



Johnny Ballard of Texas drew Jerry Widdoes of Tulsa to take third place in the field of 29 teams.







As a preface, we wish to thank and recognize Glen Davidson, Hal Perry, Bob Hunt, and Louise Freer for their fantastic jobs performed in their prior offices of President, Vice President, Chief Financial Officer/Treasurer, and Secretary respectively and all other former NSHF Directors and are very pleased that they accepted to continue in the directors role. As many of you may already know, it was decided during the NSHF meeting held during the Reno 1999 tournament, that the directors would be expanded from seven to 12 Board of Director positions. This gives us much better geographic

coverage and will better enable us to work more closely with the shuffleboard community and the state Shuffleboard Hall of Fame committees.

Open Meeting July 1, Del City, Oklahoma

The next NSHF meeting will be an OPEN meeting and will be held in the afternoon of Saturday, July 1, 2000, in Del City, Oklahoma. The Southwest Open tournament is scheduled for July 2-8, so by having the NSHF meeting on the day before tournament startup, we should be able to have maximum attendance without tournament play conflicts. The meeting details (location, time and agenda) will be communicated once confirmed and finalized. We hope many of you are able to attend, most especially State Shuffleboard Hall of Fame Directors and committee members. One of our top priority goals for Year 2000 will be to work more closely with the state committees and possibly reduce the workload of national and state members, including performing and chairing national and state induction ceremonies.

All interested parties: please come in a day early with plans to attend the July 1st NSHF meeting prior to tournament startup.

Year 2000 NSHF Board Plans & Considerations

- 1. Forming a NSHF Finance Committee comprised of a set of directors per procedures outlined in the NSHF Bylaws, Section 12. This committee would be responsible for review of the current financial conditions of the NSHF, recommend means of fund raising, establish procedures and forms for "pre-approval" of all treasury expenditures as dictated in the NSHF Bylaws, Section 11. These recommendations and procedures would then be voted on by the directors.
- 2. Forming a NSHF Historical Committee comprised of a set of directors per procedures outlined in the NSHF Bylaws, Section 12. Volunteers from the shuffleboard community are needed to assist this committee when it is formed. We would like to get volunteers from across the country to gather and submit history to the NSHF Committee. We will establish a single "safe" repository for these historical collections which will likely be a bank box or fireproof safe until such time a NSHF facility can be leased or purchased for actual display. If interested in volunteering for collection and submission of historical information,

please contact Lynda French, NSHF Secretary.
One volunteer (Mike Halstead of Kentucky) has
been received thusfar. We need more volunteers to
provide a broad coverage of the shuffleboard
community geographically (e.g., North, South, East,
West, and Central). VOLUNTEERS?

- 3. Conduct a NSHF Bylaws review (planned to occur during the NSHF July meeting) to determine if any amendments need to be made to accommodate the growth and extended plans of the NSHF. Bylaws amendment considerations will require a majority vote of NSHF Directors before any amendment updates will be exercised.
- 4. Standardized NSHF "Induction Nomination Forms" that can also be used as a template for the state SHOF committees will be revisited and updated. If you have someone to nominate as a potential deserving candidate for the NSHF, please contact Lynda French, NSHF Secretary, for the submission template and guidelines for preparing and submitting the form.
- 5. NSHF induction ceremony procedural review. We will continue to keep the ceremonies as professional and cost-efficient as possible, working jointly with local resources to assist with these inductions. By the expansion of the NSHF Board of Directors to 12 members and making use of local resources (such as state SHOF members), we hope to have a more efficient geographic coverage to assist with NSHF ceremonies. In the formative years, much of the NSHF treasury budget has been spent on travel to induction ceremonies. Since formation, we have a growing number of local state Shuffleboard Hall of Fame resources and a broader regional coverage of NSHF Directors. We feel this will better enable us to not only improve the induction process, but should also help in reducing induction costs.

A suggestion has been received recommending that the NSHF Directors consider performing the induction ceremonies annually at one of the well-attended national tournaments, such as Reno or Del City. This could provide a broader national level ceremony attendance and recogition. This suggestion (and any others the shuffleboard community might have) should be discussed and voted on during the July meeting.

Another discussion item will be the status of a temporary preference that inductees be at least 60 years old. This was never voted as a NSHF Bylaw amendment, but was an informal attempt to honor some of the older deserving players as the first inductees into the NSHF. Now that we are five years into NSHF formation, it has been suggested that the

age 60 year old informal agreement be lifted and/or NSHF Bylaws be amended to reflect any age requirements for inductee candidates. Comments from the shuffleboard community are welcome!

6. Provide a periodic NSHF treasury report to the shuffleboard community (e.g., via The Board Talk and the NSHF section of the BOWERS CORNER internet website):

http://www.jump.net/~ronbowers/nationalhof.html
The frequency of reports has not been finalized,
but likely will occur either quarterly or semi-annually.

7. Review and establish improved communication channels between the NSHF Directors and the shuffleboard community. Third place went to Betty Melton of Davis and Dave Fleming of Oklahoma City.









