Another crown for Melton

RENO — Oklahoma's Bill Melton doesn't remember exactly how many open singles championships he's won during his Hall of Fame career, but he says longevity has something to do with it.

"I've won more than most people," Melton said after defeating Indiana's Bobby Voorhis to claim the Open Singles crown during the 15th Annual North American Shuffleboard Championships at the Sands/Regency Hotel & Casino. "But then I was playing before most of them were born."

Melton claimed the crown over 23 other players going undefeated in his matches. He beat Voorhis in the winner's bracket final and then defeated him in two straight games to win the championship Wednesday morning. Melton
