
My first contact was the "Bracket Man" himself, Rob Kern. He explained a bit about the draft and that it's the best 5 of 9 on 3 boards.

I then went right to the horse's mouth. I went to one of the people mostly likely to have been in the draft room all 15 times at Reno, Bill Melton. Bill graciously spent a few minutes with me on the phone this past Saturday afternoon.

Bill says that he "thinks" he's been to all 15 Reno tournaments. "At least", he said with a smile in his voice, "I don't recall missing one." Bill stated categorically that, "The worst thing you can do in the draft room is to ask someone else about a player." He recounted a time when he was assured that the player up for draft was "the guy I thought he was", but it turned out later, after the draft, that "he was someone else entirely". "After the first round or two it's hard to know who all the players are," Bill said and "Your last two picks in the draft usually decides who wins the tournament".

Bill told me about a time when the "last
