# **The Hammer**

Can we have too much of a good thing going? Like when kids eat too much candy, they get a stomachache? While we cheer the dramatic increase in shuffleboard activity, perhaps we need to do some long-range planning to make sure our sport stays free of "stomachaches." We've been talking to a number of tournament directors lately and they seem to share a common concern: The overflowing crowds that show up for a weekend event on Friday night are greatly diminished by Sunday. (We're talking about local or area tournaments -- not the nationals.)

This leads us to the conclusion that perhaps we ought to consider some questions: (1) Are we having too many tournaments? (2) Is the economy an issue? (3) Are the tournaments too long? (4) Is the entry fee too much? Too little? (5) Should we run a singles and doubles the same weekend? (6) Should a tournament start Friday evening and be over by Saturday night?

While the situation is not serious at this point, these are some questions which may need to be addressed down the road. Indiana is not effected as much as other areas because they have mostly one-day tournaments and depend upon local people for their success. But in areas where tournaments draw people from other states, perhaps the directors need to sit down together and discuss such potential problems as: would our tournaments be more successful with planned spacing between them, should we rate players, along with the questions posed above.

A lot of feedback from players and tournament directors is what we need. We will start the ball rolling by scheduling a meeting with directors in our area. Let's get a dialogue going on this issue. Drop us a note so we can share your concerns and opinions with others in The World of Shuffleboard.

# Waterloo Nationals Another Success

Over 80 shuffleboard players braved the cold January New York weather to shoot in the featured four events at the National Tournament held at the Dew Drop Inn in Waterloo on Jan. 17-19.

Friday night was a complete sell-out for the open singles event as some of the best players on the East Coast battled head-to-head. The finals lasted until 4 a.m. Saturday morning with Doug Fridley Jr. from Waterloo coming out on top. Russ Reynolds from Sherburne, N.Y., took second place honors by beating out tourney favorite Dick Losee of Poolville, N.Y. earlier in the loser's bracket and then third place finisher Steve Bennett, also from Sherburne. Earning fourth place cash money was local favorite John Arndt from Waterloo. Total prize monies were just under \$2,000.


Saturday morning saw 14 competitive mixed doubles shooters take aim at just under \$1,000 in prize money. In a close match decided by a 15-13 score, Theresa Gibson and partner Doug Fridley Jr. won it all over the tough team of Tracie Fridley (Doug's sister) and John Arndt. Third place went to tourney favorites Sammi and Dave Fridley. For Theresa Gibson, this was her first ever first place trophy and jacket.

Theresa Gibson and Doug Fridley, Jr. were winners of the mixed doubles event. This was Theresa's first ever - first place finish.



The draw partner event Saturday afternoon was a near sell-out as over 30 players shuffled for the top prize of half the near \$1500 pot. It was the tourney favorites from Sherburne, Dick Losee and Steve Bennett, first drawn team from the hat and first place winners. The second place team was Dew Drop Inn owner Doug Fridley Sr., who teamed up with Marv Smith from Hackettstown, New Jersey. Third place went to Baldwinsville's Lyle Haney and his partner, Doug Fridley Jr. Cashing in fourth spot was the Dew Drop Inn's own "big man," Dave Coleman, and his partner, Bob Smith from Rolulus, N.Y.

Sunday featured the bring partner event with 28 of the area's best players shotting for about \$2,000. A game literally (continued on page 4)
