The Board Talk "Torch" Has Been Passed!

After 16 years and 11 months as publishers of The Board Talk, George and Donna Wilber have passed the "torch" to a new generation of individuals dedicated to preserving a communications vehicle for The World of Shuffleboard to keep the sport going and growing.

Effective November 2000, the trio of Kelye Stites, owner of Champion Shuffleboard, Richland Hills, Texas, and Tom and Lynda French of Austin, Texas, will join forces to continue bringing table shuffleboard news and views to shufflers and their various support systems.

Back in 1984....

After years of shuffleboard locations depending upon mailed flyers, phone calls and word of mouth to attract players to their events, the Wilbers decided to introduce a Michigan publication to fill the communications void. George had been playing since 1975 and Donna was a writer, so it seemed like an ideal team to provide a needed service and hopefully be a modest source of income to supplement their full-time jobs. They had no subscribers, no paid advertisers, no mailing permit -- just an idea they thought was worthy of their time and effort. George climbed into his battered old van and started peddling the "new baby" to shuffleboard sites in the Lansing and Grand Rapids area. John McDermott offered his assistance to deliver it to the Pontiac/Detroit area sites.

The Wilbers took that first issue, a meager 4pager, to Las Vegas for a "World Champion" shuffleboard tournament. They passed out a few to



See Page 7. the participants, along with a sign-up sheet if they wished to receive the next issue which would contain a report of this "big" event (the winners were Darrol Nelson of Oregon, 1st; Portland Eddie Graves of Oklahoma, 2nd; Doug Buhl of California, 3rd; and Mac the Greek Makarounis, 4th). They got a few names and overnight, The Board Talk became a "national" publication.

By the time the Wilbers published the fourth issue in April of 1984, they almost told readers they were strongly considering aborting the "flight" because of the expenses involved. They had even come up with a farewell headline: "The Board Talk Will Take a Walk." However, because of a packet of paid subscriptions from Texas, California and Oklahoma, and a handful of letters to the editor encouraging them to "hang in there," that obituary was never printed.

Finally, tournament sponsors across the nation began to realize the value of advertising their events (continued on Page 24)

Michigan is fortunate to have Kane & Company and Alonzo Cottrell and Theresa Stephens going



Michigan Shufflers Remember Marie with Generosity

By George & Donna Wilber Michigan's pride and joy, Marie Sweeney, who lost her long and valiant battle with cancer in July, was remembered for her years

of generosity to fellow shufflers with open hearts and wallets at a memorial tournament in her honor. Held at the Majestic Cafe in Pontiac on Sept. 15-17, the tournament featured three events with 10% of each entry and sales going to Marie's favorite organizations: Hospice of SE Michigan, which helped Marie through her final months, and the Michigan Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, which inducted her in April for her outstanding achievements and many years of support and promotion of the sport.

In addition to the 10% contribution, local businesses provided prizes for drawings for "Lots of Goodies," a booze basket, and Shuffleboard Federation weights, plus 50/50 tickets, and individual donations (including a member of a rock group that travels across the nation, who had lost his Mom to cancer). Sales for the set of weights donated by The Shuffleboard Federation were brisk and the lucky winner was Roland Harkless. Add it all up and the effort netted \$1417, half going to Hospice and half to the Michigan Hall of Fame.



Majestic host Charlee Magoo presented a check for \$708.50 to Rob Kern, member of the Michigan Shuffleboard Hall of Fame Committee. A check for the same amount was sent to Hospice of S.E. Michigan in Marie's memory. A Board Talk salute to Charlee, not only for hosting and directing a great memorial tournament, but for all her efforts in staging such a successful raffle ticket sale. A

salute also goes to all of her volunteers who aggressively worked the crowd to bring the grand total to such an impressive figure.

Kern/Hershman Win Draw Partner

When Marie's daughter, Sue, and her husband Maurice, stopped by at the Majestic on Friday evening, they were impressed by the turnout for the tournament's opening event, the draw partner. Marie had some credits on her favorite poker machine, which Charlee turned over to Sue. She doubled the winnings and turned it over to the memorial benefit.



Winners of the draw partner were Rob Kern, who managed that while doing the bracketeering, and Jerry Hershman, long-time friend and shuffling partner of Marie. "She's looking down and cheering us on," said Jerry.

Martha Hall and Vic Matteson took second place honors, with O.B. Brim and Jeff Schubert in third place.

Indiana is issuing a national challenge to all bars and clubs in the U.S.A. and Canada to see what team and the bar they represent will be crowned "The Champion of Champions" for 2001. 


A Colorful Michigan Fall Bash at Houghton Lake


Morgan/Earl Win Draw



Sixty-three players signed up for Saturday's ABC draw, forming 21 teams competing for a pot of over \$6,000.





Our "adopted sons," the big, bad Auten boys, took a share of the healthy singles pot, with Frank Blade (too old to adopt) sandwiched in between.













There were 18 entries in Sunday's open singles, vying for a pot of \$1540.





in The Board Talk, and a few businesses that provided shuffleboard products and services discovered that the publication was a pipeline to potential customers. "Good Will Ambassadors" from many states continued to spread the word about a newsletter devoted exclusively to table shuffleboard, and the subscription list began to slowly -- very slowly -- grow.

In an editorial in the first issue of The Board Talk, the Wilbers said: "Shuffleboard players are a special breed of people with a special language, one that crosses city limits and leaps state lines. We'll work hard to make THE BOARD TALK a reflection of you -- that special kind of person who shares the camaraderie of others who speak your language, who cares about your fellow shuffleboard players and what's happening to them. Share and care -- that's what THE BOARD TALK will be all about." For the next 17 years, they endeavored to keep that pledge.

They plan to continue shuffleboard activity, attending tournaments, occasionally serving as reporters, and maintaining the many treasured friendships formed during their years of service.

Introducing Kelye....

Born in Ft. Worth, Texas, Kelye Stites is 42 (that's 52 in shuffleboard years, he says!). He and his wife, Cindy, have two children, daughter Madisen (7) and son Troy (4). He started playing shuffleboard in 1976 while attending Texas A & M. He played almost every day for two years at Farkelberry's Tavern (currently the Dixie Chicken) where they had two American tables. Finally, because he didn't have much time for school, A & M asked him to move on to a new college. He transferred to TCU in Ft. Worth and although he did manage to find more time for studying, he played shuffleboard daily at the Hi-Hat Lounge (currently The Cellar, which has a Champion board). He played on the city shuffleboard league from 1987 to 1994 and again from 1998-2000.

"Bob and Sheryl Shaw have always been on our team, but we've had to play against the Williams boys, so we have finished second every year but one," said Kelye. "They show no mercy for manufacturers. I've also played in three tournaments and I'm still waiting for my first win (not a tournament win, just to win a game!)."

In 1990, Kelye helped his father-in-law's company, Dynamo, start making shuffleboard tables. The product never had the sales volume expected, so in 1992, he talked Dynamo into

letting him take over the shuffleboard business, and he formed his own company, Champion Shuffleboard. The next three years were difficult and Kelye thought perhaps he had made a mistake giving up a secure job at Tokai Financial Bank. His father-in-law advised him to stay the course and in about 1996, things started to turn around. Champion now has its own 40,000 square foot building with about 25 employees.

Kelye hopes to get more tables into home game rooms, which will encourage younger players to develop a loyalty to the game.

"We have teamed up with Lynda and Tom French to make sure The Board Talk will continue as long as shuffleboard is around," Kelye said. "The Board Talk fits into our plans to help unite all players, grow the organization, and set up a permanent museum. Over the past six months, I've talked with several people involved in shuffleboard in one way or another and I've been amazed at the number of people who are putting forth a personal effort to help the game. I'm awestruck that George and Donna have published The Board Talk for 17 years without ever expecting any personal gain.

"Hopefully, Lynda and Tom and I can help The Board Talk continue for at least another 17 years," he said.


Introducing the Frenches...






