# Danny's & Triple Crown Sports Bars Jointly Host Annual Memorial Day Tournament in Houston





This year, the 5th Annual Memorial Day Tournament was hosted jointly by Triple Crown & Danny's Sports Bars on 13 boards [Danny's (8) and Triple Crown Sports Bars (5)]. Events are split between locations which are about 5 minutes apart on Westheimer Blvd. The tournament featured 8 events, sponsor sale, "parimutuel" and professional staff which makes this a tournament you should fit in your schedule.

Thanks to all that attended. We had a record attendance of 115 registered players. That is up from 76 last year.

# Board Talk & "Beta Test" Distribution Comments...

One Comment Received Since July 2004 Issue (See July 2004 Issue, page 18 for last month's comments)

Editors' Comments: Beta Test Status & Editors' Opinions Based on input received [Ref: July 2004 Issue, page 18]

#### Thanks to all for your comments and suggestions!

As we previously stated, we {Editors} are not the owners of. The Board Talk (Champion Shuffleboard owns it). We are The Board Talk Editors/Publishers of the publication. Each year since the first issue (December 2000) that we took over as Editors/Publishers, Champion Shuffleboard evaluates the viability of continuing The Board Talk and we work jointly with them each year to provide financial status along with subscriber/advertiser details to assist them with whether they wish to continue the publication and, if so, in what format. Nothing is our final decision, we are the Editors/Publishers. Champion Shuffleboard is the owner. This relationship has been described in more detail in many prior issues since our first issue in December 2000.

As part of this annual evaluation with Champion Shuffleboard, evaluating the "write-offs", dropping nonpaying subscribers, trying to absorb the increasing postal and print costs (with a declining subscriber base and delayed payments for services already rendered), we decided to try some "beta tests" in 2004 to see if there are viable options for Champion to consider to keep The Board Talk afloat in 2005 and thereafter (while maintaining a reasonable subscription rate), such as: 1) consider one or more bi-monthly issues per year; 2) Consider electronic distribution (solely or in conjunction with a hardcopy option with varying rates); 3) consider Quarterly distribution, etc.

Our current status shared with Champion, thusfar, includes options such as: 1) Consider some variance of the two "beta test" options being tested now (electronic & bi-monthly);
2) Increase subscription rates to continue any hardcopy option; and/or 3) discontinue the publication if it does not receive enough support from the shuffleboard vendors, promoters of tournaments, advertisers, etc. to keep it going (no doubt, this is not the option we [Editors] want to see implemented).

(See Page 14 & Back Cover for more details) From the feedback on "beta tests", thusfar, we have not yet reached a consensus from our existing subscriber/advertiser base. We have estimated that for every publication that we mail out to supportive paying subscribers, there are likely at least 6 or more non-paying readers of each paid issue which we send out to paying subscribers. Vendors and promoters of tournaments are the primary benefactors of the publication getting into the hands of non-paying readers. It doesn't support the future of the publication at all, but rather contributes to its' potential demise. With over 3,000 rated players and thousands of unrated and league players, having less than 20% of even the rated players subscribing is not a positive sign.

Since Champion owns the publication, they have nothing tangible to evaluate each year if all those reading the publication and submitting tournament results are not paying subscribers and/or advertisers. We have extended grace periods (in many cases for months) because subscribers do not inform us whether or not they plan to renew. It's a time-consuming expensive exercise to delete someone after 45 days grace period (the rule) and then have to add them back later. In addition, for every month we send a delinquent subscriber an issue, the cost averages roughly \$3 per issue mailed out (pure print/mail cost with no overhead included). If these delinquent subscribers do not renew, then we encounter annual losses.

**Electronic "Beta Test" status**: We have found that any type of "**electronic only**" publication is a waste of time and reaches very few people (less than 1/2 of the current subscriber base). Considering an electronic option may be a viable additional consideration, but not an electronic ONLY option.

**Bi-Monthly "Beta Test" status**: Bi-monthly might be a viable option for one or more issues per year, but likely not 6 issues a year as the sole option. You might be able to do one or two bimonthly issues a year, but it is not feasible for timely event advertisements to do solely "bi-monthly" (6 issues per year).

"Quarterly" status: Quarterly seems to be the least desirable option, as the main benefit of a shuffleboard publication is for promoters and vendors to get their tournament plans out to the shuffleboard community timely. By doing so, they get more players involved in shuffleboard and the tournament promoters. vendors, and associated businesses benefit from a growing shuffleboard community as well. So Quarterly might suffice for vendors to promote their "for sell" products (such as Champion, Federation, Triple Crown, Sun-Glo, Suitco, etc.), but likely would not have much player benefit or promote tournament growth if the promoters can't advertise fully and timely all their planned events and report their tournament results. Quarterly may suffice for local level newsletters, but not national level news (with so much more activity to report at a national level). These are solely our [Editors] opinions based upon the beta test input received to-date. Thanks to all Supporters! --T&L French

# Basics on How to Play & Score in "Crazy Eight" (One Commonly Played Table Shuffleboard Game)

There are several traditional table shuffleboard games that are played. The most common table shuffleboard game played in most tournaments is called "Knock Off" which was featured in the May/June 2004 issue (page 3). Other commonly played table shuffleboard games are "Crazy Eight" (featured in this issue) and "Horse Collar". This page has been dedicated monthly for instructional purposes, starting with some "how to" basics and then getting into some of the more complex strategy questions that arise as players become more familiar with the game(s). Feel free to mail or e-mail The Board Talk Editors/Publishers with specific strategy questions you may have like "when to play short weight", "when to pass weights" versus "knocking off weights" and when one might use some of the various release shots (rail, span, thumb, free hand, etc.).

#### Basic Overview of "Crazy Eight" Game


Crazy Eight is a singles game played with 2 or more players and is played in frames allowing all players to have an equal chance. Players alternate ends of the board between frames, each player using all eight weights/pucks [red and blue]. The Game is played until one player scores some agreed upon number of points (e.g., 1-point, 15-points, 21-points, etc.). You continue frames until a winner is determined. Scoring the agreed upon points first does not necessarily make that player the winner. Every player gets to finish that frame and the highest score that is equal to or greater than the agreed upon game point (e.g., 1-point, 15-points, 21points, etc.) is declared the winner. If the player that scores equal to or greater than the agreed minimum required points has the hammer (the last player to play), then he/she is declared the winner. If the last player ties with a prior player, then another round must be played to determine the winner. Before a player can score, the first 4 weights (same color) must be thrown simultaneously with one hand and all 4 weights must stay on the board and be past the long foul line (the foul line furthest from the shooter). If all 4 weights do not stay on the board, then that player gets no points for that round and the next player is up to play. If all 4 weights do stay on the board past the long foul line, then the player must shoot all 4 weights/pucks (in four shots) of the opposite color and must knock off those first four weights thrown past the foul line before any points can be scored for that frame. After all 4 original weights are knocked off, the remaining weights left on the table are scored. For instance, if a player does not get all four of their first 4 weights past the long foul line, no points are scored; if a player does get all 4 weights past the foul on first throw, but does not knock them off and keep at least one of the final 4 weights on the board, no points are scored; if a player gets all 4 first weights past the foul line, knocks them all off and has at least one of the final 4 weights left on the board, points are added and count. \*\*\* OPTIONAL: Sometimes players will also have a "Hickey" count which means every time a player does not score, it constitutes a "Hickey", and each player that does not score in a round puts an agreed upon amount of money into a "Hickey Jar" (e.g., \$.25, \$1, \$5, etc.) and the final winner of the game gets the contents of the Hickey Jar. This is just something that can be done to make the game more interesting, but may or may not be part of your agreed upon Crazy Eight tournament rules.

#### How To Play

- Take 4 weights [of same color], group them together, and throw them with one hand.
- If all 4 weights do not pass the long foul line and stay on the board, no points are scored for that round [and player gets a "Hickey" if your tournament includes a "Hickey Jar"], and next player is up on the opposite end of the board for their turn.
- If all 4 weights of the same color group did pass the long foul line and stay on the board, then player shoots the remaining 4 weights [of opposite color] one at a time and attempts to knock off the 1st 4 weights and keep at least one of the last four weights of the opposite color on the board to score points (this is great practice for knock off, making combination shots to remove more than one of the 4 weights with one shot, and to be able to either stick a final shot or lag with the weights you have left after you've knocked off all 4 weights of the original color group). If all of the first color group weights are knocked off and you still have at least one of the second color on the board and past the long foul line, this is your score; otherwise, no point is scored [and player gets a "Hickey" if your tournament includes a "Hickey Jar"]. In either case, the next player is up on the opposite end of the board for their turn.

#### How To Count Player/Team Scores

- Scoring (e.g., 1-point, 2-points, 3-points, or 4-points) is similar to "knock off" with the exceptions noted above where first 4 weights of the same color must remain on the board and past the long foul line, and then they must all be knocked off with the remaining 4 weights of the opposite color while keeping one or more of these weights on the board.
- A weight scores 1-point if it is located between the long foul line and the "2" line.
- Weights completely across the "2" line count 2-points; weights across the "3" line count 3-points, a weight hanging over the end of the board (a.k.a. hanger) counts 4-points, etc.
- To judge if a weight is completely over a line it should be viewed from above (i.e., look down over the top of the weight, positioning your nose approximately to the center of the weight --do not lean over too far or you get an inaccurate view-- the entire weight must be over the line for it to count as the next higher point value--you should be able to see some wood between the line and the weight for it to count as the next higher point.)
- If any portion of the weight is hanging over the end of the board (not the side) it is called a "hanger" and counts 4-points. Close calls can be checked by holding a weight so the top of a weight is along the back end of the board. The weight is then slid along the back end of the board. If it hits the "disputed" hanger the weight is indeed hanging and is worth 4-points.





# 4th Annual 4th of July "Shootout"...

Exeter, California: The Exeter Eagles Lodge #3608 held their Annual 4th of July tournament on July 2-5. The lodge has two house boards and two boards were brought in for the tournament. This always makes the games interesting because the local players have "home advantage" only half of the time. Scheduled to have three events, there were not enough players signed up for the Open Singles to hold this event so the ABC event started including the Singles players. This brought the total to 45 players (15 teams). One team dropped out due to a knee injury and the entry fees and Sponsor Sale monies were returned to the players and sponsor. Playing one round of matches Friday night after the Sponsor Sale and playing late Saturday night allowed the Singles to start on Sunday morning on the three remaining boards. Since Jim Martin Gary Jones and Susie Jones went undefeated in the finals, this also helped since all six players were entered in the Doubles. We were able to play both events as 2 out of 3 in both the winners and losers brackets.

Saturday evening was the time we inducted Marion Bailey into the California Shuffleboard Hall of Fame. National Hall of Famer Bobby Goldsmiths sister Robbi Gann had written and read a very nice poem about Marion. Bobby recalled that he and Marion went back a long way and that Marion was the only person that didn't have a loan limit. Bobby then mumbled something about \$500 but I couldn't quite catch it. Wes Martin, who has played with Marion for years, quoted a list of Marions sayings very few of which are suitable for print. These include such things as "Four Red in the Bed" and "Circle the Wagon". Other people related their personal histories with Marion which were quite impressive and make his induction quite understandable. Jolene Lembke, president of the California Shuffleboard Hall of Fame, presented Marion with his plaque.

Many thanks to the bartenders and servers for an outstanding job. Paul Weber did his usual fine job on the Calcutta. In charge of the brackets was Bob Brunskill. The 2004 Bowers Ratings were used although there were nine unrated players - Tom Wolfe had been inadvertently dropped last year, Gary and Susie Jones have returned to playing Shuffleboard, Arnie and Louie appeared from Lake Isabella and four local players joined us in the tournament.

The ABC event had \$1050 entry and \$3180 sponsor monies and winners were... 1st: Jim Martin/Gary Jones/Susie Jones; 2nd: Robert Wade/Ty Bayne/Arnie Sieler; 3rd: John Fisher/Helen Martin/Bob Davidson; 4th: Steve O'Neal/Russ Lankton/H.L. Lee.

Add to 2 Doubles had entry of \$1600 and \$3160 sponsor monies and winners were: 1st: Bob & Barbara Crum; 2nd: Warren Goldsmith/Ty Bayne; 3rd: Jim Martin/Robert Wade; 4th: Bobby Goldsmith/Russ Lankton. Bob and Barbara had to double dip the second place team of Warren and Ty. Barbara lagged a two to win the final game.
