Dear Shuffleboard Establishment:

George and Donna Wilber retired and we are new publishers/editors for The Board Talk table shuffleboard publication (was effective November 1, 2000). In addition to sending all The Board Talk subscribers a monthly publication of shuffleboard news, we also put out a directory of establishments of places to play across the U.S.A. and Canada. Shuffleboard players use this directory titled "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A." to know what local establishments have table shuffleboards and tournaments and use this directory in their travels to other areas so that they can play in other areas in their travels.

In order for your establishment to be placed in the annual "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A" directory of places to play, you must either be a subscriber to our monthly publication which costs \$25/year to subscribe (12 issues per year) and/or you have to have placed a business advertisement in our monthly publication titled "Shuffleboard Directory." The cost to have your establishment advertisement every month in the "Shuffleboard Directory" is either \$100/year (one space ad) or \$150/year (two space sized ad). Some shuffleboard establishments subscribe to the monthly publication at \$25/year and also place an annual ad in our monthly publication (which costs either \$100/year or \$150/year – very reasonable advertisement costs to get monthly exposure to the shuffleboard players through our publication).

Your establishment is receiving this letter either because you are a subscriber or advertiser already (reminder to ensure you keep it current in order to ensure you are listed in the Summer 2001 "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A.") or you were previously listed in the annual directory and/or a shuffleboard player has asked us to contact you because they enjoy playing at your establishment and you are not a current subscriber, but they would like your establishment to be listed this summer when we compile our annual "You're your Way Across the U.S.A."

Attached is a copy of the monthly subscription form and an advertisement form which you can use to subscribe or renew your subscription or advertisement to ensure being listed in our annual "Play Your Way Across the U.S.A." If you have a current subscription or advertisement when the next directory is compiled, your establishment will be listed.

As I said, I had not seen Billy Mays in three years before I drove down to the Houston Holiday Open tourney (since I had verified that my dad actually did know him). While at the tourney, I also kept hearing the name Jim Long and wondered if this was the same Jim Long I had known of through my dad 30 years ago. The Jim Long that I remembered was from Indiana and I confirmed with a fellow shuffleboard player that the Jim Long attending the tournament was, in fact, from Indiana. I then approached Jim Long and asked him if he knew my dad, Harold "Bud" Visel. Jim replied, "Yeah, I used to run with him and played shuffleboard with him alot." About that time, Billy Mays entered the conversation and said he remembered my dad well. He told me he remembered telling my dad when he had returned from a shuffleboard tour in Washington that they had just started "auctioning shuffleboard players like cattle." Billy said my dad's eyes lit up with great interest and said "Oh, really?". Billy said that my dad then started auctioning shuffleboard players in Michigan and Indiana.

I always knew my dad was an auctioneer, but after all these years, I drive to Texas to learn about my dad starting the calcutta's in Michigan and Indiana back in the mid-60's back and that it was Billy Mays who gave him the idea! My dad Harold "Bud" Visel, born on May 29, 1922 passed away on October 2, 1999. If only my dad were still alive today so that I could talk to him more about his experiences in those early calcutta auctions!

Life is so funny. I had to come all the way from Michigan to Austin (where I first saw Billy Mays at Taz Country) and then Michigan to Houston (to the Houston Holiday Open) to find out that my own dad was instrumental in making popular the shuffleboard calcutta sponsor sales that I enjoy so much today! Many thanks to Jim Long and Billy Mays for sharing with me all the stories about my dad and his shuffleboard play in our chats during the HHO 2000 tournament. It means alot to me to learn this history!







Shuffleboard Rules!?!

As we stated in the December 2000 and January 2001 The Board Talk issues, we would like to start a section and discussion on Shuffleboard Rules, starting with rules of calling a weight safe. Johnny Ballard has provided us his description and welcomes others to refine, if needed, as follows:

Making a Weight Safe Submitted By: Johnny "B"allard, Pro from TX

If a weight is in danger of falling off the end of the board, it may be made safe. It's the option of the opposing player/team to have the weight made safe. If all players in that match agree, then any agreed upon player in that match may be allowed to make the weight safe. If not agreed upon, then a tournament official may be called upon to make a weight safe. A weight hanging off the side of the board cannot be made safe.

If a weight that has not been made safe falls off the end or side of the board during or after player's release (without the player actually hitting the weight on his shot, of course), the weight will be put back on the board as close as possible to the original spot and the player does not get to shoot his/her weight/shot over again.

If a weight that has been made safe falls off the end of the board during or after player's release, it will be put back on the board as close as possible to the original spot and player does get to shoot his/her weight/shot over again. NOTE: If a weight has been made safe, it cannot be outlagged.

New "No Show" Rule for Houston Holiday Open

In matches other than Singles, if/when a team member does not show up for a match, the Tournament Directors have the option of selecting a substitute player with an equal to or lesser rated player than the "no show" player. -- By: Johnny B

Making a Weight Safe Submitted By: "Board Talk" George from MI

On the subject of making a weight safe (Shufflers' Notebook, Page 10, January Issue), I use a method that may not be foolproof, but almost. When I prepare to shoot at the weight, I push hard against the table with my body, still holding the weight in my hand which I'm going to let loose. If

the hanger at the other end falls off they have to automatically make the weight safe because I haven't released my weight yet. If it stays on, I am confident it won't fall off because I don't hit the end of the frame with my body when I release the weight.

It doesn't work that way for everyone, so it may be okay to make the weight safe if they make sure it's still a hanger. Big question though in whatever methods are used to make a weight safe -- what if the tournament director/judge/player makes it "safe' and it then falls off as the opponent shoots and/or the opponent's weight becomes a deeper hanger after it's made safe? This needs attention and clarification, as it can make a big difference in \$\$ in a tournament the tournament. -- By: George W.

Johnny Wayne Crawford also suggested we form a "Rules Committee" that could communicate monthly with shufflers through The Board Talk and eventually the established rules could be endorsed by all tournament directors and the Table Shuffleboard Association (TSA).


the rod behind the biggest rock, and then piled a bunch of smaller ones on the back side of the pole.



Billy (I knew my dad enjoyed shuffleboard because from the time I can remember he had one in his basement). He replied, "yes, I used to play with


Billy, but I never beat him." He told me that Billy was "one of the great ones in shuffleboard."



this was achieved - even beat Bobby in the singles right after he won Reno singles [Johnny 1st and Bobby 2nd]. When Johnny ask Bobby why it never appeared in The Board Talk, he said "you shouldn't have beat me." As Johnny acknowledged, Bobby started then working to shoot left handed, as well as free hand, making him even a better player. Johnny said he asked David (the younger brother by the way not the older), if it was just him or did David think that when Bobby released a weight that he looked like he was in total pain and agony - David agreed.

Over the years, reportedly Steve Burkett has always asked Johnny who he thought he had more respect and admiration than anyone else in the game as a player. Johnny's answer was always Bobby because he always had to work so hard and was so focused to achieve his goal and that he has felt for years that Bobby was one of the greatest laggers for the final game points, be it a 2, 3, or 4.

With a great deal of pleasure and pride and honor, Johnny Wayne Crawford welcomed both Johnny Ballard and Bobby Williams into the Texas State Table Shuffleboard Hall of Fame.

BIOGRAPHY: (taken from the flyer provided to all players during the Houston Holiday Open)







Steve got into the losers bracket early which is not good with 40 players. He steadily worked himself back to the winners bracket and had to double dip Mo to take 1st Place! 



As I said, I had not seen Billy Mays in three years before I drove down to the Houston Holiday Open tourney (since I had verified that my dad actually did know him). While at the tourney, I also kept hearing the name Jim Long and wondered if this was the same Jim Long I had known of through my dad 30 years ago. The Jim Long that I remembered was from Indiana and I confirmed with a fellow shuffleboard player that the Jim Long attending the tournament was, in fact, from Indiana. I then approached Jim Long and asked him if he knew my dad, Harold "Bud" Visel. Jim replied, "Yeah, I used to run with him and played shuffleboard with him alot." About that time, Billy Mays entered the conversation and said he remembered my dad well. He told me he remembered telling my dad when he had returned from a shuffleboard tour in Washington that they had just started "auctioning shuffleboard players like cattle." Billy said my dad's eyes lit up with great interest and said "Oh, really?". Billy said that my dad then started auctioning shuffleboard players in Michigan and Indiana.

I always knew my dad was an auctioneer, but after all these years, I drive to Texas to learn about my dad starting the calcutta's in Michigan and Indiana back in the mid-60's back and that it was Billy Mays who gave him the idea! My dad Harold "Bud" Visel, born on May 29, 1922 passed away on October 2, 1999. If only my dad were still alive today so that I could talk to him more about his experiences in those early calcutta auctions!

Life is so funny. I had to come all the way from Michigan to Austin (where I first say Billy Mays at Taz Country) and then Michigan to Houston (to the Houston Holiday Open) to find out that my own dad was instrumental in making popular the shuffleboard calcutta sponsor sales that I enjoy so much today! Many thanks to Jim Long and Billy Mays for sharing with me all the stories about my dad and his shuffleboard play in our chats during the HHO 2000 tournament. It means alot to me to learn this history!




