The Greater Dallas Shuffleboard Association (GDSA) held it's 13th Annual Cancer Memorial Benefit Fall Tournament on Sept. 6-8, 2002 at Mike Blohm's "Island Club" in Dallas [Editors Comment: See "The Island Club" Shuffleboard Directory ad for location details]. This event is held each year to raise funds for cancer research and treatment at The Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders at the Children's Medical Center of Dallas. In addition, the GDSA league sets this day aside to remember those fellow players that are no longer with us.

The event is a 6-player team event, utilizing a best-of-five, double elimination format with a handicapped blind draw. Seventy-eight players from all over the Greater Dallas area turned out of this 3-day event, and were very generous with their expertise and money to help raise \$18,625 for our adopted children this year. Since joining the supporters of Children's Medical Center, this event has generated over \$75,000 donations to help children in Dallas fight this devastating disease and provide aid to their families.



### News from The Board Talk Editors/Publishers --2nd Year Anniversary....

The "Torch Was Passed" from George and Donna Wilber, Founders and prior Editors/Publishers of The Board Talk to us two years ago. December 2000 issue was our first issue. Time flies by, doesn't it? It seems like only vesterday when we were on our road trip to Lansing, Michigan to stay with George & Donna Wilber for the training and transition. We arrived on the first day of Indian Summer which was absolutely beautiful. There was alot of hard work involved and we were guite nervous about taking on this new task as Editors. But, George and Donna put us at ease and provided much encouragement to get us started and keep us going. After the training was completed and the car packed to return to Texas, we headed north for a bit (rather than immediately south) and accompanied George and Donna to a tournament at Skip's Lounge in Houghton Lake -- leaving for Texas from Houghton Lake after a wonderful weekend. The players at this tournament also gave us a jump start and some confidence to get back to Texas and be able to put out our first The Board Talk issue -- December 2000 issue.

After our return to Texas, we had so many letters and phone calls from many of you to welcome us and offer help and support to us for this new challenge.

**HISTORY OF TRANSITION:** (See July & August 2000 issues, page 6 and November 2000 issue, page 1) George and Donna Wilber announced to the shuffleboard community that they were ready to retire and made some contacts in an effort to find interested parties to take over The Board Talk. Over a few months, they acquired at least 5 interested parties and sent each interested party the same stats and financial history data to help interested parties make decisions. However, when they had not yet received any solid offers, they sent a letter to the 5 interested parties stating that if they did not receive a workable offer by June 30, 2000, that they would have to close up shop effective


September 1, 2000 and refund any unused subscriber and advertiser fees.

The interested parties at the time were: Houston Texas cartel (grin - Jack Scott, Don Meehan, et al); Mike and Susie Halstead of Kentucky; The Shuffleboard Federation via John McDermott; Champion Shuffleboard via Kelye Stites; and Tom and Lynda French. Before it was announced that The Board Talk may be closing shop effective September 1, 2000... Tom and I had been in frequent communication with Mike and Susie Halstead to see if there was some way we could team up and jointly make an offer and keep the publication alive. We also had some discussions with the Houston group. The biggest obstacle was we all lived in different geographic areas and not one of us individually could take on both the financial and work responsibilities or liabilities involved to make it workable.


The publication was founded in 1984 by George and Donna Wilber and they are, no doubt, the "Guardian Angels" of shuffleboard for working tirelessly from 1984 through November 2000 keeping the shuffleboard communication channel (and resultantly, our sport) alive for that many years without any personal financial gain and there were very few years that they did not have to contribute monies from their own pockets to keep the publication alive. From the financial statements received by all interested parties, the least they had personally lost in any one year was just over \$1,000 and one year was over \$5,000! They never had funds to pay themselves a dime for all their dedicated hard work and efforts. There is little difference today from what it was from 1984-2000 from a financial perspective anyway. How can we change that and keep our publication alive for many years to come? The print costs and a 2nd postal increase recently just since we took over as Editors two years ago makes it quite difficult. We must increase rates on March 1, 2003 (last increase was \$5 on March 1, 2001.) So, we welcome and solicit suggestions from our subscribers, advertisers and supporters.

Towards the end of June 2000, Kelye Stites of Champion started making contact with some of the other interested parties that he knew (Kelye did not know us at that time) to see if any offers were in process and/or if the other vendor

The "2nd Annual The Board Talk Open 2003" will be held again at the Plaza Hotel/Casino, One Main Street, Las Vegas, Nevada on Feb. 23 - Mar. 2, 2003 - jointly sponsored by Champion Shuffleboard and The Board Talk. Last year we had 217 registered participants and anticipate a larger attendance in 2003 - events planned to be played on 30 boards this second year (unless pre-reg indicates we need fewer). Pre-registration is very important to our planning because we must transport boards from Texas to Nevada for the tournament - if the majority of the participants preregister, we will have a better idea of how many boards we really need to transport and whether we will need a second pup truck or not.

Some of the suggestions received from the first year tournament have been implemented and addressed in the format for this second year: 1) Multiple Requests for 4-Person team events (added two division event); 2) Allow more time between the 6-Person team event and the next event; 3) Allow 2 out of 3 play for Division I: Singles and Bring Partner (winner bracket only for 2003); and 4) Start sponsor sales the afternoon before the Singles and Bring Partner events so that play can start more timely on the actual day of these two events (Page 2 of the inserted flyer describes the sponsor sale on these events starting the afternoon before the actual events start - we hope the majority of the registered participants will make a special effort to check-in and participate in the afternoon sponsor sale - the fewer sponsor sales that we have to do on the actual day of the events, the sooner we get to start play). This way on the actual day of Singles and Bring Partner events, the only sponsor sales we will have to do are new registrations (if slots available) and late arrivals (e.g., those pre-registered participants whose flights did not arrive in time to participate in the prior afternoon sponsor sales). Again, another reason pre-registrations will be most helpful to our planning and execution of the sponsor sales.

We wish to thank all the tournament sponsors from last year who contributed monies and/or supplies and/or raffle items. We are seeking sponsors for this second year tournament at this time. Please contact us if you can be a sponsor (See Page 34, Column 2 of this issue for the various levels of sponsorships - we will advertise your sponsorship each month in the publication and during the tournament with a banner provided by you and/or we will provide a sponsor recognition award certificate for display during the tourney). 

wished to team up with him to keep the publication alive if all else failed. He found no possible solutions through his initial inquiries. Finally, he made contact with Ron Bowers to see if Ron knew anyone who might team up with him if none of the other interested parties were able to individually or jointly make an acceptable offer to George and Donna Wilber before June 30, 2000. Ron Bowers suggested to Kelve that he contact us, as Ron knew we were already on the interested party list, but knew we could not afford to do it alone (especially with me (Lynda) just retiring from IBM in February 2000.) My IBM retirement pay net was less than 25% of my active pay and our cost of raising 3 grandchildren, we obviously had no funds to spare to pay George and Donna even the menial amount they were asking for their many years of dedicated work. We would NOT have done the work on The Board Talk or any other such publication without George and Donna being compensated for their many years of sacrifice to the shuffleboard world.

So, when Kelye made contact with us and offered to put up the money (if we put up the time to do the work) with the idea that "IF" The Board Talk ever made any profit it would be split 50/50 (which there is no reason to count on this happening if that could not be achieved from 1984-2000, but we accepted because we love the sport and knew that the communication channel was essential to keep our sport alive.) Since The Board Talk could not provide any pay to us, Kelye offered me (Lynda) a job updating their company website which needed many updates, continuing ongoing maintenance on the website, answering customers email inquiries and responding to internet sells, etc. When Champion Shuffleboard purchased Sun-Glo Corp so that it's prior owners could retire, we also helped for six months to get the phone sells and order entry channel working. The job pays very little (net only \$1,129/mo) ... it helps, but certainly does not compensate for the unrelated many many Board Talk hours spent doing the daily bookkeeping and monthly publication. We have worked very hard (with much help from all of you) to figure a way to financially keep The Board Talk alive for many years to come. We feel that the publication provides the communication channel essential to keeping our sport alive. With 3,083 rated players in 2002 and thousands of unrated and league players throughout the US and Canada, our subscriber base is still under 800. Our advertising has had minimal increase and we have not been able to get any major non-shuffleboard advertisers (such as the many contacts we've made with breweries, etc.).

So, our next effort was to try to start a *true* The Board Talk tournament which after a couple years if it could break even, and then perhaps get near the 'black' by year 3, that any potential profits in later years could help keep the publication alive... since the subscribers and advertisers alone is likely insufficient to meet that goal. We presented this concept to Champion Shuffleboard and they agreed to sponsor us for at least 2-3 years on a tournament to give us yet another opportunity to keep our sport and The Board Talk communication channel alive... an upfront costly agreement.

The 1st year tournament (which everyone knows that to start a new tournament typically takes at least 5 years to get over the break even point) cost Champion significant unrecovered sponsorship \$\$ (hopefully the Feb. 2003 tourney will get closer to the 'black' and that 2004 will hopefully get even closer). We had a wonderful turnout for our 1st tournament (217 players) and anticipate a larger turnout for the 2003 tournament. However, there are many startup costs (especially 1st year) and continuing fixed costs associated with running the tournament. For instance, Champion donates the use of the boards, but transport/load/ unload/setup costs for 30+ boards from TX to NV and setup staff are costly items. So, any ideas to help with our efforts for the publication or tournament would be greatly appreciated. Should we go to bi-monthly, quarterly, or ??? Should we limit the content? Should advertising rates be increased? How do we get more subscribers and advertisers and tournament sponsors? Most publications have sufficient advertising income to support the printing/mailing/operating cost without having to depend so much upon their subscriber base to financially be able to put out a publication. Inflation and the rising costs of printing/mailing is a permanent factor to deal with and an obstacle that will never disappear. We have to figure a way, but we cannot do it alone. This is why we desperately need your input and suggestions. Our number of rated players has been increasing each year (which is a positive sign that our sport continues to grow). However, eventhough the subscriber and advertising in The Board Talk has increased slightly, unfortunately it's not at that same rate. Please continue to promote The Board Talk at every opportunity and let folks know about the publication and tournament. We need much help in getting the subscriber and advertiser base increased in order to keep the publication alive and growing.

Vendors and Tournament Directors benefit greatly from having The Board Talk communication channel too. Imagine if we had to go back to the old way of sending hundreds of flyers across the country to announce a tournament or to spread the word about our products? Email and personal addresses change frequently and it is near impossible to maintain a current contact list without having The Board Talk to keep in touch and provide us with current contact information to spread the word about our sport and upcoming events. Shuffleboard establishments come and go. Shuffleboards come and go within establishments. To keep up with inflation, some establishments have replaced their shuffleboards with eight liners or other items to bring in more money to their businesses. Without our vendors and establishments and tournament directors providing for and supporting our game, we have no game. We all have to pull together and support each other (throw out any disputes and make amends) to ensure our wonderful sport continues. Let's make a 2003 New Years' resolution to jointly make it our Best Year Yet! Happy Holidays and Happy Shuffling! With Love, -- Tom & Lynda French, Editors








Draw Partner 1st Place (L-R): Mary Brown & Terry Dowell



**Doubles** 1st Place (L-R): Jim Long & Glen Ingram











## In Fond Memory of John Austin... ''Ninety-Four & Young at Heart''

*1907 - October 12, 2002* In Memoriam John Austin 1907 – 2002 By Kathi Lloyd

On October 12, 2002 John Austin passed away at home with his family at his bedside after slipping into a coma earlier in the day. The memorial service was held on the 17<sup>th</sup> and many in the Denver shuffleboard community attended to bid a fond farewell to a friend and fellow shuffleboard player.

At ninety-four John Austin was as young at heart and full of life as anyone I have ever known of any age. There are few we meet in life with an inner spirit so innately happy, good and genuine that you cannot help but smile each and every time you see them. No matter what else might have been going on in my life when I talked to John he somehow made me relax and just enjoy the moment. He didn't have to say, "Gee, it's great to be alive today!" Everything he did whether playing shuffleboard, just sitting at the bar having a vodka and 7-up or betting the dog races said it for him. That's what I'll remember most about John.

John may not have been the best shuffleboard player, but he was unsurpassed when it came to good sportsmanship and the sheer joy and exuberance of just playing the game. The last tournament he played in was in February when the Colorado Table Shuffleboard Hall of Fame honored him with its Special Achievement Award for being such a great ambassador of the game at such an advanced age. It was only fitting that he and his partner Kevin Kelly took First Place. [See the May 2002 issue of The Board Talk, page 38] His daughter Leslie told me he had the award on the table next to his bed when he died.

John Austin will be long and lovingly remembered by his many friends at the Rear Inn Lounge and Balloon Inn.


Sponsor sales were held prior to the Saturday draw and the Sunday bring partner events.





September 6-8, 2002 Riverside Tavern, Keesville, New York Report & Photos By: Pete Cummings, NY







Draw Partner (Fri.) 1st Place (L-R): Johnny Gardner (DE) & Jane Johnson (NY)




