

News and Views from The World of Shuffleboard

A.Z. Gets Support for His Way of Thinking..... From Texas:

I am in total agreement with A.Z. Turnbo's comments appearing in the November 1993 issue of *The Board Talk*, in particular changing shuffleboard games from the 15-point format to the 11-point format. I have always been an outspoken critic of the 11-point (or 9point) format. In my opinion, these are hustler/cut-throat games that eventually turn away many players who were introduced to the 15-point game.

The 11-point format is played in a local establishment that has two fine boards, regardless of whether two or 20 players are involved. I understand there are instances where the 11-point game may be practical, for example, an establishment that has only one board and several players. But, even then, I have always contended that if a lesser point game is necessary, a 12-point format makes more sense.

And From Canada:

We Canadians agree with A.Z. Inasmuch as we know you can only have so many entries and play so many games in a limited amount of time, we feel -- as always, it's first-come, first-serve. We play board for the challenge of the game as well as your U.S. players and we've had to learn to play a 15-point doubles match. We pay a lot of money to travel to the U.S. tournaments as well (and it costs us a bit more) and we, too, would like to see a 2 out of 3, double elimination. We like to get more than two games for our money.

By all means, raise the price of the games, but give us decent boards to play on. A.Z. is right about the playing surface. The worse the surface, the longer a game takes.

Also, we agree with the length of time to deliver weights. Hurry it up, guys!

Also, we want to see the mixed doubles in Vegas be exactly that -- a "Mixed Doubles." There are plenty of open doubles tournaments around. We aren't worried about the prize money. It's just an added event that we can enjoy for our trip to Vegas. But, have it 2 out of 3, double elimination!

Please, as A.Z. says, "leave the game of shuffleboard alone and let us play it as we've always played it."

We need new people involved, so stop scaring them away.

If you end up with too many players for one tournament, have a second one for all the extras. Be fair.

Hope this little bit of input helps. See you in Vegas.


