## **David Keithahn**

David grew up in Sherburn, Minnesota, the oldest of 6 children. As a young adult, he worked for a nationwide company that built retirement apartments. During a period of 5 years he helped build over 30 apartments in Colorado, Utah, Washington, Texas, Rhode Island and California.



In 1987, Dave settled in Visalia, CA and spent the next 10 years there doing drywall work. It was there that he found Mr. G's, the bar owned by Bobby Goldsmith, a California shuffleboard legend. The best players from Northern and Southern California would meet there for money games and session play. He

watched, learned and practiced, determined to make money on the game. A guy named Herman first showed him how to throw a weight, but Larry Newell showed him how to play the game. In 1997, Dave and Larry took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Open Doubles at the annual Mr. G's Memorial Day tournament. This event was attended by shufflers from all over the state.

Soon after, David moved to Northern California and continued to hone his game at Blinky's in Santa Clara. He quickly became a major presence in the many tournaments held there, but also supplemented his income with money games. He began working with A.Z. Turnbo who showed him how to setup and pour a shuffleboard. Early on, Dave's biggest shuffleboard influence was Darrol Nelson. Dave says that his favorite tournament win was at the 133 Club (Manteca, CA) Memorial Day tournament in 2002. He took first place in the Open Singles event, beating Darrol and Joe Hudson to get there. He also teamed up with Darrol to place in Pro Doubles at the 2001 and 2002 NASC tournaments in Reno, NV and at the 2008 Presidents' Day tournament in Stockton, CA.

David has taken 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in many large tournaments in Pro Singles, Pro Doubles and in various Team events. Before he left California, Dave was the #1 ranked player in the state. He also served as President of the California Shuffleboard Hall of Fame. In his "spare time" Dave was a professional bass fisherman.

In the nomination letter from Hal Perry and Eddie Brayman, Eddie wrote:

"From his first entering Blinky's, in Santa Clara, CA, Dave was playing toe-to-toe with some of the best players in the country. Devoting a huge amount of time and energy into long practice sessions and studying the masters, Dave continued to improve his game and soon became the most dominant player in California. His devotion and love of shuffleboard quickly allowed him to exercise another one of Dave's talents, teaching. Dave loved to help others and pass his knowledge on to other players trying to improve their game.

Besides his success as a player, Dave has contributed to shuffleboard in so many other ways. Dave has been building, refinishing, and every performing every aspect of board maintenance for over 20 years. He has been part of the core of the NASC Reno shuffleboard table crew for many years. Dave has been in charge of board installation and maintenance for a number of small, medium, and large tournaments over the years."

Since moving to Texas, Dave has continued his winning ways, getting 1sts in NASC team events, singles in Indiana, doubles in Cedar Park, TX and cashed in the Houston Holiday Open, the Texas Open and the Southwest Open. He is now ranked #11 in the U.S.

Dave, along with his business partner Jim Lynch, own Allstar Shuffleboards. They manufacture shuffleboards from the ground up and have worked very hard to perfect player-friendly boards.
