Shuffleboard Activity Strong from Coast to Coast Nugent/Thorpe Best the Rest G.H. Richardson Takes Triple at Old Edison Inn Crown at Harvey's Place

Eighteen teams contested in the 5th annual open doubles tourney at the Old Edison Inn, Edison, Washington, on Sept. 18-19. With an ample array of some of the Northwest's best players out in full force, Tim Nugent of Seattle and Mike Thorpe of Kent, Washington, had the "right stuff," outlasting Oregon's Darrol Nelson and his partner, Mike Keevil of Tacoma.

After Nelson and Keevil came out of the loser's bracket -- sent there in the "hot seat" round by Tim and Mike -- to win a 2-0 set on Board 1, Thorpe and Nugent took their measure in three games on Board 2 (known as Edison's "Equalizer"). It was a memorable tournament for at least two of the top four finishers.



Jeanette Hohn, owner of the Fir Cone, and Dave Curtis won the winner's bracket, but had to settle for second. Jeanette also took second in the singles.


Cheri Schrum and Frank Givens fought all the way to third place after losing their first match.


Mike Keevil finished a strong third. Are these three of the best amateurs in the world? You probably won't see them in the amateur events next year....or will you?







Until someone comes up with a better idea, thanks for your patience.

We're continuing to try to make our procedures easier for whoever becomes your new publishers. Check the mailing label on this issue. It now includes your subscription expiration date. So, in addition to the red check on Page 2, you have that label to alert you that it's now time to renew. Less than 1% of our subscribers pay before they get red-checked; about 75% respond to their first red check, 20% to the second red check, and the rest will wait until they don't get a Board Talk (and their neighbors do) and then call or write asking for their "missing" issues. 
Bud's 4th Annual Labor Day Tourney Another Fun Event



Casula and Riley Inducted in Missouri Hall of Fame

During the 2nd Annual Missouri Hall of Fame Tournament, held at Eagles Lodge 3911 in Houston, on Sept. 24-25, two long-time shuffleboard stalwarts were inducted: Paul Casula and Charlie Riley.

Casula and Riley were cited for their contributions to shuffleboard as "great players, promoters, directors, and ambassadors to the game."

Paul has been playing shuffleboard for 52 years, starting in Delaware and Maryland after his discharge from the Air Force in 1947. In 1980, he took fourth in the East Coast Championships and traveled from New York to California earning his reputation as a force to be reckoned with. In 1985, he and Woodie Cockrum participated in the Board Talk's first annual tournament where they took third place. During the '80s, he organized leagues in Florissant, Missouri, and ran a league of over 22 teams.

Some comments from his peers: "Paul was one of the best shooters out of St. Louis his first 50 years of shooting. I'm proud to say that I have carried him the last five years." — Super Sam Eveland. "Paul and shuffleboard — both mean the same to me. I love playing shuffleboard and for over 40 years have been watching Paul play with nothing but good sportsmanship, quality playing and love of the game. This is one man I liked having as a partner or an opponent." — Will Capehart. "I'm glad you've been around to promote shuffleboard for people like myself." — Terrie Boothe.

Rick Pittman, president of the Missouri
Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, summed it up with: "I
don't know what we would do without people like you.
Pioneers of our sport, like you, have opened up this
game to national recognition...Thank you for
keeping shuffleboard going into the New
Millennium."

Compared to Paul Casula, Charlie Riley could be described as "a new kid on the block." He didn't start playing until 1985, but since then, he has made his mark as a player and as a director/promoter. He made some dramatic changes as director of the 1st Annual Thanksgiving Tournament at Eagles Lodge 3911 in Houston in 1994, in terms of upgrading competition into the 20th Century. "At that time, we played the long foul line at the Eagles Lodge, keep hammer and, if you said one word to your partner, you got your tongue cut out," Charlie recalls. "I announced to our local players that this tournament would be played using the short foul line, switch hammer and you could communicate with your partner during the game; you could even go to the other end of the board and look at the weights. Needless to say, these changes were not received with open arms, but everyone began practicing with these rules and have never reverted back to the old ones."


According to his peers: "I thank Charlie for the concern and help he gives to the players who need to learn the game. He always has the time to teach you and give you pointers on the game." -- Pearl Preheim. "You've been a great honor to the club and to the game of shuffleboard. It's been a great honor being a friend of yours in the shuffleboard community we live in." -- Ray Johnston. "If I show up at a tournament and find out Charlie won't be there, It's not going to be as much fun as it would be if he were." -- Mick Moran.

And again, Rick Pittman summed it up: "Congratulations on winning the Super Bowl, the World Series, and the Lord Stanley Cup, as least as far as shuffleboard goes.....To stand beside the likes of Woodie, Bill and Paul -- quite an honor!"


By popular demand, a last-minute Labor Day tournament was organized and held Sept. 2-6.

Spier/Wilber Win \$uper \$ummer \$unday Play-Off

Dennis Bittner, owner of the Club Car Lounge in Durand, Michigan, is not only a congenial host who caters to shufflers — he's also a good businessman. Summer Sundays at his place were kind of slow, and he thought probably at a couple other shuffleboard locations in Michigan, business was about the same. So why not join together in a cooperative effort to address that problem and, at the same time, offer shufflers a unique opportunity?

He came up with the idea for a Super Slammin' Summer Sunday Shuffleboard, a series of three doubles tournaments held at three locations: Stober's Lounge in Lansing, Majestic Cafe in Pontiac, and the Club Car Lounge in Durand -- with a playoff at the end of the series. Only those teams that committed themselves to participate in the series of three would be eligible for the playoffs, with \$5 of each player"s entry in each tournament set aside to add to the playoff pot. Others could participate (and add their \$5 to the pot), but if they hadn't paid their entries for the first three, they didn't "qualify" for the playoffs. In addition to the doubles, all three locations added a singles to the agenda. A good idea, but 18 teams did not line up to pay their \$120 for the series of three. Instead, only eight teams qualified for the playoff, held at the Club Car on Sept. 26. However, totals for the three events indicated it was, indeed, a good idea. At Stober's, there were 12 doubles teams and 17 singles; at Majestic, there were 14 doubles teams and 22 singles; and at Club Car, there were 14 doubles teams and 16 singles, for a total pot of \$8,355. At the play-offs, the eight teams vied for a share of the \$1500 pot, including the \$400 setaside from the previous three events. That translates to almost \$10,000 for players and better-than-usual summer weekend business for the three locations.


With a disappointing eight instead of 18, would Dennis try it again?

"I'd sure like to do it again and I hope Linda (Stober's) and Charlee (Majestic) agree, and maybe we can get McCabe's in Saginaw involved and make it a Series of Four," he said. "We probably should start earlier, maybe in June, and promote it well in advance. I think more shufflers will look at it as a good deal. Just think how sweet the setaside pot would have been if we'd had 18 teams."

Dennis extends thanks to the eight teams that participated in the full "tour": the Pontiac teams of Bob Bolt and Steve Auten, Charlee Magoo and Rudy Amador, Bill Kane and Vic Mattson, Cassic and Jeff Schubert; Ron Bown and Ron Palmer of Lansing; George Wilber of Lansing and Bud Spie Houghton Lake; Dennis Bittner and John Addingt of Durand; and especially Butch Thomas and Connie Odum who made the trip from Noblesville Indiana, to Michigan four times. (Subs were used occasionally but had to be the same or above the rating of the regular.)

"I also think it was a good example to other states to cooperate with each other instead of competing against each other's events. That malus all winners," Dennis concluded.

According to the sponsor sale, the powerful Pontiac teams of Bob Bolt and Steve Auten, Bill Kane and Vic Matteson were the favorites. However, in two surprising upsets, Bob and Steve got knocked out while Bill and Vic battled for a sha of the pot, and finally settled for third place.



Going undefeated to take top honors in the playoff were Bud Spier and George Wilber.





Bow-Edison's Richard Larson (left) and Mike Waters from Hood Canal were in good spirits after earning a hard-fought 3rd place finish.


