First time's a charm for Kasa

RENO — In the week before competing in his first North American Shuffleboard Championships, Justin Kasa casually asked other players at the Blue Goose Tavern in Port Orchard, Wash. if they thought he had a chance for a top-five finish in the Division II singles tournament.

Early this morning, Kasa got his answer and it was positive as he double-dipped Canada's Tom Parr to earn the championship over a field of 38 other players.

Third place went to Maryland's Rick Greider while Washington's Junelle Schrum finished in fourth. The 2003 Division III singles champ, Ty Banks of Maryland, shared fifth with Don Grossman. Earl Madary, Michigan, and Ted Canada, Arizona tied for seventh.

Sharing ninth were Jim Filkens, Nebraska, Mike Boulanger, Texas, Robert Hurst, Texas and Jonathan Harris, Maryland.

Kasa's march toward the championship was interrupted by Greider who handed him two straight losses in their winner's bracket semi-final match. Parr then dropped Greider in the winner's bracket final


Dropped into the loser's bracket, Kasa stopped Schrum to set-up a rematch with Greider.

Kasa took control midway through the 21-point game and raced into the championship match.

Kasa seemed to grow stronger as the championship match wore on, winning two straight in the two-of-three portion and then swamping Parr in the 21-point finale.

"I'm not giving him a very good match," a frustrated Parr said at one point of the final game.

Kasa said he felt good that he was able to survive the tough battles of the long day.

Kasa was the only singles champion to be crowned at the end of Tuesday's play, with the rest to be settled this morning.

In the Open Singles, Oklahoma's Bill Melton is the only undefeated player and awaits Bobby Voorhis, Indiana, or Michigan's Steve Auten for the championship match.

Melton downed Voorhis in the winner's bracket final.

Auten downed Oregon's Darroll Nelson and Washington's Rick Gindt to keep his title hopes alive after his Draft Team won that See Page 2
