
Spokane's Memorial Day Extravaganza Lives Up to Its Name!

The 19th Annual Memorial Day Shuffleboard Extravanza took place at the Season Ticket in Spokane, Washington, from May 25 through May 29. Players hailed from California, Idaho, Kentucky, Oregon, Washington, as well as British Columbia, Canada. In addition to four main events, they were able to get in lots of "pea rounds," thanks to eight boards and a well-organized staff. There was \$1000 added to the pot and the fun escalated when a vintage car was given away on Sunday.

A unique event started out the competition on May 25 when a "developmentally disabled adult" tournament took place. Tournament hosts added bumpers to the gutters and players would throw all eight weights in a round trying to score the most points. It was a rewarding event for participants and spectators, and players were awarded medals and t-shirts for their efforts.

The extravaganza continued Friday night with an A-B draw. Thirty-nine teams showed up and four places were paid for this event.



Larry Pearson (left) and Mike Keevil, both of Washington, were winners of the A-B draw.


Patti Preymak of British Columbia and Tim Nugent of Washington took second place.

Competition was intense and the state of Washington swept all four paying places. The winners were Rick Gindt, Terry Woodard and Kathy Keevil.

The Eagles Lodge in Exeter, California (near Visalia), had an ABC draw and an A-B draw tournament on the Memorial weekend.




First place in the ABC draw went to Bruce Kyle (left), Anna and Bob Brunskill.



California Hall of Famer Bobby Goldsmith and Leslie Lankton took second in the A-B draw.




Judy Morphis and Steve Floyd finished third.

It's no secret that after nearly 17 years, these two "old" people are close to the burn-out stage and are looking for others to take over where we left off. We have some outstanding candidates and encourage you to give them the same support you have given us. At this time, The Board Talk is the only national publication devoted exclusively to the sport of table shuffleboard and we believe it is important that it remain so. Anything less will dilute our cooperative efforts to make it a strong, viable sport that will not "die" like it did in the '50s. If you agree with our commitment, do everything you can to encourage expansion of subscriptions and advertising, no matter who the new publishers may be.

Before we relinquish this editorial platform, there is something we want to discuss with you....

If you watch the ESPN channels, you must be as amazed as we are at the number of sports that are covered. Anything that has wheels, i.e., autos, motorcycles, bicycles, rollerblades, tractors, etc. Anything that involves balls, i.e., football, basketball, soccer, golf, tennis, pool, bowling, etc. What about pucks? Well, of course, there is hockey. But what about shuffleboard? Many who love the game, and believe it's the most exciting sport of all, wonder about that. WHY NOT SHUFFLEBOARD?

Let's take a look at why.... Which of the above sports is largely held in a tavern setting? Which of the above sports would you find the players drinking spirits and smoking (and sometimes during) between plays? Which of the above sports "sells" its participants on an auction block?

Let's face it, folks -- NONE!

Just imagine the "fun" ESPN's Sports Reporters would have with our largely illegal auctions. Just imagine ESPN's "Outside the Lines" investigating a final match for a title when they uncover the fact that one contender was "bought" by his/her opponent. And just imagine the "fun" the IRS would have tracking down those unreported winnings.

Instead of whining because shuffleboard is not on ESPN, maybe we should be thankful that it's not! Shuffleboard has come a long way from its image of a bar sport dominated by hustlers. We know that there is no sport where its participants care more, or respond to, the needs of their fellow players, than shuffleboard. However, that's not news for ESPN; that's only news in The Board Talk.

What's the answer? We wish we could leave our "post" with one, but we can't. We challenge The World of Shuffleboard to come up with a constructive solution.

A Board Talk salute to the state Shuffleboard Halls of Fame that have recently inducted worthy individuals: Jolene Lembke in California (we had to change their Shuffleboard Directory ad from "A few good men" to a "few good shufflers" to accommodate that latest induction); Al Salazar in Arizona; Marie Sweeney in Michigan; George Ostrom in Colorado; the Gilmans in the Northwest.

We liked what Jolene Lembke said at the recent induction of Don Cox into the California Hall of Fame (postponed when he had his heart problems) and believe it is well worth sharing with others...

"The ultimate success of the National Hall of Fame depends upon its grassroots network. Not everyone inducted at the state level may fit the criteria for national induction, yet they are the ones who 'make it happen' at the local level and that's where the vitally important foundation is built. Those people deserve the recognition the state Halls of Fame provide. Without that, the NSHF would be so exclusive that its foundation would crumble! They may be people who have never won a major tournament or been in the 'top 20,' yet they serve without recognition as promotors, directors, behind-the-scenes workers, those who do all the menial chores pros don't want to be bothered with -- key people who keep the game going and growing at 'home.' The idea that only those who qualify for national induction should be recognized at the local level needs to be squelched -- now!" she said.

It was totally awesome for us to be inducted into the National Shuffleboard Hall of Fame and for that, we will always be grateful, but the induction into our state Hall of Fame meant just as much. Don't sit on the sidelines and wonder why "so and so" hasn't been inducted. Get off your duffs and get the process underway.

Tribute to Ceylon Davis

The city of Lansing and the tri-state area (Michigan, Indiana, Ohio) lost a pioneer shuffleboard player, tournament director, and league officer on June 5, 2000, with the death of Ceylon Davis.

Ceylon held multiple offices in the Lansing Shuffleboard League in the late '60s and early '70s. His organizational skills kept the league going and kept shuffleboard alive for both experienced and new players. He was a good player and won the city singles and doubles championships many times.

During this time, Ceylon arranged and ran the only shuffleboard tournament in Michigan. The multiple team tournaments included teams from Lansing, Pontiac, Detroit, and Indiana and Ohio. These tournaments were held at the Lansing Eagles, Brothers, and the Trestle. At Ceylon's tournaments, the Lansing players -- Ed Estep, Jerry Siebert, Lee McDonald, and J.R. Lopez -- met Jim Long, Larry Creakbaum, Bill and Jerry Knox from Indiana, and the Broka Brothers and Phil McGrew from Ohio. The rivalries and friendships started at these tournaments established the shuffleboard bond in the tri-state area.

It was Ceylon who inspired me to begin running tournaments. As Ceylon moved away from shuffleboard activities, I was able to fill the void and keep tournament shuffleboard going in Lansing by

running tournaments at Stobers.

Ceylon's name will not be recognized by the new players of the game. His shuffleboard legacy will remain as tournaments in the tri-state area continue. Ceylon Davis is a good candidate for the Michigan Shuffleboard Hall of Fame.

We always had the highest regard for Ceylon as a player and as a person, and agree that he should be in the Michigan Hall of Fame. 




Davidson/Hersom Big Winners at Bill English Memorial Open


"Gentleman George" Ostrom Inducted into Colorado Hall of Fame






Second place went to R.U. Underwood and Brad Lowrey, shown with sponsor Ruthie Atherton.

OPPORTUNITIES UNLIMITED AT 11TH ANNUAL NASC, OCT. 29-NOV. 5, RENO

Plans for the 2000 North American Shuffleboard Championships are well underway. Because of your input, several changes -- some major and some minor -- are being made to improve the tournament. The biggest single change is the purchase of 24 brand-new boards for the tournament.

As far as the events go, there are two changes. The format for the Division I Doubles will switch from single game, double elimination, to 2 out of 3 in the winners bracket and one 21 point game in the losers bracket. After the tournament, we will calculate how much additional time is needed for that format and gradually make the same change in the other amateur singles and doubles events.

The other big news is the addition of a Crazy Eights event for the amateurs. Because of the tremendous number of players who expressed a desire to play in this event, the format is still being worked out.


One of the tournament's main highlights, the 6-person Amateur Team Event, will get a little more interesting this year. Bar owners (or anyone sponsoring a team) can win \$1,000 if their team wins. In order to qualify, the team roster, entry fee and registration fee for all players must be postmarked by Sept. 1, 2000. The bonus is based on at least 28 teams in the event. If there are less than 28 teams, the sponsor bonus will be \$500.

Just a reminder: all players must be registered guests of the Sands Regency Hotel Casino, and there is a maximum of two players per room. Both players must be registered at the front desk. No registrations will be accepted from people who do not have a confirmed reservation at the Sands, either through a block of rooms, or a room and airfare package.


