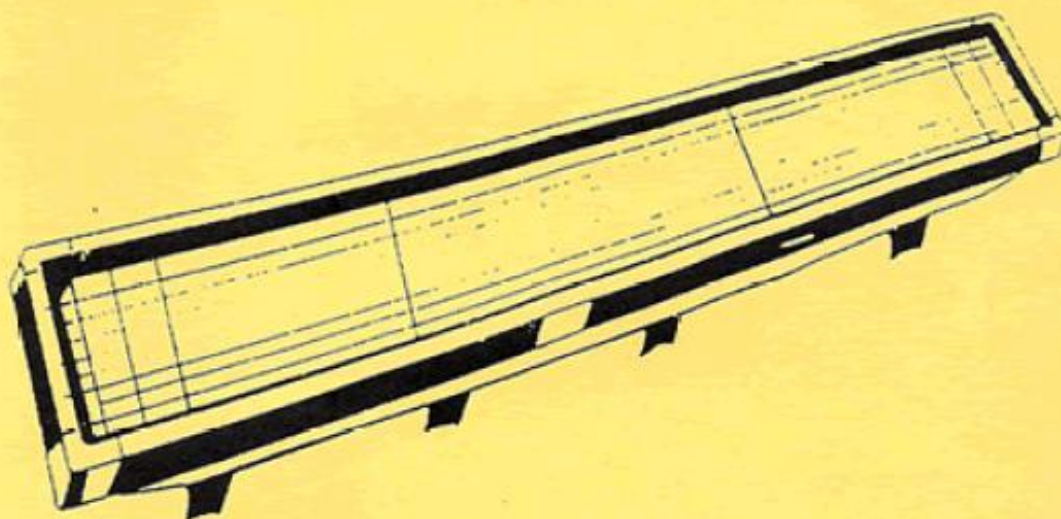

Mary Brown

In 1979, Mary Brown went to Deer Park Tavern one night to watch Bud & Sharon Esterline play shuffleboard. It was the first time she had ever seen a board and the first time she saw Larry Brown. She was immediately drawn to both. She and Larry began dating and she started working at the bar with him. It gave her an opportunity to watch the game. The locals encouraged her to begin throwing weights and began to play every day. She watched Larry and Bud play in tournaments and it looked like a lot of fun, but also difficult and stressful at the same time. Mary went to most of the Bourbon Spring and Fall tournaments after she got off work and would watch the finals and of course, buy a shirt. About late 80's early 90's, Mary played in the IN State Mixed (DJ's in Warsaw) and a few other very small tournaments.

Mary describes her first major tournament:

"My first big one was at Bourbon. Larry had no partner so he said we could play. It was really scary because we had to play Koontz & Kinsey. Koontz said I really needed to stop shaking or I was going to dent the board! I have no idea who else we played that day but I was hooked. Since then, I play in the IN State Tournament every year and many more. Thanks to Larry Huffer's example, we began to travel out of state. He started us going to Vegas and now we make Reno, OKC, Michigan, Ohio and Missouri tournaments regularly."

Mary says she has had a lot of great partners and wins including her first win, a mixed doubles with Larry at Lucky's in North Webster. She won the IN State Ladies Singles in 1995, the State Mixed Doubles with Larry in 1997, and a Bourbon Mixed with Mike Johnson in 1998. Freddie Thuman was fortunate enough to draw and win with Mary in Reno in 2001 and Bill Melton had the same luck in OKC in 2004. There are other wins, too numerous to mention, but Mary says "The best win was with Debby V @ the Bourbon Spring Doubles in 2001 and the most fun money spot was a 3rd with Sheryl Cockerill in Houston, Missouri's Ladies tournament."

Mary and Larry have been married 24 years, and have three "kitten" kids, Betsy, Lilly and Pooh. Mary is also very close to her Dad, Jim who will be 90 this year, her sister and brother-in-law Beverly and Jim English and her nephews Jim & wife Tracy and Scott English.

Deb started playing shuffleboard in 1982, at the American Bar in her home town of Portland, Indiana. And it was there that she first met Bobby V. She was out celebrating her 25th birthday with her girlfriends. Bob says the only reason she even noticed him was because he had just won a tournament and had \$100.00 bills hanging out of every pocket. From then on they dated and Deb started spending time at the Palace Bar in Fairmount, Indiana.

Deb says, "There I met several female shuffleboard players, including Bobby's sister, Marisa. The girls asked if I would talk to Bob about sponsoring a ladies team in the Grant County Ladies Shuffleboard League. He did, and the Place Bar Ladies Team won the league six years in a row. Then the ladies league folded. I continued to play in the Grant County Men's League and also in the Central Indiana League, where the American Bar and the Place Bar were members."

She learned a lot about the game by playing in the leagues. And she learned even more by watching Bobby V play. "Bob has been a great mentor and a great partner, not to mention a great husband. We were in Las Vegas for a tournament and after much coaxing by friends, we were married at a small chapel on January 21, 1990." So began a great partnership.

Among Deb's accomplishments are: 1st place Ladies Singles at The Board Talk Tournament, several Indiana State Tournaments, and some Michigan State Tournaments. She has several 1st place finishes in both Mixed Doubles and Open Doubles in many tournaments in both Indiana and Michigan, including the IN State Tournament. In 1994's IN State Tourney, De had 1st place finishes in the Open Doubles, Mixed Doubles, and Ladies Singles. Probably the win with the biggest payout was as a member of an eight person team in Las Vegas.

She notes, "Two of my most memorable wins in Open Doubles were with female partners. Cheryl Collins and I, @ the Lakeside Lounge in Lake Orion, MI, beat John McDermott and Lee Mc Donald along the way, and Mary Brown and I, at the Bourbon Legion beat Bobby V and Rick Royal in the finals."

Deb says, "Shuffleboard has been very, very good to me and I've made some great friends along the way."

Her loving family includes her parents, her brother and sister-in-law, four nieces, a nephew, three great nieces & a great nephew.

I have known Deb for quite sometime. I first met her in the early 90's when the Las Vegas tournaments were the biggest and best going on. Deb has since become a good friend and I look forward to visiting with her and Bobby each year when I travel to Indiana to be with my mother. I have played against Deb and I'm here to tell you that she is very well schooled at the game. Deb is a competitor and one welcome lady to have as your partner. She is one heck of a nice person and I am blessed to have her as a friend.

Congratulations Deb on your well deserved induction. I am looking forward to celebrating this great occasion with your at a later date. I want to thank you for all you have done for me and for being a good friend.
