Tourney Talk

"Dream Team" Wins Two at Whistling Oyster

The Whistling Oyster Tavern's annual shuffleboard tournament the first weekend in August attracted 54 players in the draw partner event and 32 teams in the open doubles. This favorite shuffleboard site is located in Quilcene, Washington, operated by popular tourney hosts, Bill Bailey and Sandee Van Wagenen.

When the names were drawn from the hat for the Friday night draw partner tourney, everybody was satisfied, particularly Jim Allis of Longview, Washington, and Darrol Nelson of Springfield, Oregon. Play got started at 7:30 p.m. and lasted until 8:30 a.m. Saturday morning. Jim and Darrol never hit the loser's bracket and were the happiest of the eight very exhausted players who lined up to take their share of the \$1550 pot.

Taking second place honors were Al Cantor of British Columbia, Canada, and John Troia of Longview. Gary George of Longview and his uncle, John Luhtolo of Eatonville, Washington, took third place, with fourth going to Dave Arndt and Ron Wicks, both from Tacoma, Washington.

Within two hours of that payoff, the open doubles were started, with 32 anxious, hungry teams determined to take the lion's share of the \$7400 pot. After 18 hours of play and 100 pounds of shuffleboard wax, guess who took first place! Darrol Nelson and Jim Allis, the "dream team" of shuffleboard. Second place honors went to Don "Mitch" Mitchell of Portland, Oregon, and Freddy Johns of Longview, Washington. Third place went to Billy Powell of Renton, Washington, and Nels Anderson of Shelton, Washington. Fourth was well-earned by a couple of up and coming guys from Spokane, Washington, Mike Thorpe and Dan Hitt.

"Sandee and I thank everyone who got involved in what could only be described as a huge success," said Bill Bailey. "A special thanks to the crew at the tavern that worked 16-hour shifts and to my long-time friend, Jim Foran from Tacoma. This guy is one reason our tournaments are always a success."

The Whistling Oyster's tentative plans for next year include a state championship open singles on Thursday

with \$500 added, a draw partner on Friday night, and an Open Grand Masters on Saturday and Sunday with \$1,000-plus added.

Allis/Cox Win "Rural America II"

Jim Allis of Washington and Don Cox of California teamed up to take top honors in the 4th of July weekend "Rural America II" tournament at the "99" Tavern in Winston, Oregon, earning the biggest share of the \$4,000 purse. Second place went to Doug Buhl (lately from Oregon, via Sacramento, via Bremerton, Washington) and Don "Mitch" Mitchell of Portland/Springfield. Dave Arndt of Tacoma, Wash., and Ken Wochnik of Portland took third, with Joe Lavin, Longview, Wash., and Steve Fisher, owner of the "99" Tavern, in fourth.

"The tourney was a blast, with an outstanding finals contest," reports Steve. "Don and Jimmy won the winner's bracket and held off a gallant charge (Doug and Mitch won the first 2 of 3 set) to win the final game of the second set 15-13 after trailing 10-13."


The tourney took on an interstate flavor with players from Oregon, Washington, California, and Colorado.

Up to that point, he hadn't won a single game in Winston. "After this tournament.... well, let's just say he's proven himself," Steve concedes.






