East Coast Shufflers "Warm Up" at Harvey's Place

With many local leagues coming down to the wire for final play-offs in the tri-state area of Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware, and the Maryland State Championships (open to all players) coming up in late April, it wasn't difficult to draw a large representative group for this tournament. It was the annual "Spring Warm-Up" at Harvey's Place, Street, Maryland, on March 24-26.

Friday night was the draw partner event scheduled on the four in-house boards. Some surprising draws and a host of new winners (at least we hadn't seen them for some time).



Taking first place were Len Dell (left) of Baltimore and Curtis Dean, Rising Sun, Maryland. Len also finished second in the singles.

Taking second place cash in the draw partner were J.B. Armour, Chesapeke City, Md., and Dick Gorman, Wilmington, Del., with final money going to third place finishers, Judy Iseman of Chestertown, Md., and local Arnold Ledford.

On Friday night during the draw partner tournament, several players requested host Harvey Comer to have a singles event the next day. Harvey, always willing to be flexible, said yes with the proviso that the announced bring partner would take precedence and the singles event would be played only when boards were available and the players were not scheduled to play in the bring partner. The requesters agreed and showed up for a 10 a.m. start. The singles was played on all boards until players for the bring partner started showing up for some practice shots. The singles continued during the day and into the evening with Dave Shewbridge, Pasadena, Md., going through the winner's bracket without a loss. Second place was Len Dell, coming from the loser's bracket.

The bring partner event started at the scheduled

time and the competition remained hot and wellbalanced (we use the Bower's Rating System).
