
Points were accumulated throughout the events and the players of each skill rated category (based upon number of total point wins) receiving the SW Open 2001 Championship status were:















In Fond Memory of ... Weldon "Jack" Snell Arlington, Texas June 16, 1941 - June 3, 2001

Weldon Jack Snell (known to his shuffleboard family as "Happy Jack"), age 59, who lived in the 1800 block of W. Sanford Street, was in a car accident in the 300 block of E. Sanford



Street (Arlington, TX) at about 12:20 AM on June 3, 2001 after having participated in shuffleboard competition at the Gold Nugget in Arlington, Texas. He passed away (reportedly after being revived several times) just before 7 AM at Arlington Memorial Hospital.

His brother, Frank Snell, said that the hospital officials thought that most likely Jack had a stoke and lost control of his Ford Van on his own residential street, sideswiped a pickup truck, and then went head on into a telephone pole.

Frank Snell said that Jack had a stroke several years ago and there was no other explanation for the cause of this accident. Reportedly, the hospital tried desperately to revive him and had some success several times, but he suffered head trauma, both lungs had collapsed, heart was struggling, etc. and they were unable to do more.

Jack grew up in Arlington, one of four children. His mother ran Iva's Flower Shop in Arlington. After graduating from Arlington High School, he served for four years in the Navy. He once worked as a manager for EDS in California and his trade was computer operations. He was unemployed at the time of his death, but his brother said he had interviewed on Friday (before the accident) for a job and was optimistic about getting hired. This is the seventh close family member the Snell family has lost in 3 years, according to his brother Frank.

Jack was born June 16, 1941 in Ft. Worth, TX, the son of Jackson Eugene Snell and Iva Margerite Elrod Snell. He served in the Navy. Survivors: mother, Iva Norris (Arlington); brother, Frank E. Snell (N. Richland Hills); sister Alice Biggs (Arlington); 4 nephews and 1 niece. Jack was well known and loved by his family, friends, and shuffleboard 'extended family.' He was always smiling and wholeheartedly loved us all as much as we loved him. He will be greatly missed by the many of us that knew him.

In Fond Memory of ... Betty Jo Pullen Columbia, Missouri

Betty Jo Pullen passed away June 1, 2001 at the young age of 62, mother of five and widowed since July 1998. Betty was born and raised in



Columbia, Missouri. After her husband died, we talked her into joining our Shuffleboard sessions as a "C" player. At the time, we already had a Betty and a Jo, so we called her BJ. Within less than six months, BJ had become one of our top players. She was always there at both our Wednesday night (VFW) and Thursday night (Eagles Lodge) tournaments. BJ was a cheerful lady and a happy go lucky person that kept other players smiling. BJ will be greatly missed.

In Fond Memory of ... Joe Lavin, Jr.

April 10,1944 - July 1, 2001 Longview, Washington


WHEN I'M GONE







The TSA Directors wish to thank Don Crall, Tournament Director for the SW Open in Del City, Oklahoma, for providing annual meeting space for two consecutive years for the TSA Directors to hold their annual "open" and "closed" meetings. The meeting has been held for the past two years on the day before the SW Open tournament begins.

The TSA Directors also wish to extend a special thanks to Tournament Directors John McDermott (NASC Reno), Jack Scott (Houston Holiday Open), and Tom/Lynda French (The Board Talk Open) for inviting TSA Directors to perform TSA Hall of Fame inductions during their tournaments. National Hall of Inductions typically can have better 'National' player participation and inductee recognition at these type tournaments, whereas, State Hall of Fame Inductions are typically better to be held during selected local State tournaments. Tournament Directors have alot of responsibility - taking a half hour to hour time slot to support National Hall of Fame inductions is a greatly appreciated sacrifice. This offer from at least three tournament directors to perform TSA (National-level) induction ceremonies will give inductees and their sponsors preference options for scheduling their induction ceremonies and helps to maintain induction ceremony costs, since TSA Directors (some or all) and players typically attend one or more major tournaments each year, giving better national focus.

For those wishing to nominate someone to the TSA Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, please visit the TSA website at http://www.tableshuffleboard.org (or contact Lynda French, TSA Secretary, if you do not have internet access and need info. mailed) to get templates for preparing the nomination package and view the TSA By-Laws section on Nominations

and Induction guidelines. There are four categories for nomination: PLAYER, PROMOTER, SPONSOR, and HONORARY. Candidates can be nominated and considered for one or more of these categories. For instance, a PLAYER nomination is typically a highly skilled player or highly skilled legacy player who has had a national impact and is recognized for top skilled play. This level of recognized player will likely also be a great promoter or have contributed greatly to the growth of the sport and may often be considered as inductee candidate in both PLAYER and PROMOTER categories. Nominating someone as a PROMOTER of the sport at the national level does not necessarily mean they are a top skilled player, but rather that they have contributed greatly at the national level to promotion and growth of the sport. During our TSA 2001 Annual Meeting in Del City, it was requested that the TSA Directors help clarify the nomination criteria and help the shuffleboard community to distinguish the difference between a national and a state inductee candidate. There may be a highly qualified candidate at the state level (for instance) that may not have been that active at play or promoting the sport at the national level. Some states have State Hall of Fame organizations and some do not. Therein, lies one area of concern. If a state does not have a Hall of Fame, but has a player worthy of induction at the state level (but possibly not at the national level) then what can be done to recognize these players, promoters, or sponsors, etc.? Maybe states could cover areas/ regions? One item discussed in the past couple meetings is how to better coordinate with the State HOFs and discuss such concerns. Input and suggestions from all State Hall of Fame organizations --TSA Directors and players are needed/welcome.



Gordie Smith Reports on League Play in Canada!

Shuffleboard in Canada is played primarily on 14 foot planks with different rules than longboard. For example, the plank has a center line which a weight has to be over to stay on the board (this weight does not count, but can be used as a guard). Then you have your 1, 2, and 3 areas which are 6", 12", and 30" from the end of the board. A player has to be behind the board on delivery and cannot straddle and you are not allowed to dust/sprinkle the rails or bare spots. We are also required to use a wax/ powder that is manufactured in Canada (which is terrible.) As of now, Vancouver, Fraser Lake, and Jim Baker in Ontario are using good powder (we use Federation and Jim uses Triple Crown.) We also have to use Sunglo weights, but hopefully this requirement will change. Vancouver, B.C. has other than a handful in the rest of Canada - the only longboards and league in Canada.

Each Province has a Playdown to see who represents their Province... then a pre-determined Province hosts the Canadian Playdowns to see who is the Canadian Champion in each division, being: Mens' & Ladies' Singles; Mens' & Ladies' Doubles; and Mixed Doubles. This year's winners for B.C. are: Ladies' Singles: Jackie Stolarchuck; Men's Singles: Nick Billings; Ladies' Doubles: Teressa Cartwright/Joanie Millar;

Mens' Doubles: Bill Wonnocott/Gordie Smith; and Mixed Doubles: Teressa Cartwright/Harry Oda.

Some of the Provinces have more than one charter such as: B.C. [has two right now for Vancouver Island (V.I.S.A.) and Vancouver (B.C.S.A.); North and South Alberta, Manitoba, and Ontario. This is because of area and players that they may have more than one charter. All of these Provinces have Leagues. Vancouver Island has their League and Vancouver has two Leagues (one in North Shore and one in Vancouver which covers most of the mainland.)

Vancouver has the only longboard league in Canada and there are maybe only a handful of longboards in the rest of Canada that are in very good condition. Almost all the shuffleboards in Canada are crowned and all are finished the old way (except in B.C.) and most don't use silicone or liquid wax. It is very difficult to try and get any changes, as most are still back in the 50's, but eventually changes will happen.

The upcoming The Board Talk Open is planned to start warmup play on Tuesday March 26th (robins/draws, no sponsor sales) and have awards and recognition dinner on Tuesday evening.

Bowers 2001 Ratings will be used to determine entry criteria due to new ratings being unavailable until February 1, 2002 and Pre-Registration will start in September or October 2001 (before Year 2002 ratings are available.)

Scheduled events tentatively planned will start on Wednesday morning, March 27th, with an A-B Draft Event. The highest rated players will be assigned as "A" captains and draft of "B" will start with the lowest rated "A" captain and upward.

Thursday morning starts with a 6-Person Draft Team Event (highest rated will be the assigned Team captains and numbers will be drawn for selection sequence of their other team members.)

Friday morning will be three divisions of *Open Singles Events (Pro, Division I, Division II)*, set entry fees/no graduated entry fees and players can play upward, but not downward.

Saturday morning will be three divisions of *Bring* Partner (Pro, Division I, Division II).

Sunday will be completion of Friday/Saturday events (if needed) and board break down.

There will be added pot based upon the point system for winners in each category.
