





family. It was a grand event, cherished by all. There were at least 80+ attendees at Steve's induction ceremony.







# Fellow Shuffler (Troy Thornton) Asks For Our Help In Cancer & Medical Research...

To begin with I would like to introduce myself to those in the shuffleboard community that may not know me. My name is Troy Thornton. I have lived here in Houston, Texas for 17 years. For 13 of those I have been working with computers at Grocers Supply. I install and support software and do some programming. With my free time I am trying to get back into shuffleboard. Since the age of seven my life has been ruled by post traumatic epilepsy. Because of this condition I have been taking various medications - dilantin, phenobarbital, tegretol, neurontin, topamax and carbatrol.

July 3rd of last year a vagus nerve stimulator was implanted to help with the seizures. At that time I was taking 600mg of topamax and 1500mg of carbatrol daily. As of November the topamax has been eliminated. Carbatrol is being gradually decreased and I should be off of it by next March. The stimulator has been a tremendous support in my life.

Unfortunately, the stimulator is not a cure for epilepsy. Neither is there a cure for cancer. To cancer I have lost my grandparents, my father and six months ago my wife Julie. Julie and dad each had melanoma skin cancer. Their tumors were excised followed by surgery to remove lymphnodes. Dad's cancer spread to his brain five years later. Julie's cancer metastasized to her liver in only one year. They each died only a few months after the cancer reappeared.

Julie was the one true love of my life and nothing can bring her back. However, I do wish to thank MD Anderson and Grocers Supply for all the efforts made to help her, myself and our family. MD Anderson does more than try and treat disease - they treat people and I commend them for it.

Grocers Supply is more than a job. GSC is filled with a sense of concern for others. This strengthens the community that is Houston. I also wish to thank the shuffleboard community for their support during Julie's illness and since then.

But I wish to do more than say thank you. I wish to promote a new idea. The use of home and business computers to help medical research. I said a new idea but I have learned that it is already in practice. In fact, results began appearing in the first 24 days.

The project I am speaking of is being done to link specific proteins to childhood leukemia. The computer company Intel began a philanthropic project with the American Cancer Society, the National Foundation for Cancer Research, Oxford University and United Devices out of Austin. This began in April of last year. Currently one million people are helping make this happen. The problem is that only one million people are helping make this happen. Most personal computers sit at a desk and spend the majority of time doing nothing. This is a resource which should be realized for its potential. Everyone has a family member or friend which has been affected by cancer. Everyone that has heard about this new way of helping medical research has wanted to be a part of it. Promoting this so that it becomes as common as a computer is what is needed. The program operates like a screensaver. It uses the available resources of your computer. It does not slow down your computer system because it only accesses available resources not in use.

# Russell Girdler of Anchorage Alaska "Good will comes easy for Alaskan"

(and Reflects Well On Shuffleboard Player's Honesty & Integrity)

[Excerpt follows: "Like many cities, Peoria spends a lot of money and time on self-marketing.

But sometimes the best civic promotion comes from natives who act as good-will ambassadors for their hometown.

You've likely never heard of Russell Girdler. But, there's a fellow in Alaska who has a great reason - actually 60,000 of them - to be thankful that Girdler grew up in Peoria.

"I was raised to respect one another," says Girdler, 41, who grew up in the blue-collar Averyville neighborhood on Peoria's North Side.

"Everyone in the neighborhood was elderly. Though I held three newspaper routes throughout my younger years, I was expected to shovel all the neighbors' walks when we had snow. I wouldn't dare ask for a penny in return.

"My mother would cook large quantities of food. Me and my two brothers would deliver it to neighbors.

"My parents instilled such ways in me."

Girdler now lives in Anchorage, Alaska, where he works for a firm that rents construction equipment. Days after a recent car wreck, Girdler had to go to a hospital, Health South, for follow-up tests.

He went to find a restroom. As he walked in, he helped a guy in a wheelchair exit through the tricky doorway.

Inside the empty room, a jacket was hanging from a stall for people with disabilities. He figured the jacket belonged to the guy in the wheelchair.

Girdler felt through the jacket in search of identification, just to make sure he'd return it to the right person. He felt the right pocket and detected a huge lump. He reached in and pulled out a wad of \$100 bills thicker than his fist. Another pocket stored a similar stash.

"I stood in this restroom holding more hundred dollar bills than I have ever seen before, let alone have in my possession," he says. He admits that he thought of dashing out with the booty.

"I stood for a few minutes," he says. "Finally, my upbringing kicked in."

He stuffed the cash back into the pockets and headed outside, looking for the guy in the wheelchair. But before he got far, a man ran up to him.

"Oh!" he blurted. "You've found my jacket!"

He nervously said he'd flown in from Kodiak, a twohour flight away. In Anchorage, he planned to buy a commercial vehicle - though he didn't explain why he'd come to the hospital or carry so much cash.

Girdler said he'd need to see some ID. He suggested the two go to the reception area so a hospital employee could witness the transaction.

Before the receptionist, the man pulled out a photo ID from the jacket. The picture, of Don Davenport of Kodiak, matched the gent standing before Girdler. Satisfied, Girdler handed over the jacket.

Davenport mentioned that the jacket held \$60,000. He said thanks and ambled out.


The receptionist looked stunned, as much over the cash as Girdler's honesty.

"Other people probably would have taken it," says the receptionist, who didn't want his name in print. "It's amazing, that's for sure."

To that, Girdler says, "I was the true lucky person- to have had a mother and father that raised in a good way."

Every year, Girdler comes back to Peoria to see kin. He always stops at Springdale Cemetery to visit his parents.

"Now when I stop and see Mom and Dad, I cry with tears of love about the values that they instilled in me," he says. "

## "Gentleman George Ostrom"

[Excerpt]: Much of the time, a top shuffleboard player's toughest opponents are booze and sleeplessness. This demanding and beautiful late-night game, in which players hand-slide chrome weights along a length of polished wood sprinkled with slick dust, has inhabited smoky barrooms from Pennsylvania to Oklahoma to Oregon since the 1930s. But it has never quite gotten its due. Certainly, pool outranks it in the popular imagination, thanks to movie heroes like Fast Eddie Felsen and Minnesota Fats. But for pure renegade energy and outlaw defiance, shuffleboard players are hard to beat. Like cowboys, bikers and bank robbers, they go their own way. Always have. Always will.

George Ostrum has played shuffleboard at the highest level -- which is to say, on the hustle and for tournament stakes -- for more than two decades. What's more, he has inspired in scores of new players an appreciation and a love for a game that has always lived in the shadows. So on Saturday, when Ostrum ("Gentleman George" to his friends) became the second player inducted into the Colorado chapter of the Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, the tribe was uncommonly happy. The scene was Arvada's Balloon Inn, a local shuffleboard mecca, on night two of the second annual Bill English Memorial Open Doubles Tournament. The ceremony was a surprise, attended by top U.S. players from ten states.

"I had no idea," said the slim, silver-haired former basketball player. "It meant a helluva lot to me. Mostly, it meant I had the respect of my peers. I've played this game for forty years, and I can still play with anybody. But this is the greatest moment of my life."

At age sixty, Ostrum is grateful to have a life. He has spent much of the last three years in hospitals and on crutches, and for a spell he vanished into Denver's mean streets. It was a steep fall for a guy who had played on Colorado State's NIT-invited basketball teams of 1960 and 1961 and who was once -- for a couple of weeks, anyway -- a member of the Denver Rockets of the old American Basketball Association. Luckily, loyal friends in the shuffleboard fraternity pulled Gentleman George back from the brink. His life and his game are now on the mend.

"He taught me how to play and how to win," said his current doubles partner, a world-class daredevil named Rick Boyer. "I been winnin' ever since." But that first lesson was expensive. The night in 1978 when Boyer met first met and played against Ostrum, in Denver's Candlelight Lounge, Gentleman George took him for a cool \$260.

The day will come, said Shuffleboard Hall of Fame founder Glen Davidson, when Ostrum will join legendary road hustlers like Bob Miles, Porter White and Granville Humphrey in the national chapter: "He was a trailblazer, a pioneer. George is still a great player. Even though he likes to party. Like the rest of us. In bars."

After three nights and two days at the Balloon Inn, a shuffleboard marathon awash in beer and whiskey and interrupted only by catnaps, cigarettes and the occasional slice of cold pizza, Ostrum and Boyer finished third among the tournament's sixteen teams. "I love George," one opponent allowed, "but I still wanna kick his ass every night of the week." [End of Excerpt]
