







In Fond Memory of... Kenny Van Zile Passed Away On: December 22, 2001

Kenny Van Zile passed away on December 22, 2001. A service was held in Oxford, New York and burial was in New Jersev.

I was saddened to hear of the death of Kenny Van Zile a few weeks ago. Kenny was a dear friend, an excellent partner and a fine human being.

A little over a year ago, Kenny found out he had cancer. The way he handled the news was pure Kenny--he did not blink, he just kept doing the things he always did like playing shuffleboard and being around his friends. In fact, Kenny and his brother Earl played a week before he died. Nothing seemed to slow him down. A month ago, he also played with his son Kenny JR. at the Dew Drop Inn in Waterloo, New York, where they finished third.


Everyone liked Kenny because he was very competitive and fun to be with. If you had him as a partner you were lucky because he played to win. One of his trademarks was making a tough combination shot and then letting out with a big E-E-E-E--that was Kenny and we all loved him for it. It may not be a bad idea after you make a combo shot to yell E-E-E just to honor Kenny for his love of the game and his enthusiasm to win.

Kenny died at the age of 68. For about the last twenty years he has told me how difficult it becomes as you get older to play this game. Wait until you hit the 50 mark or the double nickel you will see what I mean. Kenny was saying the one player he feared most was Father Time for he would gradually rob you of you skills and force you to compensate by being a smarter player.

North Jersey was where Kenny learned to play shuffleboard. The boards he played on were long and slow so you needed to shoot hard and fast and outhit your opponent because they would not switch hammers and still played 3,2,1. Anyone who watched him play, could see that he had a fast accurate shot. That is how he survived on slow boards. When he retired to New York State ten years ago, he saw faster shorter boards that had speed wax that he had not encountered before. On top of that, he saw players come with their own sets of weights so they could choose which weights held the table best. At first he balked at this, but he eventually purchased his own set because it helped his game. His weights were very unusual in that he inserted a small facial picture of each member of his family on a given weight, in this way ,his family was always with him.

If there is a shuffleboard heaven, we know Kenny is up there yelling E-E-E with a big smile on his face. For all of us who knew you well thanks for being such a good friend--- we will miss you but will never forget you. E-E-E





After the intermediate class I had a better idea of when to throw a short weight, when to throw a weight off and I also learned that the score dictates everything. I think all of these factors made helped me to have some success in my first tournament.
