future. In the meantime, if we can be of assistance to your worthy endeavors, please alert us. We would be honored to help with a project."

Along with that letter came a check as the first contribution to this endeavor. We're holding that check "in escrow" and will pass it along to that committee when (and if) it's formed and we'll add another one.

Very frankly, folks, we think the ball is back in your court on this effort. That effort will receive 100 percent support from us, as your communications vehicle; and (we're certain) from The Shuffleboard Federation, which is conducting the first induction ceremony; and the Pacific Coast Shuffleboard Association, which has always been responsive to good causes; and probably some of our other supply support systems.

We feel very strongly that this Shuffleboard Hall of Fame endeavor should remain in the hands of the players -- not with any of the entities that (hopefully) will benefit from the growth of our sport. That's going to take some strong leadership on the part of players -- to give back to the game a little bit of what it's given them, to set aside their egos and work together with their challengers (on the boards) to make this good thing happen. To see that happen would mark a turnaround in our sport. We've got some wonderful potential leaders with integrity and it is our hope that they will come forward to accept this challenge/opportunity.

We call your attention to The Shuffleboard Federation's column this month. John McDermott has started giving weekly shuffleboard lessons to beginning players and encourages other pros to do the same.

We heartily endorse that concept. Some pros are already serving as "teachers" as opportunities arise, but the regularly-scheduled format provides a more structured "classroom" atmosphere that will pay off in benefits of new talent to keep our sport alive and growing. That's a goal we all share.

Pros: reach out and share your skills and knowledge about the game with others. Beginners and average players: don't be shy about asking a pro to conduct a class. It's hard for us to believe that any of them wouldn't be willing to invest a couple hours of week to the future of shuffleboard.
