Something New for Nebraska: Raffling Bars!





I said, "Oh, no -- that nice trophy" and pointed at that ugly thing behind the bar.

Tacoma finally won the match and I grabbed the trophy and presented it to them, slipped the wad of bills to someone (could it have been Jim Foran?) and out the door they ran, yelling and screaming, "We won the trophy, we won the trophy." The liquor inspector said, "I'll be back to see you Monday morning, Jack," and left.

Truman came down to the end of the bar and had that little grin of his. He said, "I was watching you while that liquor inspector was here, and you put on a performance that would put Barrymore to shame." He gave me his



First and second place finishers Dan Hitt (right) and Mike Thorpe show off their "hardware."


This one/two finish was the finalization of a goal established by two young talents in Spokane, Washington, some six years ago.




The legendary Art Green proved he's still got what it takes and collected the thirdplace trophy in the open singles.






The singles got underway on Friday night with a field of 27 entries and a pot totaling \$1,215.

Loren Lampley of Shelton, Washington, took second place honors, with Morey Balins of Denver in third.




Char Waugaman of Denver took fourth in the singles.

A surprise second place finish was scored by local patrons U.J. West and Shirla Porter. Fred Washington and Charlie Sawyer finished in third place.





About Gary Moore's interest in the Hall of Fame and the qualifications and behavior of its members. The only thing I can say is you have to look at where the game came from and the people who brought to light that it's a great game and worked toward getting rules enforced and approved, holding tournaments and forming leagues. All these people work on their own (no money -- no thanks) most of the time. They keep working because they know there will be a great future for the sport if people will pitch in and help get things done. Instead of worrying about yesterday or tomorrow, they focus on today, here and now.

I read a story about the generals that served under Grant in the North/South War who informed the President that he stayed drunk or drank whiskey while in battle. The response from President Lincoln was: find out what brand he drinks and join in. What's good for one is tragic for another. Everyone to their own way of life or passion. 
Besides, we don't have any million dollar contracts to worry about either.

As usual, shuffleboarders respond to a worthy cause. Even though there still isn't an official Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, The Board Talk publishes a 4-page tribute to Bob Miles with endorsements and memories from his peers. The Shuffleboard Federation honors him as the first inductee at its North American Championships in Reno. A fund to assist the two children of Billy Maxwell of California is established to help Jamie and Nicholas after their mother was killed. The Pacific Coast Shuffleboard Association stages a benefit tournament and nets \$4,000 for the fund.






