Jim, known in shuffleboard as Jimmy, was successful in winning Singles, Doubles and Mixed events. The Mixed team of Jimmy and Joanie were very tough competition.

Jimmy Hay, and his wife, Beryl, attended many Canadians in the 70s and early 80s. Jimmy was always a gentleman. He was 6'+ and to watch him play shuffleboard was mesmerizing, as his reach and span shots were an art form.

Jimmy and Beryl moved to Ottawa, Ontario in 1982 to be with his family and to live in a different climate to help him with his arthritis. At one time in his life, the disease caused him to live in a wheelchair. It was unfortunate that Jim did not continue his shuffleboard career. If he had, he would have undoubtedly acquired several more Canadian Championships.

Jimmy has definitely earned a place in the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress Hall of Fame as a Player.
