
4th Annual Skip's/Board Talk Fall Tournament, Houghton Lake, Michigan, Sept. 10-11


Bennett/Smith/Freer/White Big Winners at Sherburne, New York, American Legion

Southwest Open Another Big Success!

Thanks to all of you who participated in the Southwest Open Shuffleboard Tournament at the American Legion 73 in Del City, Oklahoma, July 1-4. Sharon and I hope each of you enjoyed your stay and play as much as we enjoyed hosting the event.

The enclosed flyer and photos show several of the players taken just prior to the start of the draft team event. It also lists those who finished in the money in the different events. You may just want to keep or post this flyer as it shows some of the better players in the sport today, as well as some up and coming players you will be seeing in *The Board Talk* over the next few years.

Once again, over \$30,000 was up for grabs and almost half of the players finished in the money in one event or another. We presented 35 plaques to 31 different players. The diversity of winners and comments gives us a positive feedback that we are on the right track in trying to present a tournament format that gives every player, regardless of skill level, a chance to participate, to win, and to be involved in a successful tournament.

We will be improving the format before next year, but it is definitely a "keeper" event. Although several players were unable to participate, we still had 72 entries for 12 teams. The cheering was loud, the razzing in good taste, and competition fierce. My compliments and thanks to the team captains.



Royce...and might even have the money to buy one!"






