




The two "Main Men" who kept things moving during the challenging, action-packed eight-day event were bracketeer Rob Kern and director-sponsor John McDermott.

Taking second place honors was Diana Hagen's team of Mike Kinney, Ron Sosovec, Melody Marine, Jim Payne and Jim Kosiske.



The current directors are: Glen Davidson, Oklahoma; Hal Perry and Bob Hunt, California; Louise Freer, Pennsylvania; Larry Creakbaum, Indiana; Dave Arndt and Frank Mako, Washington (Editor's Note: Our apologies to Frank for leaving him off the list in last month's report).

The five new members are: Don Valk, Lynda French and Harvey Kidd, Texas; Al Salazar, Arizona; and Ray Boyett, Florida. New officers were also nominated for the positions of president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer, as current officers' terms have expired. Leon Suggests a New Category to Rating System

What do the Bowers, raters and players think about adding another column called "Lifetime Achievment" to the rating system? The reason is: as a player needs to be rated at a lesser level through aging, medical conditions, an accident or other issues, the reduction may not happen to save the player embarrassment. This isn't a change to the rating system, but a method to capture the







Keevil Wins Div. III Singles






