All Lil had to do was keep the board "safe" by either "sticking" or "going," and not allowing Eddie an opportunity to "hide" a weight or set up a "combo." It was working out according to plan. The board was "clean" on Eddie's last shot. He put up a deep left-cross which ended up in the 2 zone, and was actually hanging over the side of the board. It was an excellent shot, considering the "drift" on the table.

Lil sized up the weight and on her release, she remarked to Eddie, "Get your quarters in, sucker....this game is over." Indeed it was, as her weight gently nudged his off the board and stopped in the 2 Zone!. This game was history!

Eddie was mad -- mad at himself, and mad at Lil's confidence -- and arrogance. He was very perplexed as he pondered how a "woman" could do him in that way. He even thought he heard a few snickers from the on-lookers.

His emotions were further intensified as he heard a

voice behind him say, "What are we getting into here, Eddie?"

The voice was totally familiar and his mind whirled in search of a reply, as he turned around to look into the eyes of his girlfriend, Shelli.
