

Al Has Suggestion for Hall of Fame Directors

I have a suggestion to the National Shuffleboard Hall of Fame Board of Directors concerning who to induct from years past.

Who was known in the East was never heard of in the West. Same with those great players from all over years ago. However, they all "paid their dues" to make the game what it is today and should be recognized for their contributions to shuffleboard.

It is my understanding that many of them do not meet the requirements to be formally inducted into the Hall. Therefore, I suggest we collect all the information possible on these people (pictures, stories, feats, etc.) and place it in the Hall of Fame under the title of "The Early Years," or any other appropriate name. This way, they will be included in the Hall and some very colorful people, and a vital part of the history of our game, will be preserved for the future players.

Because the sport has changed so much from what it was years ago, deciding how to honor those individuals from that era has been one of the greatest challenges for the NSHF Board of Directors. The "measuring stick" they have for induction today just doesn't fit yesterday's pioneers who played mostly for their own glory and pockets rather than advancement of the sport. They didn't have the tournaments, organization, rules and disciplines that shuffleboard has today, so they can't be judged by the same criteria. However, as you say, they "paid their dues" and should be recognized somehow. Your suggestion is a good one and we're sure the board will appreciate your input. It's going to take the cooperation and caring of a lot of people to gather the information and memorabilia to make it a fitting tribute. While the NSHF has made great strides since its inception, there is still the matter of a structure that will house the Hall where people can go to learn about the history of their sport. We hope your 1997 will be filled with health, happiness, prosperity, and lots of shufflin' fun!



Nelson/Lampley Winners of BZ's Annual Thanksgiving Tournament







Mother's Pizza Shuffleboard History

In early 1992, while I was promoting shuffleboard play in Corpus Christi, I approached Gail "Mother" Sheets about the possibility of putting on a tournament on the unused 22 ft. board at her bar, despite the fact that it was covered with talcum powder and only had six weights. She told me she didn't own the board and nobody played on it except the kids and I would have to contact the owner. The owner wasn't interested in putting up \$20 for the purse after I got the table playable, so he and I went into negotiations for me to purchase the table. Finally, in July of 1995, we reached an agreement and I purchased my first table on Aug. 1.

Immediately upon paying for the table, I cleaned and adjusted it and tested it with a used set of weights. During the hour it took me to transform that unused board to a

very good playing, very fast table, I had six patrons oggling the board in disbelief. Jerry Sheets, Gail's husband, wanted to try his hand at the table and nearly loosened the cradle end boards at the opposite end when he shoved (?) the weights. He asked if I would consider renting him the table on a 30-day trial basis and direct a tournament on Aug. 11 and I said YES. I brought eight players and, to my surprise, Mother's had eight players for a blind draw, pairing one outsider with one Mother's player, and a great time was had by all. We even had a live band, which played most Fridays for about two years prior to the introduction of Friday Night Shuffleboard. The last we heard the band on Fridays was Aug. 18.

From a good start, we got a steady growth to the point where for two weeks in August 1996, due to time limitations, only 24 players could play. I suggested a second board and discovered that Gail and Jerry had already discussed the possibility. On Sept. 1, I installed another 22 ft. board and now claim to have the two fastest wood boards in captivity. I also made two 2 in. by 12 in. by 8 ft. bars that sit 38 inches high alone side one of the tables (the backs and corners are edged with plexiglas). All the players jockey to get a seat at the bar where they have an unobstructed view and a seat. Oh, yes, the bars are lined and numbered like a shuffleboard.



The average number of players is now 26 on Fridays and the first Saturday of each month is bring partner night.

What a great sporting game shuffleboard is and, at Mothers, the players and patrons cheer and applaud the plays like the gallery at a professional golf tournament.


