

The attendees at the HHO 2002 had the great pleasure of spending time with Sol Lipkin who stayed through the infamous HHO New Years Eve party to celebrate the coming of another wonderful New Year -- and celebrate he did! We (Tom and Lynda French) had the great honor to spend time with Sol and his girlfriend Susan Pacifico (from Deer Park/ Houston, TX). Even with all the New Years Eve activity, Sol spared a few minutes off the dance floor for us to interview him to acquire some shuffleboard history for this issue.

Sol Lipkin was born outside London, England on May 26, 1906 to Joseph and Sophia Lipkin, moving to the states when Sol was four to six months old.

Joseph (Sol's dad) was a toolmaker/machinist and worked on Pullman cars and was one of the first employed on airplanes. They settled on a farm in Steven Town, New York where Sol attended the first through the fourth grade in a one room school house where all grades were taught. It was a 2.5 mile walk to school and in increment weather sometimes the farmers would take him to school in a sled. Kinderbeck Creek was at the foot of his house. It was here he took up ice skating on club skates (which had a pin in



the center clamped to the shoes so that the skates could be expanded as the feet grew). Sol loved football and salt water fishing.

In 1942, at the age of 41, he joined the 9th Battalion VC Program Navy CB (Construction Battalion) where his wife had to sign a waiver/permission because anyone over 27 years of age could not get sea duty. He went to Iceland and was back in November 1944. He has been a Legionnaire for over 52 years and has sold over 15,047 poppies (\$940+) at a 4 day fund raiser spent at the VA Hospital and still sells poppies each year. He was the Grand Marshall of the Memorial Day Parade four years ago and remains an active member of the American Legion and VFW since 1954 -Connecticut Farms Post 35 in Union, New Jersey and was in the VFW Post #1 since Iceland. They claim he is the voungest of the oldest "old fogies" at the Post. They spent 3 years trying to push Sol for Commander of his Post at the State and County meetings and last year put him in as Commander.

According to Sol, before prohibition (ca. 1889-90), shuffleboards were 32' long and every major hotel in Atlantic City had gamerooms with Brunswick-made billiards and shuffleboards. The weights used on the 32' boards were made of a circular brass. By 1934 (after prohibition was repealed), Sol joined a company in Newark, NJ (Modern Art Store Fixtures) who went into building shuffleboards. They built one 32' long and then went to 29' 3" cradle (28' board playing surface). There was a store in Patterson that had twenty-four (24) of the 28' boards. In the 1930's all taverns in and around Unica, NY had shuffleboards where all games were played free hand on top of the board (no side wheelers, no off rail shooting). Taverns were set up with a front bar and then a backroom restaurant/kitchen. Games were to 21 points and the losers bought the drinks. Women were not allowed in bars, so they had to go to the backroom restaurant. Tavern owners started installing shuffleboards in the backroom - thus allowing women to play shuffleboard too. Reportedly, the State of Illinois had all 12' cushion shuffleboards - no long boards allowed.

The "New" Board Talk Subscription & Advertising Rates Effective April 1, 2003!

As stated in the December 2002 issue, we were forced to evaluate and revise our subscriber and advertiser rates due to two postal increases since we took over the publication in December 2000 and due to printer/mailer cost increases. The new subscription and advertising rates will be effective <u>April 1, 2003</u> (Exception: For current "Subscribers" and "Shuffleboard Directory Advertisers", the new rates will not become effective until your annual "Subscription" or annual "Shuffleboard Directory Ad" becomes renewable).

We wish to thank all of you who have submitted your recommendations and suggestions. The new rates are posted on the inside back cover of this issue. Some of your suggestions are still being evaluated, such as:

1) Consider offering an electronic subscription requiring a subscriber userid/password to access the publication online (this is currently in the works and will be tested to see if it is a viable additional option for subscribers). This suggestion will take alot of time to evaluate the pros and cons of having electronic only option, in addition to the hardcopy publication option that we currently have.

2) Convert to Bi-Monthly (every other month) instead of monthly (being considered but may not be timely enough for tournament advertising unless tournaments are pre-planned and advertised at least 3 months in advance AND it may not be a big cost saver if the publication would double in size due to only having tournament results printed bimonthly). 3) Maintain the monthly hardcopy publication, but every other month would include tournament results and advertising (same as it is currently) and alternate months would be Upcoming Events & Advertising (without tournament results). Keep your ideas and comments coming in please. Note one of the primary changes is a small charge for a write-up in the "Upcoming Events" (which typically requires from 2-5 pages per issue). The "Calendar of Events" remains free to all subscribers and/or advertisers. -- T& L, Editors

As you have probably noticed, this 2nd year tournament had some format additions and sponsor sale changes due to suggestions received from first year tournament players: 1) Multiple Requests for 4-Person team events (added two division event); 2) Allow more time between the 6-Person team event and the next event (allowing 2 days); 3) Allow 2 out of 3 play for Division I: Singles and Bring Partner (winner bracket only for 2003); and 4) Start sponsor sales the afternoon before the Singles and Bring Partner events so that play can start more timely on the actual day of these two events (Page 2 of the inserted flyer describes the sponsor sale on these events starting the afternoon before the actual events start - we hope the majority of the registered participants will make a special effort to check-in and participate in the afternoon sponsor sale - the fewer sponsor sales that we have to do on the actual day of the events, the sooner we get to start play). This way on the actual day of Singles and Bring Partner events, the only sponsor sales we will have to do are new registrations (if slots available) and late arrivals (e.g., those preregistered participants whose flights did not arrive in time to participate in the prior afternoon sponsor sales). Preregistrations will be most helpful to our planning and execution of the sponsor sales.

In 1934 Sol worked for National Shuffleboard and marketed from tavern to tavern and started getting leagues going. The first tournament was in 1938 (Tri-State: NY, NJ, & PA) - a team tournament of 10 men: 6 players and 2 alternates with 12 teams to the league played home and home 22 games where league rules were established and used. The finals were held at National Turners (German Club with a large hall) in Newark, NJ where Congressman Fred Hartley (an avid shuffleboard player - known for Hartely Taft Act) was invited to attend. There were banners "Congressman Fred Hartley for President!". Congressman Hartley came from Washington and presented the winner trophies. Captain O'Keif Tavern won the doubles playoffs against Ryan & Nunack of Patterson, NJ. It was a great show, resulting in a great write-up for the Newark Ledger newspaper.

In 1946 timeframe, the shuffleboard playing surface length was shortened to 20' 8" due to the longer boards not being able to fit in a carrier for transport.

In 1946, Sol's extensive traveling commenced. By the end of 1946, he started flying all over the United States, traveling 25 to 35 weeks per year and then started into Canada (1955-56) with 16' boards being installed in Canada (Montreal installing 12' cushion boards) - traveling from Vancouver to St. Johns.

In 1948 was the first really large league tournament of 570+ taverns with 10 men each (ran 10 frames per game in 3 days - tied at 10 up/down to 12 frames). Leagues started cropping up all over the United States.

In 1951, Sol went to work for American Shuffleboard as Sales Director and Consultant.

In the 1959-60 timeframe, a tournament was held on the USS Theodore Roosevelt (60 day underwater submarine tournament). The finals were being played during rough seas. Score was 20-20 (21 point game). The Commander threw a short weight and then the Captain and his Lieutenant partner had a bad stroke of luck, they threw their last weight and the submarine took a sharp turn and their weight went off into the trough. Sol said no one would ever admit how this maneuver was planned and executed -- the timing was of the sharp turn was obviously planned. Sol said that a 500' tape of this underwater tournament was given to him and that later it was loaned to John McDermott. If/when John is able to locate this tape (probably in his attic, he said), the Table Shuffleboard Association (TSA) has requested to be able to get it copied and converted to modern media format and make copies so that other shuffleboard players can enjoy watching this historical underwater event.

In he 1970-80's timeframe, Billy Mays showed up at Sol Lipkin's office, needing 10 boards to host a tournament in Las Vegas. Sol said "deal" and Billy proceeded to run two great tournaments in Las Vegas - the strongest shuffleboard activity held in the southwest by that time.

In 1982, Sol signed on as a Consultant to Dave & Buster (D&B Restaurants) and Venture Entertainment where he is still actively marketing and consulting for both companies.

Most of today's players are familiar with the prestigious "Sol Lipkin Award" that is presented periodically (lately annually) to some of todays' great promoters of shuffleboard. Sol Lipkin was never a pro-level player, but was and still is one of the best promoters and sales directors in the shuffleboard field. Having a "Sol Lipkin Award" for promoters is a most fitting award from a great legacy promoter of our sport. Karl Spickelmier of California was the most recent recipient of such award which was presented to Karl during the NASC Reno 2002 tournament.

We wish to thank Sol (and Susan) for joining all the players in the great competition (Sol even played himself) and celebration during the HHO 2002 tournament. A special thanks from us personally for taking the time to share with us some of the shuffleboard history and highlights of your life and career. You are a wonderful man and promoter of our sport of shuffleboard and are greatly admired by all of us in the shuffleboard community. What an honor and pleasure to have spent the quality time talking (and dancing - grin) with you Sol. Thanks for all that you continue to do to support the great game of shuffleboard. 

DARROL NELSON - TSA "National" Hall of Fame Inductee - DECEMBER 29, 2002



Darrol Nelson of Cheshire, Oregon was born July 7, 1943 and has been an avid shuffleboard player since 1965 when he started playing at 21 years old. He had a big fascination for shuffleboard since he first observed the game. He quit playing a couple of times, but always came back. He loved the motion of the weight as it went down the board. The late Truman Adams (TA) of Portland, Oregon was most influential and his mentor when he turned 21. His higher education of shuffleboard was in the late 70's when he started winning.

Darrol's first major victory in Singles was at the "HOT-N-TROT" in Portland against opponent Ron Harrelson. Billy Mays and Bob Miles were there at the time. Darrol's first major Doubles victory was in 1977 with Doug Buhl, again at the "HOT-N-TROT" in Portland against opponents Billy Mays and his partner Nevel (Mel) Curry from Canada. This began a partnership with Doug Buhl that continued for many years. In the summer of 1978 Doug and Darrol toured the country for 9 weeks and played 46 sessions and only lost money in 2 of the 46 sessions. They played from the west coast to the east coast and the southern states. They toured the country again in 1983.

Before 1977 there were no tournaments, as we know them today other than the Northwest Regionals. Everyone used to go into the "Black Cat" in Portland on Friday nights, they had 3 boards, and you put up your name and waited to play. The modern era tournaments (as Darrol calls them) didn't really start until the early 1980's. The biggest purse Darrol ever won was at Billy Mays' "World Championship" at the Showboat in Las Vegas in 1984. He won the Pro-Singles event.

The entry fee at the "World Championship" was \$800 per person, with a 32 person cut-off (they had to turn players away). Darrol won \$17,500 in entry fee only, not including the sponsor sale money.

In the 80's, Darrol traveled to play at Don Valk's "US Open" at the Aquafest in Austin, Texas and played at the Corporate Image (David Williams' bar) tournaments in Ft. Worth, Texas. He also traveled and played in tournaments in Michigan, New York, Florida, Arizona, and California to name just a few.

Among some of the most memorable wins for Darrol were when he partnered with Galin Gaunt against Donnie Cox and Leroy Ledford in 1982; partnered with Steve Bjorn at the "Fir Cone Tavern" in Shelton, Washington in the early 90's; playing with Loren Lampley at "Buzz's Tavern" in Mud Bay; and winning the last President's Day Tournament at Blinky's in Santa Clara, California in 2001 where he won the Singles event *against* Dan Hitt, and then won the Doubles event partnered with Dan Hitt.

If anyone wonders where Darrol got his thumb shot, Billy Mays states that "In 1977 Darrol was playing the owner of the 'Time-Out-Tavern' on 6th Street in Seattle, Washington, and she was eating up the middle of the board against Darrol. When she took time out to go to the bathroom, Billy showed Darrol the thumbshot and Darrol never lost another game against her."

Darrol is a retired Locomotive Engineer and was a fireman previous to that. He has 4 children: 3 boys and 1 girl. He has 6 grandchildren. They all live within 50 miles of him in the Portland area.

The most influential people to him in shuffleboard were Mack Mackaronis, Doug Buhl (old time partner and great strategist), Billy Mays, and the late Truman Adams (TA) who was his mentor when he started playing when he turned 21 years of age.


Darrol's accomplishments speak for themselves. He is the best of the best in table shuffleboard, number one (1) in the world. His game is what we all strive for. He is a true sportsman, win or lose!

As stated by Dave Keithahn, a Pro from California who recently beat Darrol in a 2 out of 3 competition: "When Darrol lost I was totally blown away by the fact the he was the first person to come over to me and he grabbed me and hugged me and congratulated me on my win. That's how I will strive to conduct myself in the future. He taught me what a true sportsman really is!"

"I have been very fortunate in Shuffleboard. I played with Bill Melton for years then young Billy came along and now David Jr. is becoming a force in the game. This is such a great sport in which I have made so many wonderful and dear friends." - David Williams Sr. (2002 Texas Open in Houston, TX)

David Williams is a self-employed, owner of Dave Williams Paint & Body Shop. He has 5 children, including daughters Christi, Robin, and Amy and sons Jeff and David Jr. (who has already established himself as a no nonsense competitor and rising star in the game of shuffleboard) and 8 grandchildren.

David was born in Howe, Texas and moved to Ft. Worth when he was 4 years old. He has two brothers Bobby and Gary and a sister Linda who along with Bobby's wife Jeri find it a fulltime job taking care of the "boys."

David first started playing shuffleboard 30 years ago ('70s) on a bank shuffleboard. David eventually graduated from bank shuffleboard to long boards that are used today and over the years has firmly established himself as a player with many friends among competitors but few peers in terms of skill and ability.

In the late 70's when David was still developing his enormous skill, Glen Davidson and Billy Mays, using false names and presumably disguises, came to Ft. Worth to play David. Well, sometimes the unexpected happens and David defeated them both. Shortly after that Bill Melton also came to Ft. Worth to play a few games of "friendly" shuffleboard with David. Nowadays neither one them will admit who won that session, but it was the beginning of a formidable partnership and a twenty-five friendship. Ironically, this budding relationship got off to a bit of a rocky start when Bill convinced David to go to Big Springs, Texas for a tournament, which turned out to be a keep hammer event and David was soundly beaten. Despite this resounding defeat, Bill saw enough promise in David to take him as a partner in a national tournament billed as the "World Series of Shuffleboard" held at the Black Cat Tavern in Portland, Oregon in 1981. This tournament was such a prominent event that it was even covered by the local TV station. The finals pitted David and Bill against Galin Gaunce and Billy Chiles. Well, Billy Chiles and Bill prevailed and the headlines the next day in the local paper read "Players shuffle home with \$13,000".

Over the next dozen years, or so, David and Bill successfully partnered together in many events including Reno, Las Vegas and Austin (for Don Valk's "Texas Open"). Through the years, David has also enjoyed great success in Mixed Doubles playing with Diana Hagen, the "Queen of the Jungle." Despite his prowess as a doubles player (although Diana claims she carried him), David's greatest achievements have probably been in the Singles events. Unlike other events where team play overshadows individual performance that is not the case in Singles. Nowhere to run, nowhere to hide, nobody to blame. Pro-Singles is very difficult and challenging and few can claim the success that David has achieved over the years. With 15 documented Singles titles, David has won state championships and major Singles titles everywhere from Pennsylvania to Nevada and in between.

Among those titles are two victories in the "Texas Open Singles" championship game over the legendary Darrol Nelson who along with Billy Mays are unquestionably the two greatest players to ever touch a weight. In fact, the game between David and Darrol back in 1991 for the "Texas Open Single" title has been called, by some observers, one of the greatest matches in the history of the game with one possible shot after another being executed by both competitors. Since this match was being played as other events were completed, there were well over one hundred players watching this game and marveling at the expertise displayed by both David and Darrol.

Although David still excels at Singles and Doubles, in recent years he has also enjoyed great success in team events where he has probably won more team titles than any other captain.

As with most true champions, David does not dwell on past accomplishments but rather looks forward to the next challenge. Although he has won countless tournaments over the years, he is much more at ease talking about the play of others, especially the younger players like Dan Hitt and Mike Taylor and now Jr. In fact, he and David Jr. will likely be a formidable team for years to come.

As it stands, the compiled list of David's past tournament achievements is incomplete and based upon what David and Bill Melton can recall, plus what is documented in The Board Talk since 1984 and the more than 100 plaques and trophies he has on display at his body shop. Unfortunately, dozens of others have either been lost or misplaced over the years. Nevertheless, by any account it's a list we can all envy and David justly deserves to be inducted into the TSA National Hall of Fame and be recognized as one of the best players in the history of the game. As a player, David's accomplishments speak for themselves. But winning tournaments is only a small part of his contributions to the game. In addition to being a top-ranked player for more than 20 years, David is a persistent supporter and promoter of shuffleboard everywhere he goes. In addition, due to his great love and respect for the game he is always willing to assist new players as well as struggling veterans with advice/help on their game. David (and Don Valk) are pioneers in bringing major tournament play to Texas in the 1980's. Congrats!

Little did Howard know that when he took "Shy Di" under his wing that he was about to uncover a player with uncanny skill, one who would not only rise to the top of the shuffleboard world but would eventually help change the face of shuffleboard by opening the door to women players across the country.

Although eager to learn and play at every opportunity, few players in those early days, other than Howard, were willing to take Diana as a partner. Even Howard now shyly admits they "forced" him to take Diana as a partner since he was the one who introduced her to the game. According to Howard, it didn't take long for that scenario to change however, once everyone discovered that girl could play the game! A naturally gifted player, Diana learned quickly from not only Howard, but Glen Davidson and Billy Mays and with her patented snap release, a dead eye for sticking and a soft touch for lagging she soon established herself as one heck of a player to be reckoned with. In fact, after only three short years of playing shuffleboard, Diana was already ranked among the top players in the country, a lofty place she deservedly still holds today.

As a player, Diana's accomplishments speak for themselves. But winning tournaments is only a small part of her contributions to the game. In addition to being a top-ranked player for many years and opening the doors for the many women players who participate in shuffleboard today, Diana is a constant supporter, promoter and educator of shuffleboard everywhere she goes. While the number of players that Diana has either introduced to shuffleboard or taken directly under her wing could easily fill a page, the number of players that Diana has helped over the years could fill a book. Houston players that owe much to Diana include Flynt Preston, Ann Walker, Silvia Martinez, Dave Ramold, Denise Klein, Jack Scott, Jimmy Britt, Bob Lee, Jorge Galvan and Wayne Hammond to name a few. Because of her great love and respect for the game Diana constantly pushes players to improve and achieve their potential. Whether she is playing or just watching from the sidelines, Diana is always willing to answer questions or show new players how to make a particular shot. At Danny's Sports Bar in Houston where she regularly plays, there is no bigger cheerleader for the game and the players who compete with Diana.

Although much of the credit for reviving big-time shuffleboard in Houston rightly belongs to Jack Scott and Johnny Ballard, neither could have done it without the efforts of Diana Hagen who got on the phone and personally called many of the top players to encourage them to attend the first Houston Holiday Open ... today, the Houston Holiday Open is recognized as one of the better tournaments in the country drawing players from Washington to Florida and much of that credit still goes to Diana for her behind the scene efforts at not only promoting the tournament but also arranging partners and teams to get more players involved. So, even though Howard Mouton likes to tell the story to let everyone know that he taught Diana how to play and is responsible for making her the champion player she is today, he exaggerated a bit ... He really simply let the genie out of the bottle when he put that first American weight in her hand and showed this small-town girl how to stand at the table and shoot.



From Houston, to Oklahoma, to Reno, to Vegas she has won Pro Singles, Pro Doubles, and team events. Although shy and unassuming away from the table, Diana never backs down from a shuffleboard challenge. She is a winners' circle icon at every tournament she attends.



A Farewell To "Dad"

I excitedly walked over to a friend's house to look it up, and found to my dismay that his definition was exactly what was in the dictionary. I didn't ever make that mistake again.

While he wore the title of curmudgeon proudly, underneath he was a thoughtful, sensitive man with a heart as big as Texas.

Last summer, I had the audacity to ask him to move my tandem bike for me, and, while it involved a drive of 10 minutes each way, he gladly did so. Needless to say, he got great enjoyment out of needling me over that one.

Dick's legendary sense of humor was as mischievous as it was original. One time at Leggett's in Manasquan, Dick sat on the floor with his head underneath the overhang of the bar, just so he could avoid being picked by a player who, in his words, "stinks".

Dick was an expert at heckling people, and when he was really "on" he could make me laugh until my stomach hurt. Memorial Day weekend last summer, he sat on his stool and picked apart one of my opponents until the guy was worthless as a player.

Dick loved to hear all the latest gossip, and he would revel in reporting it all back to the person being talked about, while making sure to identify the original source of the gossip (usually me). That was one of Dick's many great ways of "stirring the pot". It is a testament to the strength of his personality that he made what would ordinarily be called an annoying personality trait endearing.

While our friendship was an unlikely one, it was a good one, and one that transcended the 19 year age difference between us. I feel honored to be able to say that I was a friend of Dick Mills, and I will miss him terribly.






