
McDermott was named to the Hall as a player and a promoter of the game.

Some of shuffleboard's greatest players and promoters provided a litany of McDermott's accomplishments during the ceremony at the Sands Regency Casino Hotel.

Bill Melton, an Oklahoma member of the Hall of Fame, recalls the first time he heard McDermott talk about his dream of national tournaments held in hotels/casinos rather than taverns or lounges.

"I encouraged him, but when I went home I told my wife that it was a bunch of crap," Melton said.

Fred Thuman, California, evoked tears and laughter as he talked about McDermott's accomplishments.

"He has made the game what it is today," Thuman, who is battling cancer, said. "He's brought the game to a level, which even I at one time felt could not be achieved."

At one point Thuman kissed the top of McDermott's bald pate and later wiped his eyes on John's shirt to bring comic relief.

As a player, McDermott has more than 120 tournament victories, including a stretch from 1979 to 1985 when he won 40 straight tournaments in Michigan and Indiana.
