Winston 2003 Hitt Shines in Open Events &

Bingham Olson Shines in B Events

Labor Day Weekend 2003 99 Tavern & Willee's Cafe, Winston, Oregon Results & Photos Submitted By: Steve Fisher, Oregon

Winston, Oregon: "Winston 2003" improved in monetary terms for the fourth straight year; with \$25,300.00 total purse including \$9,075. in the Open Singles. The sixevent Labor Day tourney was played on eight boards in two neighboring locations (99 Tavern & Willee's Cafe).

Dan Hitt, of Spokane, left the tourney with the lions share of prizes from the Open events. Hitt held off a monster charge by Nick Chaffin to win the singles. Chaffin had won three straight games in his attempt to double dip Hitt, when the momentum turned in favor of the new Rural American Champion.

Hitt, teamed with Winston player Dan Holland to repeat as tournament champions in the Open Doubles. Once again, strong lagging from the Hitt end, coupled with effective hammer control from Holland created early leads in both championship games. Nick Chaffin and Joe Hudson claimed 2nd place while Bob Hunt and Dave Keithahn finished 3rd.

Lorraine Bingham Olson had a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finish in three of the five events she entered. "Hurricane" and local Kevin Callaway won the Open Blind

Draw and she teamed with partner Jimmy Olson to place runnerup in the B Doubles. A 3rd place finish in the B Singles summed up a fine overall performance for her.

The tourney started with an A-B draw. Dan Holland and Linda Walker (Port Orchard, WA) beat Doug Buhl and Bill Walker to win the 30 team event. Jim Tribble and JB Burgess placed third.

The B-Singles (+. 51 Bowers and above) had 35 participants. Ryan Devlin (Kelso WA) survived the field to win the event. Ted Curtice (Bonanza, Or) placed second, while Lorraine Bingham Olson finished third.

Frank Mako (Chehalis,WA), and Dan Glasscock (Rogue River,OR) snuck past Jimmy Olson and Lorraine Bingham Olson in the finals to win the B-Doubles event. Max Sena (WA) and Israel Ochoa finished third.

Everyone was pleased with the Venue, organization, and conditions of play. This was the 4th annual tourney in Winston with an average participation of 72.25 registered players.

What the Bowers Rating does for this great game of shuffleboard... one thing it does is it makes a more even playing field. For instance, in an ABC tournament you can have an A player up against a C player. Now, I ask you, does this promote new players? What would happen is the good players would go on to get better and the new players would probably go away. What I am trying to get at is this: people who put out the ratings list every year do not make a dime other than donations that are sent in usually by the raters. I suggest perhaps at some of our tournaments, a donation can, and if everyone donated just \$1, we can keep ratings alive. Just a suggestion!

I would like to thank all who donated to the Bowers Rating System at the Steelville, Missouri tournament. A special thanks to Glen and Sandy Tubbs for their little extra. If we are going to keep the Bowers Ratings going, we need to get a little help at our tournaments for the Bowers. They started the ratings back in the early 90's in their city to help balance the skill level and get new players involved with a chance to win. It caught on quickly and it became nationwide (except a way to pay printing, postage, and supplies that it takes to keep it going).

Right now there are over 3,600 rated players and over 100 raters. Just the postage alone to get the ratings mailed out is over \$6.00 per rater.

The Bowers sent those of us that do the ratings a letter regarding the donations [and printed that information in the Oct./Nov. 2003 The Board Talk's "Shufflers' Notebook", page 2] that "Donations have been 1/5 as much as usual this year and printing cost and postage have increased. We do not mind doing the rating for free or break even, but we are not sure how many years we can afford to lose money."

The Bowers Rating System has done more for shuffleboard than anything, so PLEASE help out with a donation. Pitch in and help the Bowers!

MARCH 26-APRIL 4, 2004



The 3rd Annual Board Talk Open 2004 has just been confirmed to be held at the VFW Post # 5076, 1906 Miller Rd., Garland, Texas on March 26-April 4, 2004. An official flyer with preregistration form is inserted in this issue (will probably expand to a 4-page flyer in a later issue to include additional details and information on hotel & RV park options, etc.)

The events are basically the same as the Board Talk Open 2003, but different event sequences. For instance, in 2003 we started with the 4-person team events; the 2004 tournament ends with 4-person team events (which allows time for those that do not have a full team at the start of the tournament to get a full team together by the end of tournament - this change was based on suggestions from those attending the 2003 tournament). Another suggestion was not to start Singles immediately after the 6-Person Team event (two long events, back to back) and to make the 6-person team event 5/9 games. These suggested modifications have been made to incorporate prior year attendees suggestions. Event entry criteria is based upon the Bowers 2003 ratings (no decimals used), whole number rating (e.g., -1, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4) to be used. The reason that the 2003 versus 2004 ratings are to be used is because the Bowers project the new ratings are not to be available until some time in February (which would be too late to start getting teams together and preregister). Any unrated player(s) should contact the tournament directors to get a temporary rating for playing in the tournament. We welcome all players!

Below is a summary of the event schedule/plans (See flyer insert for more details and preregistration form): **3/26** (*Fri.*) **ROBINS** start at Noon (Registration Desk Open from 6pm-10pm; must be pre-reg. or registered for Saturday's 6-Person Draft by 10pm - only those that play in Saturday's 6-Person Draft team event will qualify to compete for the added Bonus \$\$).

3/27 & 3/28 (Sat. & Sun.) 6-MAN DRAFT- (9am Draft Teams (3/27), sponsor sale and play immediately after); Finals on Sunday 3/28 (open to all players; highest rated registered players will be team captains - limit 32 teams)

3/29 (Mon.) A/B DRAW (2 Divisions); start 9am - Singles Sponsor Sale starts at 6pm)

3/30 & 3/31 (Tues. & Wed.) SINGLES (3 Divisions) (Finals on 3/ 31 & Sponsor Sale for Bring Partner held 3/31) 4/01 & 4/02 (Thurs. & Fri.) BRING PARTNER

(3 Divisions); start 9am



Nifty Fifties... "A Perfect Tournament"

Tacoma, Washington: Mike Thorpe told me Sunday at the Nifty's Fifty's A/B (bring your own partner) Tournament September 27th & 28th that to go through the entire tournament without losing a game is pretty rare. He'd done it once before 10 years ago. His partner, Judy George, had never done it. One team stood in their way. A team they'd previously kicked to the Loser's Bracket. A visual David & Goliath with shuffleboard weights in place of stones to sling, and team "underdog" understanding they'd have to take 4 out of 6 games to win. More importantly, a team they'd have to beat at least once for the opportunity to continue their guest for first, one game at a time.

Jim Tribble and Kathy Keevil did manage to take a game from Mike and Judy. One game wasn't enough for them to take first. It was, however, just enough to spoil Mike & Judy's "perfect tournament." Mike Keevil and Randy Ausbun took 3rd. Rick Gindt and Ryan Strayer took 4th. Tied for 5th and 6th was Alvin Orcutt and Justin Kasa, Ryan Devlin and Ted Ausbun.

Friday night's draw favored Dave Arndt and Dan Bjold for 1st, Jim Tribble and Harold (last name?) for 2nd. 14 teams entered the tournament with Gary George at the helm. Zero drama. Zero squabbles. Zero "you can't do that under these conditions at this time because the tide is high and it specifically states in the shuffleboard manual that when the sun is shining and there are no songs playing on the jukebox and I get bumped slightly after throwing my weight a foul should be called even though I was feeling a little intoxicated and inadvertently ran into the chair on my way back to my beer." Or something like that. Suffice it to say, Gary did a great job!

There was a nice potluck for the dinner break featuring fried chicken and salads and a bold move of beans by Judy. An interesting combination, beans and beers, and if I'm not mistaken she'll be serving Gas-X for dessert the next time she deems it necessary to bust out a big pot of beans. Yum.

Saturday night, upon conclusion of the tournament in lieu of Sunday's matches, I had a conversation with President Gary. Everyone else from the tournament had cleared out and gone home, either resting up for Sunday or sleeping off Saturday night. Everyone, that is, but us die-hards who are keenly disillusioned after a few beers and left with some serious visions of grandeur held under the belief "the more we drink the better we play." He had taken Alvin as a partner for some money games, and was in the midst of hustling the Olson's, ALL the Olson's present including Tina, who only came to watch (tee hee) out of \$10 an end for 5 games total.

It had been a great day of tournament play. The tavern had sported a warm and welcoming atmosphere. The bartenders were as friendly and accommodating as they could be considering how busy the place was throughout the day. Gary and Alvin were on their 3rd game slaughter against Ray and Michael when I walked up to Gary and said, "This is why I play shuffleboard. This is what it's all about. This ... and the people. It all feels so good right now." He turned to me and said, "In order to do what I do running this league and being president, I have to love the game. I really love this game." I told him I wouldn't be playing this game but for my family. They are the reason I show up for tournaments. They are the reason I keep coming back. If they didn't play, I wouldn't be here. Gary gave me a look I couldn't quite read at the time, then turned and walked away. It was his shot, literally and figuratively.

That brief conversation resounded in my head days later: love of the people, love of the game. Which made the better argument??? Which is the reason most people play??? On Sunday Michelle Foran said many times to different people "this person is my friend." Friendships born through shuffleboard, and the many years they'd all been playing. That same morning I watched Alvin walk into the tavern to say good-bye to all his friends with such sincere warmth, exiting the stage a player and class-act example of parting being such sweet sorrow. Hugs and kisses, laughter and a few high-fives; "see you the next time we all make our way back around." The moment akin to a family gathering during the holidays when one or more of us has to leave to make our way back home.

So why do we play in tournaments few of us can barely afford knowing at one point or another we'll step away from our end of the board having just made one of those shots we'll never get back and never forget, cursing the very game with words similarly close to, "I don't know why I play this stupid game!" Gary would tell you he certainly wouldn't endure the hassles and all the hard work but for love of the game. I would tell you it's a love for the people, my family. And as if on cue Gary might give me a look that says, "They're one in the same ~ because without the people there'd be no game.
