

The Board Talk Open 2002 Tourney - Answers & Reminders!

Pre-Registration: February 14, 2002 is the deadline to pre-register at the discounted rates and February 27, 2002 is the hotel deadline for tourney rate. Thanks to those that have already Pre-Registered! Pre-Registration saves \$5 per event and \$5 on the one-registration fee, ensures your event slots, and helps the Tourney Staff by not having to spend alot of tournament time registering players late in the cycle and/or at the tournament.

Rating Entry Criteria: Bowers 2001 Ratings are being used due to the 2002 ratings not being available in time to team up and submit Pre-Registration for the events. NOTE: The whole number rating is being used for entry criteria, not the decimal rating. For example, two players rated a .96 and 2.15 would be a '1' and '2' respectively (adds to '3'). However, the Team Captains for the 6-Person Team Event (for example) and all participants in the Sponsor Sales will be provided a sheet that indicates both the whole number and decimal number ratings of all players. Therefore, when preparing your Pre-Registration Form, please indicate both the whole number and decimal number rating eventhough only the whole number rating is used to determine your event qualification criteria. Unrated players should contact us a.s.a.p. and before submitting your registration form.

The flyer format has been changed to reflect the Pro Singles as 2/3 in both the winner and loser bracket (if time allows).

Sponsor Shirts & Jackets (both are blue denim with embroidered logo on back and can embroider name over front pocket): Please notice that there is a place on the registration form to pre-order your sponsor shirt or jacket. We do not plan to have these for purchase at the tournament only customized for those that pre-order the denim sponsor shirts and jackets. Players will be able to order shirts or jackets during the tournament to be mailed after the tournament, but for players that wish to wear these items during the tournament, they will need to pre-order. As of December 14, 2001 none of the pre-pre-registration submissions have included an order for a denim sponsor shirt or denim jacket, so we wanted to be sure that all are aware they can put all or partial payment for these sponsor shirts/jackets on the pre-registration form.






