



Thoughts of Reno Tourney From Hospitalized Participant

Here I am the day after Thanksgiving, still in St. Joseph's Hospital, Orange, California. This is the first Thanksgiving in over 28 years that Dot and I didn't have dinner at my Mother's. Mother, age 96, passed away last July. Rather than feeling sad, I've been thinking more happy thoughts.

I recently was able to participate in The Federation's national tournament in Reno, Nevada. I am grateful to Cassie Ritz and Charley Rose, owners of the Till "2" Club in Bellflower, California. Cassie bought new shirts and also contributed \$100 toward our calcutta in sponsoring my team. I also want to thank Jolene Lembke, who was so instrumental in promoting and obtaining the quality players we had participating on our Reno team. I have made the following list of items that I considered improvements over previous tournaments we have participated in.

- 1. Six player team on three boards was much better than 8 player format in that all players got to shoot at the same time, making each player feel more a part of their team, and match.
- Choosing partners at the start of each match and keeping the same partner for the entire match kept the whole tournament flowing better than changing partners after each game.
- 3. The hotel contributing money to the pot for each event made it rewarding for all of us, even those who didn't win the event, and the hotel not only gave a special discount rate of \$21 per person, but also a sixth day free with a 5-day purchase.

4. Allowing participants to join additional events up to the time of the event.

Scheduling enough events that everyone was made to feel an important part of the tournament.

I was so impressed with John McDermott and his operation in Reno that I hope to help organize a special league this year with point money going toward sending teams from Southern California to next year's Reno tournament.







1992 National Tour — Southern California Added

The success of the 1991 Grand Slam National Tour, high-lighted by the best tournament we have ever promoted, the North American Championships in Reno, has us more excited about the prospects for the future than we have ever been at the beginning of a new year.

The 1992 Tour kicks off in the Los Angeles area, March 3-8, with the West Coast Classic. Greg McFarland and Joan Swenson are the Tournament Directors for this event which is being held at the Bicycle Club in Bell Gardens, California. In addition to having a first class facility, the Bicycle Club is also the world's largest card room.

The rest of the schedule remains pretty much the same, with the Michigan Open on Memorial weekend, May 20-25; The Board Talk Shufflers Reunion returns to the Holiday Inn, Kulpsville in the Philadelphia area, July 1-5; following that is the U.S. Open which also returns to last year's site, the Howard Johnson South Plaza Hotel in Austin, Texas; the 1992 tour will once again finish at the Sands Regency Hotel & Casino in Reno with the North American Championships, Nov. 9-15.

Several new classes of competition will make their debut on the 1992 Tour -- events for Division II and Division III players. This year's first event, the West Coast Classic, will feature a new format -- frames as opposed to points -- in the Division I, II and III and Team events, which will allow these events to be played two out of three instead of single game.

Frames is not actually a new idea. It is actually back to the future. The frames format was the most common method of play in the country from 1947 until about 1960, according to Sol Lipkin of American Shuffleboard.

Because it is our desire to promote tournaments of the highest possible quality, a couple of changes in policy will be in place for our 1992 events. It has been obvious to us in reviewing the financial side of tournament promotion that although we are closer to breaking even than we were in years past, there are going to have to be changes for us to continue this area of our business.

We have agonized over whether to increase the registration fee and have mixed feelings about doing so. There are many players who play only in the N.A.S.L. Team and we didn't think it was fair to them to pay the same registration fees as the person who is participating in three or four events. Keeping that in mind, we think that we have come up with a fair idea and have made the following changes, effective immediately.

There will be a \$10.00 per player registration fee for the team event. The players who want to participate in the tournament's other events will be charged an additional \$10.00, making the maximum registration fee \$20.00.

This change will allow us to continue to improve the quality of our tournaments by enabling us to provide you with the type of high quality tournament staff that we received so many compliments on at our tournament in Reno.

Also, the burden put on our staff to process incomplete or incorrect entry forms grew to the extent that it became a full-time job. For the Reno tournament alone, we issued \$1845 in checks to people who had overpaid. This is nothing compared to the number of letters, phone calls, and stamps we used trying to collect the balance owed by people who underpaid.

Therefore, effective immediately, our policy is that any entry form that is incomplete or incorrect shall be returned to the person who sent it. We will not hold a spot in the tournament for anyone without a properly filled out entry form. If you have any questions when you are filling out your entry form, please call us; we will be happy to assist you.

Qualifiers

We want to reiterate what we said in the September issue of The Board Talk in relation to this subject. Because of some of the problems last year -- qualifiers run for events that were already full, schedule conflicts with other tournaments, etc., spots in our tournaments will not be given to any winner of a qualifying tournament unless prior written approval has been provided by The Shuffleboard Federation, Inc.

We are very interested in helping anyone who wants to run a qualifier in their area. If you would like to run a qualifier in your bar for any of our 1992 events, please contact us as soon as possible.

While we are on this subject, we would like to recognize the excellent work of Tulsa Shuffleboard Association founders Cliff Goff and E.R. Smith. Through the use of a series of qualifiers, two six-person teams from the Tulsa area were able to win a trip -- including air fare, room, and entry fee -- to the Reno tournament.

This is the type of promotions we would like to see every league involved in. We are looking forward to the day when regional and national competitions for N.A.S.L. league players will be a reality.




