

2001 WCTTM Tourney A Success Westland

The first annual Pro World Championship Singles and Doubles took place April 18-22 at the Sands Regency Casino Hotel in Reno, Nevada. Nearly every top rated player was on hand, providing five days of intense and exciting competition. One of the highlights for everyone in



attendance was the boards. Having had another six months to cure since they were used at the NASC[™] last fall, the boards played exceptionally well. In fact the consensus was that they played significantly better than they did in the fall.

Being that the dates for the 2001 WCT[™] were announced only six months prior to the event, we were not sure what kind of response the tournament would get. As it turns out, the event went very well. Both events were close to full and we are confident that the 2002 event will be even

better. The dates for the 2002 WCT[™] are April 2-7, 2002. [Editors Comment: We were disappointed when John reported to us that he wasn't able to acquire a date from the Sands Regency that did not conflict with our already contracted and scheduled The Board Talk tournament being

held in Las Vegas on March 27-31, 2002 at the Plaza Hotel, but he said that he has to take whatever dates the Sands Regency will confirm for him ... that he would have preferred if he could have gotten a date at least 3-4 weeks after The Board Talk tournament, but was not able to do so. News and Views from The World of Shuffleboard



Play Continued Despite Tornado -- Reports Glen!

I've just come home from the Memorial Day tournament held at the Full House in Wynnewood, Oklahoma. Bill Melton was the winner and Champ of Singles. My little brother, Dave Davidson, took second. I won't go into reporting all the winners since that will be reported by the action reporter, but I do want to share a little about my *tourney journey*.

The tournament director and bracketeer did a great job and finished in time -- despite a tornado whipping around just above our heads and making a hole in the roof above the bar area. As the tornado was roaring through our area (reportedly over 200 M.P.H. winds above our heads), we lost all electric power just as the Singles event was winding down on Sunday with only the toughest left playing -- Bill Melton and Ken Stork were at 6 to 5 (Bill's favor) and Dave Davidson were at 8 to 9 (Dave's favor.) The winds tore sheet iron from the roof of the building across the street and whirled it over the Full House and wrapped the high lines like a football player getting his ankle wrapped. Sterla "Starr" Kinard (owner/manager) and her crew were trying to hold the door shut and stop the water pouring in through the hole in the roof above the bar. Those of us left in the shuffleboard area were picking our spots under the shuffleboards for cover and protection. As all of us were inside finding cover, Pat Gainey was outside asleep in Harvey Walden's 5th wheel trailer (and never even knew a tornado was roaring!). Harvey's and my brother's 5th wheel were damaged and my motor home parked outside received some minor damage to the front area. The town of Wynnewood was hit pretty hard, as were other surrounding areas of Oklahoma... many losing power for days. All the others seemed worried, but Harvey and Dave said it pays to always be ready, it can happen even to us good guys. So, as history of the game keeps rolling along, this should add another first to the "Tornado Wind Down Finals" or the "Sheet Metal Finals" or the "Whirl Wind Finish." Ron Gamble hooked up the motor home generator to provide power on Monday

to the Full House (after players such as Pelton & Walden had to finish out games by candlelight on Sunday)! After observing all the damage around us, it looks like the Full House was the safest place to be when this tornado roared through. *[Editors Comment: When Bill Melton called us after returning home from the tournament, he also said: "Well Lynda, I guess it shows that the safest place to be during a tornado is where there is a shuffleboard!"]*

Pat (deceased) and Don Kinard (owners of the Full House) were inducted into the Oklahoma State Hall of Fame. These two were married for 45 years and owners of the Full House since 1987. Pat Kinard hosted their first tournament on Labor Day 1988. With the help of her good friend, Berlin Courtney, league play was started. As the years passed and the tournaments grew, she purchased and expanded to four boards and purchased the building next door. At this time, there are seven boards and the Labor Day tournament will be the "Pat Kinard Memorial Tournament" and the Memorial Day tournament will be the "Berlin Courtney Memorial Tournament" from this day forward. To honor these two on the Labor Day and Memorial Day tournaments is only fitting, as Berlin was instrumental in getting Pat to start it all back in 1988 -- they were a great team, no doubt!

The induction ceremony went well. Starr Kinard (Pat's daughter) gave a moving testimonial about "mom" and "dad" and Pat's brother introduced all the children and grandchildren - a very moving experience for all. They are the first man/woman team to be inducted and just happened to be married with five children. As the pictures of their life flickered by on the video with George Jones singing in the background "Walk Through This World With Me," tears and lumps in the throat came to even the toughest of the old and young alike. As the ceremony came to an end, Don Kinard accepted the Oklahoma Hall of Fame award honor for both he and his deceased wife. This honor was awarded not only for their dedication to the game for many years, but also for hosting the longest running tournament in the history of Oklahoma table shuffleboard -- for 15 years! "Rest well 'Our Fair Lady' ... you will never be forgotten!"

Wilber Responds to Elliff & Ingram on May Issue's ''Ratings'' & ''Raters'' Comments!

THE RATING SYSTEM: (Response to Art Elliff, May 2001 Issue, Page 2)... I can understand where Art Elliff of Oregon is coming from regarding the rating categories being somewhat confusing. Referring to the 2001 Bowers Rating Booklet: Example 1 -- Johnny Ballard is a '-1' (0.71) and Pat Bayless is a '0' (0.14). Pat would have to become a (0.51) to become a '-1' rated player. Example 2 --James Griffin at 1.60 is a '2' and Cass Grubbs at a 1.46 is a '1'. Griffin would have to be rated less than 1.50 to become a '1'. Is it confusing? You bet it is! However, we cannot blame the Bowers, as they inherited the existent categories when they established the Bowers Rating System (as Tom & Lynda French, The Board Talk Editors, already explained and responded to Art Elliff in the May Issue).

Several years ago, I worked super hard to develop a rating system. It was important for me to consult players like Bill Melton, Sam Summers, Don Valk, Larry Creakbaum, David Williams, Karl Spickelmier, Jim Long, John McDermott, Mickey Mickens (since deceased), Jim Yank and others. Mine would have been to establish categories like: AA - A - B - C - D, but it never materialized because by then the Bowers Rating System had been introduced and was being well accepted and used by The World of Shuffleboard.

THE RATERS: (Response to Glen Ingram, May 2001 Issue, Page 31)... My good friend, Glen Ingram from Indiana, and I enjoy being on opposite sides of an issue at times. Our last spirited discussion was over whether an opponent could use the other's weights. Now, he raises the issue of whether only those who are at least a '1' should qualify as raters, eliminating us "dummies" who are designated raters and personally rated less than a '1'. I challenge Glen regarding my abilities to be a competent rater as a '2' rated player, as I feel I can be every bit as intelligent in rating players as he can with a '0' rating. Big league managers such as Tom Lasorda, Earl Weaver and Sparky Anderson couldn't play the game worth a lick, but became very successful and expert managers. Bobby Knight, Indiana's own ex-Indiana coach, sat on the bench for four years at Ohio State (the Williams brothers in Texas have him now.) So, what I am

saying is that skill on the boards does not necessarily mean skill in observing and rating players.

If such a rule were to go into effect, the roster of truly dedicated raters in Michigan would be wiped out, with exception of one, and would probably impact negatively on other states as well. Let's face it, the high-ranked players do not typically spend nearly as much time watching, evaluating, and rating shufflers in all categories as much as the lower-rated players do. The higher rated players tend to watch each other more frequently than they watch the lower-rated players who make up a large majority of our World of Shuffleboard.

PS: Just received our June 2001 Issue (another great one!). We have one question regarding Page 13, Photo #4: How can four "squareheads" sit around a "round" table? -- George Wilber, MI

McDermott Shares Some History "About those Ratings"

There has been some discussion in the previous few issues of The Board Talk concerning the Bowers Ratings, how they were started and the reason for the -1 through 5 numerical ratings. We would like to shed some light on that subject.

The ratings were actually begun in 1989 by The Shuffleboard Federation. At that time, our primary activity was running tournaments. The ratings were developed in an effort to bring more amateurs into the sport by giving them a chance to play against players of similar skill levels. We were also very big into six person team events and were looking for a way to even up the teams. It was our belief that if shuffleboard were to have any chance to grow, a viable handicap system was a must. We felt that the tournaments would be larger in terms of the number of participants and that having more teams with a chance to win would boost the prize money through bigger sponsor sales.

"His Word is his bond. His greeting is always with a smile, friendly and sincere. He is the epitome of a great human being. He gives true meaning to sportsmanship and friendship through competition." (words above on Russ' Pacific NW Shuffleboard Hall of Fame plaques)

The above words were engraved on a plaque presented to Russ on May 26th and again to his wife Sue, in memoriam, on June 9th at the Season Ticket and Old Edison Inn, respectively. There are no better words to describe Russ more concisely, as those that knew him all agree. There were two ceremonies for Russ into the Pacific NW SHOF to allow as many as possible of his continent-wide shuffleboard family to honor him in Spokane, plus his multitude of friends and relatives on his home turf in Skagit County where he was born.

Russ was born in 1941, in a farmhouse, in



Utopia, Washington (East Skagit County.) His parents, Clyde and Hazel Siddens moved the family to San Diego where Russ graduated from Jr. High School as an Honor Student. He later graduated from High School back in Washington at Mt. Vernon. Russ was first introduced to shuffleboard in 1960 by his brother Neil, and his friend Wes Warner from Kansas City - at a time when games were played to 21 points and "keep hammer." He started off playing freehand. A fellow player named Lesley told him "you're a natural," and that was all it took for him to become hooked on the game. In 1963, Russ was back in Washington. While tending bar at the Silver Dollar, he convinced owner Dave Archer to have a league team, the team did well and ... as happens so often in this game, Dave Archer was hooked!! It was Dave who gave Russ Miller the name we all learned to know and love him by - THE COLONEL.

In 1964, Russ met the woman of his dreams, the woman he would spend the rest of his life with -Miss Sheridan (Sue) Shadduck. They married and together raised three children: Russell, Rebecca and Sherry. Russ managed to work at oil refineries, did some commercial fishing (lots of good fishing stories!), went to school to be a locksmith and have his own welding business for awhile, raise his family, and still had time to commit to his love, compassion, knowledge of the true meaning of the phrase "friendship through competition", to us, his "extended family" ... and for that we are richer people! "The Colonel" was one of the best Ambassadors of Shuffleboard and will be greatly missed by all! McDermott Shares... (Continued From Page 17)

One of the biggest hurdles was that shuffleboard is an enormously difficult game to handicap. Bowling, darts, and golf, to name but a few, can simply use an average score. In shuffleboard, you would have to take into consideration things like points scored with and without the hammer. In doubles competition, a person could win all night and never score a point.

The original concept of the -1 through 5 was that your rating would be the score you would start at. In other words, if a 2 was playing a 4, the 2 rated player would ring up two points at the beginning of the game and the 4 rated player would ring up four points. Players rated -1 actually had to score one point to get back to zero, meaning that they had to score sixteen points to win.

The first ever handicapped team event took place in 1989 at a Holiday Inn in Arlington Texas. This was actually David Williams' Presidents Dav tournament, which had outgrown the Corporate Image Lounge where the tournament had been held for the previous several years. This was a memorable event for more than one reason. The truck driver who was bringing the boards from American Shuffleboard Company took a detour through New Orleans and went on a three day drunk. The boards, which were supposed to be delivered on Monday, did not show up until Thursday, which is the day the tournament was supposed to start. After two days of the police from every state between New Jersey and Texas looking for the shuffleboard truck in vain, we were in a fullblown panic.

Fortunately, Bill Melton came to the rescue. He rounded up four boards from Oklahoma, delivered them to the hotel, and then went to Fort Worth to pick up the boards from the Corporate Image. By the time the truck showed up, the tournament has just started. We accepted the delivery of the six sets of weights and told him to take the boards back to New Jersey.

Anyway, back to the point. The ratings were initially based on tournament performance. As a

starting point, we recorded the top finishers in every tournament that was in The Board Talk from 1986 through 1989. That effort started us off with almost 400 players. When an unrated player wanted to enter one of our tournaments, we called players that we knew we could trust from that part of the country to get their opinions and assigned an initial rating. Having run almost 40 tournaments between 1987 and 1992, the list of players quickly ballooned to nearly 700.

By 1992 we were heavily involved in the wax and supply business and had made a decision to keep the tournament in Reno and drop the rest. By that time however, other tournaments were starting to use the ratings and it would have been a big setback for shuffleboard had the ratings been allowed to die. Fortunately, Ron Bowers approached us about continuing on with the concept and actually forming a committee to rate the players. This sounded great to us. We gave them the ratings of the players we had as a starting point and the rest is history. Ron and Debbie have taken the process beyond where we could have and the entire game has benefited from their efforts.

It does, unfortunately, get confusing when players start to talk about a higher rated player. Does that mean one with more skill or a lower rated player, who has a higher number. Maybe the time has come to rethink this subject.

Eddie had arranged things this way because he was familiar with both Lil and the Kids play; however, Shelli had never gone up against the Kid, and would have had to waist some valuable time getting used to his style of play. After the Calcutta was over for the main Tournament. which would be played the next day, the coin toss for the money series was made. Eddie called Heads, and he was correct. Most of the players and spectators which weren't immediately involved in the A/B draw were now moving over to the other side of the bar so they could catch all of the "match game" action. There were also a bunch of "side bets" made and a lot of commotion going on. This all simmered down when the Texas Kid made his first shot to begin the series. It was (as anticipated) a very deep 1 freehand shot, which stopped in the center of the table. Eddie hit and stuck on that one. The Kid stuck perfectly on his next shot. Eddie hit and slid to the

left on his next weight. He did this to avoid a possible "wrap around", as the weight was positioned just far enough back then for The Kid to try one. The Kid hitand-went on his next one, so Eddie put up a short deuce on the left rail. It was another hit-and-go on the next shot, which left the board clean for Eddies' hammer. The room was almost completely silent as Eddie sized things up for his first lag. He shot the freehand – and it ended up a deep deuce. Eddie was satisfied with that, but not with the return half of the frame. It was obvious that Shelli was going to have her hands full with Lil.

The two women had not been speaking, or even looking directly at one another as they played. The bad blood that was between them (mainly for Lil trying to ruin their wedding) was still boiling. Shellis' anger was interfering with her game - causing her to miss some shots, and even to misread some of the traps she set her up for. Lil was starting to make some snide little quiet remarks now as they played. As a result, they lost the first game by a wide margin - 15 to 10! Eddie and Shelli had a conference before the second game started. He tried to explain that her emotions were causing them to be outplayed, and outgunned. She said she'd try to correct things. The second game was better than the first...but they still lost it - 15 to 13. This was it now. If they lost ANY of the remaining three games it was all over! Eddie was really getting steamed now. Duncan, Mays, and Harris Families Suffer Tragic & Unexpected Family Losses!

Lee Duncan, one of our shuffleboard extended family members and nephew to Billy Mays and Evelyn Harris, passed away on May 2, 2001 unexpectedly from a massive heart attack at the

young age of 43. He was born in Dallas, Texas on November 11, 1957 to Bob and Maxine Mays Duncan (Billy Mays' sister). Lee's death was a shock to all that knew him and is a great loss to all of his family, friends, and shuffleboard 'extended family.'

Lee started playing shuffleboard at the age of 18 and was taught the basics of the game by his uncle, Billy Mays, and was active in the USSA and other league play. He stopped playing for awhile. When he returned to the game he came back playing smart and hard and had been moved to a '1' rated player in his more recent years of play.

Lee lived with his parents, Bob and Maxine, helping care for his ill mother. Maxine was a beautician until she was diagnosed with

alzheimers disease. So, Lee and his dad had been jointly caring for Maxine at home. Lee had been mugged/robbed/injured shortly before his death and had been to the doctor with chest congestion afterwards. His chest congestion was being treated with antibiotics and they had to increase his diabetic medication. He had no known prior history of heart condition, so the fatal heart attack was a total shock to everyone.

One week after Lee's death, on May 10th, the family suffered another tragic loss -- Evelyn Harris (Billy Mays' sister) lost one of her dearest granddaughters, Shelly Ann Harris, at the early age of 28 to a car accident, leaving two small children not fully realizing that their mommie is gone to heaven now. MEMORIES OF "KID SPOOKS"

-- By Al Stewart

Kid Spooks came to California in 1949 from Patterson, New Jersey. His home board was the Stage 10 on Western Avenue in Hollywood. I didn't come up until March of 1950, so he had already played all the players that had nerve enough to play him, and convinced them that he was the world's champion. Needless to say, I didn't get to see any of his championship games.

They put out a circular from the Stage 10 that Kid Spooks was going to play the Masked Marvel Halloween Night in 1950. We all went over there and the Masked Marvel came in and got up and shot his four weights and walked down to the other end of the board. By the time he got down there, we all knew that it was Bobby Driver, and we razzed him so much that he couldn't hardly shoot. But he couldn't beat Spooks anyway.

I was over at the Dog House in Tujunga; I usually went over there on Saturday afternoons to get a few little money games, and the place was full. I went in and sat down and they were telling me that some guy came in that thought he was a shuffleboard player, and played George. This guy had lost about \$10-\$15, which was a days work in those days. He told George and everyone that he would be back Saturday afternoon with plenty of money and play them for any amount they wanted to play for. Well, I was sitting at the bar, I turned around and looked and Spooks walked in. I said "Hey Spooks, what are you doing here?" Needless to say, that ruined his set-up. He was real nice about it, but told me that next time I saw him in a bar, not to speak to him unless he spoke to me first. Spooks then suggested that this George and I play a singles game. Then Spooks would take the winner for a partner and we would play some shuffleboard. I managed to beat George so I got to play partners with Spooks all that Saturday afternoon. Needless to say, we won all the games!

The next time I saw Kid Spooks play was against Johnny Favors at Ham Bones, in Downey on Atlantic Boulevard in 1951. Spooks played Eastern Rules. That's the way he wanted to play. Eastern Rules was a hanger was 4, a 3 was a deuce and everything else was a 1. So Johnny Favors played him Western Rules at Ham Bones and beat Spooks.

After that, I never saw Spooks again. No one saw him. He just absolutely disappeared. We don't know where he went, if he went to another territory or what. He just disappeared from all the shuffleboard places around the L.A. area.

EDITOR'S COMMENT: Al, thank you so much for sharing your personal experience meeting and playing with Kid Spooks (given name: Frank Mykietyn). The TSA has been trying to acquire some history on Kid Spooks and other legacy players. We hope other shufflers with information on legacy players will send the TSA some interesting stories and photos. We did find an old newspaper where Kid Spooks apparently wrote a periodic column, but have been unable to find out what happened to him either after 1950. The following page has a scanned copy of the "Spooks Speaks" column header followed by a retyped column text (taken from "Shuffleboard World," June 1950 edition, Page 12). (Continued on Next Page)



(Below text of the "Spooks Speaks" column has been retyped below from the "Shuffleboard World," June 1950 edition, Page 12)

"IN THE course of my travels I come across new games and new twists which shuffleboard owners have been using on off nights to stimulate trade in their locations. Just as a canasta player occasionally yearns for a good old-fashioned hand of gin, so a weight-pusher occasionally likes to try something new, just for a change of pace.

Down in Baton Rouge, La., Mr. H. A. Kuhlman, owner of the "Kwitcherkickin" on Highland Road, has devised still another game to go with his new American 12-foot cushion-rebound shuffleboard. I tried it myself and found it very enjoyable.

Kuhlman places two bowling pins on the head pin spots at each end of the board. A game of "15" or "21" is then played according to the regular rules, except that players must try NOT to knock down those two pins. A player who drops a pin must place a prearranged token in the kitty, which is divided equally among the winners after the game.

To avoid arguments several additional rules are used:

(1). The pin must fall. The player who causes it to fall must, with his partner, contribute to the kitty.

(2). If the pin is skidded off the spot by a weight, then pin will remain where it is until the end of the round, after which it is returned to the original spot.

(3). Accidentally hitting the pin with your hand or sleeve, causing it to fall, also calls for a penalty.

It occurred to me as I participated in this game that it could be adapted easily to the long board. The *bocce spot* on either end would be the logical place for the pins.

Incidently, I've noticed that many owners of the new cushion boards are not aware of the numerous possibilities of interesting games which the board has. For example, few are aware that in playing double-end shuffleboard on the 12-foot tables the weight must glance off either of the side cushions before it can be considered legal. Also, use of the rebound cross member is still in the elementary stages, and players are not aware of the wonderful fun to be derived from playing one, two and three cushion shuffleboard.

I strongly suggest that players who use the 12-foot cushion rebound models reacquaint themselves with the rule books. They'll have more fun than a barrel of monkeys in a snowstorm."

EDITOR COMMENT: After reading AI Stewart's recollections of Kid Spooks (page 36 of this issue), we searched the internet for information on Kid Spooks. At http://ssdi.genealogy.rootsweb.com, we found a Frank S. Mykietyn, born Sep 17, 1920; Died May 18, 1969 at age 48; last known address zip 90650, Norwalk County, L.A., CA with a SSN# having been issued in New Jersey and what appears to be an older brother Walter Edward Mykietyn (same last known L.A. zip/county & same mother's maiden name - who died on Feb. 3, 1986.) Could this Frank Mykietyn be our Kid Spooks? From N.J. to L.A.-- just as Al Stewart recalls ??! If so, we think we found 3 children there too! Thanks again to Al Stewart!
