Michigan State Tournament Returns to Durand, Michigan...

Durand, Michigan: Another successful turnout occurred at Kane's Club Car during this year's Michigan State Tournament. A total of 53 shuffleboard patrons participated in this three day tournament, including the following events: Mixed Doubles on Friday, Women's Singles, Division II Singles, and Open Singles on Saturday, and Open Doubles on Sunday. Just under \$9,000 was up for grabs.

On Friday, 15 teams participated in the Mixed Doubles event. First place victory went to Steve Auten and Carrie Siple (sponsored by Jerry Siebert). Second place winners were Jerry Siebert and Brenda Kane (sponsored by Steve Auten), and third place recipients were Bill Kane and Jackie Meagher (sponsored by Bob Querback).

Second place winner was Frank Blade (sponsored by Doug Queen), and third place to JR Lopez (sponsored by Mark Holland). 
On Sunday, thanks to the generous donation from John McDermott, a brand new set of Federation weights were raffled off. Congratulations to winner John Tischler!

Bowers Ratings, Board Talk & TSA

The Bower's Ratings, Board Talk and Table Shuffleboard Association

I mention these three non-profit activities in the same breath because the people involved in these activities give a lot of their free time and effort toward the betterment of shuffleboard. These are people who, at times, have also been willing to spend some of their own money just to keep things afloat and running smoothly. Firstly, I will address the Bower's Rating System.

Bowers' Rating System: I am and have been a rater since the inception of the Bower's rating system; I have witnessed its maturity over the years. Lately I have heard comments that some of the ratings are not right, hurt some players and favor other players. This may be true in rare instances, and in my opinion, certainly less than one percent of the current rated players are affected; we are talking about 3500 or so players in the rating database. Additionally, several players do not even know who their raters are. Also remember, ratings come out once a year and some players will develop their skills over a 12-month period and become better players than their year-old ratings indicate. Time and money probably preclude an interim update to the yearly ratings. I know too that occasionally a few players are 'sandbagged' by some raters for reasons that I am not going into at this time.

Bower's Rating System is a compilation of the raters' input. Be advised the Bower's ratings are not exact and are only GUIDELINES and should be used as GUIDELINES. Note too, that the player ratings are only as good as the raters who rate them on a yearly basis. Yes, occasionally

(See Page 14 & Back Cover for more details) we raters may misjudge a player's capability but not very often if we are truly judging a player on what we see. In my opinion, what we have today is the best available; I truly believe that the Bower's rating system is a significant contributing factor for the growing popularity of shuffleboard. One can imagine the confusion that would exist at the major tournaments if every state or region brought their own rating system. Ask any tournament director and they will tell you the current rating system is priceless when putting together their tournament formats. Dick Gorman was recently awarded the Sol Lipkin award at the recent Reno NASC tournament and spent a few minutes during his speech praising the current rating system in helping the players that he is involved with on the East Coast.

I have known Ron and Debbie before they formulated the rating system. And believe me they did a lot of research into developing a meaningful system. They of course remain open for improvement suggestions. The list of players and the number of raters has steadily grown over the years and so have Ron and Debbie's work and expense in compiling the numbers and publishing the results every year. It has become a mid-October thru mid February task compilation task. Remember too, that updating the necessary computer software can be expensive. Past contributions from the shuffleboard community have been very helpful; contributions are essential for the continued success of the Bower's Rating System. As with most of us, Ron and Debbie cannot make every tournament to be available to answer questions, etc.

To this end I would like to suggest the following in support of Ron and Debbie Bowers' letter to the Board Talk [Oct./Nov. 2003 issue, page 2]: (a) Major tournaments (or any tournament) contribute a minimum of \$1.00/player from their registration fees or at least provide a tracking donation, (b) Bower's rating system prepare a years-end "monies in", "monies out" statement to be published in the Board Talk and/or circulate to the raters and tournament directors for posting, and (c) Bower's rating system prepare the list of current raters and where they are from for publication in the Board Talk and/or for posting.

First (on page 2) I talked about the Bower's Ratings; below I will address the Board Talk and Table Shuffleboard Association. The fact that all three of these activities are primarily based in Texas is coincidental.

Board Talk: Recent negative comments regarding the Board Talk overheard at the 2003 NASC in Reno have prompted me to say a few things on behalf of the Board Talk. These comments included "where are the Board Talk people, I never see them at tournaments", "I might as well drop my subscription, many of the tournament news are old." I believe Tom and Lynda are like many of us: we simply cannot make every tournament because of time, money, family obligations or our other life. Most of the articles/pictures in the Board Talk are reported by the various tournament directors or their representatives. Most probably if the tournament news is published late it is because the news has been sent in late and did not make the Board Talk deadline (14th of each month deadline for the following month's issue). This is true now and was true with the original Board Talk founders/ publishers, George and Donna Wilber.

Tom and Lynda French took on a monumental task as editors of the Board Talk; I suspect they knew it would be a time-demanding task to meet monthly publishing deadlines when they took on the activity. But I'm not sure they knew it was going to be a thankless job. I am not privy to the affiliation/financial details of the Board Talk and Champion Shuffleboard but I believe the Board Talk relies primarily on subscriptions and advertising to defray expenses. What I can't understand, according to the Board Talk, is why so many subscribers and advertisers have had to be dropped because they failed to renew. I personally look forward to reading every issue of The Board Talk. I know postage rates have increased substantially during the past few years leading to increased subscription rates. I also know that costly updates to computer software and hardware are necessary at times to enhance publishing. Damn, a shuffleboard establishment must really be in financial straits if it wants to promote shuffleboard and cannot afford \$110 per year advertising (which is I believe one of the lower-priced rates) in the Board Talk. Sounds like pretty inexpensive advertising to me.

Bottom line: The shuffleboard community needs a stable publication; it needs the Board Talk. Come on people, thank Tom and Lynda, renew those subscriptions; \$40 per year, hell that's only \$3.33 per month! That is less than a pack of cigarettes or a brew for crying out loud!

Table Shuffleboard Association (TSA): Don Valk, the current TSA President, along with the TSA Officers and Directors have done a fantastic job of establishing the TSA, providing direction and a plan in support of what I understand is the TSA's primary function, viz., the Table Shuffleboard

Hall of Fame activity. It is my understanding too, that a building or space in a building in Fort Worth has been provided for table shuffleboard Hall of Fame memorabilia and that presently cabinets are being made to install in the building. Various parts of the country are represented by the Officers and Directors. I do not know how many times the officers and directors meet but I do know that they target major tournaments to hold business meetings. I believe these meetings are also open to the shuffleboard community in an "Open Session".

This appears to be a low budget activity; membership to the TSA is only \$25.00 per year. The TSA also relies on the sale of TSA shirts and donations from the shuffleboard community. What amazes me is that so few shuffleboard players are members. At least it appeared so the last time I saw the membership list which hasn't been very long ago. Where are you people? If my memory serves me correctly, I believe the TSA has in the past published a financial statement in the Board Talk. This I believe should continue on a yearly basis. As with the Bower's Ratings, I would also suggest that the shuffleboard tournaments continue to find methods to contribute monies to this organization.



3RD ANNUAL BOARD TALK OPEN VFW POST#5076 GARLAND, TX MARCH 26-APRIL 4, 2004

The 3rd Annual Board Talk Open 2004 has just been confirmed to be held at the VFW Post # 5076, 1906 E. Miller Rd., Garland, Texas 75041 on March 26-April 4, 2004. An official flyer with preregistration form is inserted in this issue.

The events are basically the same as the Board Talk Open 2003, but different event sequences. For instance, in 2003 we started with the 4-person team events; the 2004 tournament ends with 4-person team events (which allows time for those that do not have a full team at the start of the tournament to get a full team together by the end of tournament - this change was based on suggestions from those attending the 2003 tournament). Another suggestion was not to start Singles immediately after the 6-Person Team event (two long events. back to back) and to make the 6-person team event 5/9 games. These suggested modifications have been made to incorporate prior year attendees suggestions. Event entry criteria is based upon the Bowers 2003 ratings (no decimals used), whole number rating (e.g., -1, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4) to be used. The reason that the 2003 versus 2004 ratings are to be used is because the Bowers project the new ratings are not to be available until some time in February (which would be too late to start getting teams together and preregister). Any unrated player(s) should contact the tournament directors to get a temporary rating for playing in the tournament. We welcome all players!

3/26 (Fri.) ROBINS start at Noon (Registration Desk Open from 6pm-10pm; must be pre-reg. or registered for Saturday's 6-Person Draft by 10pm - only those that play in Saturday's 6-Person Draft team event will qualify to compete for the added Bonus \$\$).

3/27 & 3/28 (Sat. & Sun.) 6-MAN DRAFT- start 9am Draft Teams (3/27), sponsor sale and play immediately after); Finals on Sunday 3/28 (open to all players; highest rated registered players will be team captains - limit 32 teams)

3/29 (Mon.) A/B DRAW (2 Divisions); start 9am - Singles Sponsor Sale starts at 6pm)

3/30 & 3/31 (Tues. & Wed.) SINGLES (3 Divisions) (Finals on 3/31 & Sponsor Sale for Bring Partner held 3/31)

4/01 & 4/02 (Thurs. & Fri.) BRING PARTNER

(3 Divisions); start 9am

4/03 & 4/04 (Sat. & Sun.) 4-PERSON BRING TEAM

(2 Divisions); start at 9am (finals on Sunday if needed)

The 6-Person Draft Team, A/B Draw Div. II, Bring Partner Div. III, Singles Div. III and Bring 4-Person Bring Team are great events for newcomers to tournament play, including those not yet rated in the Bowers Ratings.

Food and drinks will be available throughout the tournament. The Ladies Auxiliary will be serving breakfast, lunch, dinner (food throughout the day) with all proceeds going to the Ladies Auxiliary. 
Shelton, Washington (Fir Cone Tavern; Nov. 8-9, 2003):



Paradigm Shift & Ratings

Linda (my wife) and I've enjoyed playing shuffleboard for about seven years now. We both started playing tournaments within a few months and if it weren't for the Bower's rating system we probably would have guit after the first. In the past seven years or so the amount of rated players has grown by several thousand. We have witnessed numerous new players every year at each major and local tournament. My understanding that in many areas, leagues have had major growth. I've watched beginner players play single game draws and are so intimidated that they will go about their way pursuing another hobby. Perhaps a few and I mean a very few will try to improve if the draws are handicapped, and some will join a league if they hang around the sport long enough. I will admit that I don't like to draw a novice even if it's handicapped, but I would much rather draw the weaker player if the player was properly handicapped and I think the negative spot is as close as we will get, with a few exceptions, more about exceptions on a later date.

Change is always an ongoing part of any major sport. To begin with baseball, football, etc. and even the number one in the world family sport of bowling would not be as successful without change. I'm sad to admit that I'm old enough to remember when bowling was a very small public sport and few were interested in the hobby until it was organized for the whole family to participate. After the organization of American Bowling Congress, sanctioned members requested that bowling allies provide a child care area for children too young to play and lessons for the children old enough to learn how to play and the successful registration of sanctioned players are now in the multimillions. The way they all got to be a major sport was by organization and I think it's time for shuffleboard to be added to the list. This will not be easy and will take time, but the lovers of the game must help get it started. The first step is to organize a nonprofit organization with sanctioned members. Perhaps the Table Shuffleboard Association (TSA) organization (which already exists with a non-profit organization status) could expand the organization's scope to accommodate such an effort. Members would include players, tournaments, leagues and associate members such as businesses (bars, suppliers, sponsors, etc.). The organization could utilize Parliamentary Procedure for rulebook, addendums, amendments, officer elections, committee elections, etc. In time each player, tournament, league and major tournaments would have to be sanctioned members to participate and tournament and leagues could amend certain rules as long as, it's voted on by sanctioned players. The monies required for this is not much... for example each player registers annually for the sanctioned year. Sanctioned tournaments and leagues provide a fixed

amount for each player in each event to the organization. The monies would always be held accountable to all sanctioned players with an open book policy. A percentage of the monies could be set aside for local areas, such as qualifiers, achievement awards, etc. I suggest that at the latest, this 4th of July tournament could be a good time to set the Paradigm Shift in motion, by electing officers, adopting rules, etc. and within a few months to a year begin seeing the benefits of the great sport of Shuffleboard being organized.

I have one more idea/suggestion that I'm ready to propose. In no way am I knocking the existing Bower's system. In my opinion the game of shuffleboard wouldn't be were it's at today if it wasn't for the Bowers' Rating System, but I believe in modifications from time to time is an asset. Keep in mind that this is only a suggestion on a potentially simpler way for raters to know and accomplish their job. One way this may be less of a headache is to split the ratings and raters into two groups. First there should be a rating committee for all major tournaments. This committee would include only a few annually elected (by existing raters) -1s and 0s and a few alternates incase one of them is not able to be at the tournament. Their efforts could be rewarded. The next step would be at the beginning of the first event at all major tournaments, all raters would receive a list of players. And with draft team events, each captain (best rated player) wouldn't have to pay an entry fee. His/her duties would include receiving a player's sheet (ballot) and rate his and opponent players on the basis on each game they witnessed. After the event is over they would hold onto that sheet and divide up any additional players at the tournament and that didn't play in the draft team event. At least 2 captains per each additional player should do the ratings. Remember rating of a player is by there ability, not just on one shot, game or board and sometimes a bad hair day. Team captains should make sure that if any of the names he has on his list is different than his last rating to make sure of his decision. On the last day of the tournament these sheets should be turned over to the rating committee for use in determining tournament players ratings and should be made pubic within a week after the tournament is over. A captain failing to accomplish this will forfeit his monies. This will make ample time for teams to be put together for the next tournament and be a much fairer rating for each player. Next local players such as leagues should be rated by local raters and can even amend an individual player's tournament rating for the use in local league ratings. However, tournament committee rater's decisions are final at any tournaments (sanctioned tournaments) in the future.
