked pro player, had to spot points to everyone in the field of contenders. Making it a character-building experience for John was Chuckie King of Delaware, second place finisher, and Doug Fridley Jr. of New York, another formidable challenger.







# U.S. Open Early Sell-Out; Reno Tourney Filling Up Fast!

For the second year in a row, the U.S. Open will be sold out across the board. The first events to fill up were in the Division II/III, with the doubles filling up seven weeks before the tournament, followed by the singles and draw partners.

One of the reasons for the fast sellout are the qualifiers run by the Texas Mist. We have been promoting the idea of qualifying tournaments for some time now. With the increasing attendance at the Grand Slam Tournaments, qualifiers are a guaranteed money-maker for the tavern that runs them. We are willing to hold spots in any given event for taverns that want to run qualifiers.

Some of the people shut out of the U.S. Open didn't think it was fair that one location was able to secure so many spots for the Division II/III events. The fact of the matter is there could have been qualifiers in their towns, too, if someone had taken the initiative to contact us about having one. It would be fantastic to book a facility large enough to hold 30 boards—and know that we could fill it to capacity. Unfortunately, in our business, regardless of the size of the facility, you had better fill it up, or the event becomes a financial disaster for the promoter.

As promoters, it would be a dream come true to have qualifiers in all the many shuffleboard hot spots in Texas and Oklahoma: San Antonio, Houston, Fort Worth, Dallas, Amarillo, Tulsa and Oklahoma City. They could all have had qualifiers, which would boost the attendance, as well as insuring that all of these major shuffleboard towns were well represented. We urge the players in those towns to organize themselves early to promote qualifiers for the 1993 U.S. Open. If we were to have that type of help/cooperation, we would love to expand the tournament to accommodate the turnout.

It is going to take that type of effort from the players if this game is ever to take its place with the other two big tavern sports -- pool and darts -- both of which enjoy lucrative sponsorship from the manufacturers of their games, as well as from the major brewers and other related industries. Here are a few examples of what is going on in those two sports:

POOL: The American Pool Players Association, formed 13 years ago, now has more than 100,000 players. Better known as the Bud Light Pool League (formerly the Busch Pool League), they will be holding their annual team championships at the Mirage Hotel in Las Vegas at the end of August. The total pot this year is \$250,000. Dynamo Corporation, a long-time sponsor of that league program, will be supplying 100 pool tables for the big event.

DARTS: More than 2500 players attend the annual National Dart Association Team Tournament at the Sahara

Hotel in Las Vegas. More than 6,000 darters attend the Bullshooter VII World Challenge of Champions in Chicago.

This is just a small list of the major events for these two sports. What do they have to offer that shuffleboard does not? The answer is: not a thing! What they have in common is what we should be paying attention to: All of these great programs have major sponsors and were started as a result of the success of a national mixed league program that included a handicap system. Shuffleboard also has a national mixed league program, complete with a handicap system, the National Amateur Shuffleboard League. We believe the N.A.S.L. is the vehicle that can and will put shuffleboard over the top.

One of the things we hear from shuffleboard players is that if a big sponsor jumps up waving their checkbook, the players will follow. We are sure this is true, but unfortunately, it does not work that way. Potential sponsors expect you to show them big numbers before they invest any real serious money. The good news is that if the shuffleboard community really bands together and supports the N.A.S.L. League Program, we can put a pretty impressive proposal together and will have the credibility to go after major sponsorship support.

The players who are currently involved in N.A.S.L. Leagues and those who have played in the N.A.S.L. Team Events at our Grand Slam Tournaments, know that we have a solid foundation with which to start. These league and tournament competitions will continue to get better because of the input of the participants.

In 1992, well over a million dollars of outside sponsorship money will go into handicapped pool and dart game team tournaments. It is very frustrating for us to know that this type of money is available for these types of programs and shuffleboard isn't getting any of it. We need people who are willing to help us to start a local N.A.S.L. Chapter in their area.

The major obstacle has been the paranoia that we want to take over the local league. This could not be further from the truth! We do not have the time, capability, energy, or desire, to run your league from halfway across the country. Rather, it has always been our goal to help the shuffleboard community organize so we, as a sport, can have a realistic chance of attracting sponsors. That is what a Federation is. The progress our sport has made in the last few years is great, but until the shuffleboard community displays that type of unity, we cannot hope to realize our true potential as a sport.

This fall at the 1992 NORTH AMERICAN SHUFFLE-BOARD CHAMPIONSHIPS, our host, the Sands Regency, will make the largest sponsorship contribution ever to a shuffleboard tournament -- \$16,500, if we can fill the N.A.S.L. Team Event with 32 teams. Let us answer this challenge and take advantage of the opportunity they are giving our sport.

# The History of Shuffleboard

We could very well say that over 200 years ago, while our Founding Fathers were busy putting together the makings of this great country, there were big shuffle-board matches being conducted throughout the colonies. Shuffleboard was popular among the English soldiers as well as the colonists.

In his play, "The Crucible," concerning the historic witch trials of Salem, Mass., Arthur Miller wrote:

"In 1692, there was a good supply of ne'er-do-wells who dallied at the shuffleboard in Bridget Bishop's Tavern."

This item serves the game of shuffleboard a good purpose. It dates the written entrance of the game into the New World.

The fame of the game spread, and soon it came upon the public scene in more ways than one. In 1848, in New Hanover, Pennsylvania, a case of "The State vs. John Bishop" to decide the question, "Is shuffleboard a game of chance or a game of skill?" came up for trial. The judge ruled thus:

"Though the defendent kept a public gaming table, as charged and though diverse persons played thereat and bet spiritous liquors on the game, the game was not a game of chance, but was altogether a game of skill."

By 1897, table shuffleboard rated as much newspaper space as prizefighting and baseball in the metropoli-


tan papers in the New York City area. Highly publicized tournmanets played by such colorful characters as "Big Ed" Morris, Dave Wiley, Alex Scott, Ed Gardland, and George Lavender drew hordes of fans. The fans faithfully followed the players to tournaments in New York City, Newark, Paterson, Hoboken, Jersey City, Bloomfield, N.J. and even into Philadelphia. The fans included important figures of the business, theatrical, and political worlds.

Shuffleboard made its way across the country. In 1904, Gentleman Jim Corbett, an avid player, had a tavern owner named Croll install a table in his Alamedia, California, pub. "Doc" Croll, his son, claimed it was the first shuffleboard in that part of the country.


World War II opened the "Swinging Forties" and shuffleboard really came into its own. Many Hollywood celebrities supported the game and even owned shuffl board tables themselves. Shuffleboard grew to its greatest heights in the 1950s. Most major shuffleboard manufacturers sponsored nationwide shuffleboard tournaments. These were the biggest shuffleboard tournaments ever held. One had 576 teams participating.

Today, with the trend of everything reverting to the 1950s, we find there is a renewed interest in the game. Young shooters establishing themselves in the game will be the lifeline of shuffleboard. It is imperative to the game of shuffleboard that the established shooters help develop the talents of the novice shooters as it is being done by many shuffleboard leagues across the country.

The intrinsic appeal of the game of shuffleboard skill, diversity, competitiveness, availability to young and old, strong and feeble and disabled, the serious game, the fun game, offers the kind of release to relieve the pressures of today.




