Theresa began her shuffleboard career in 1968 with a team out of ANAF Unit #100 club in Vancouver, captained by Fred Baumbach.

About a year later, Theresa moved over to ANAF Unit #45 in North Vancouver where she joined a team that played out of that Club.

ANAF Unit # 45 was the hotbed of shuffleboard on the North Shore and the level of competitive play there, by both men and women, was extreme, to say the least.

Theresa's natural talent for the game and her skill set flourished quickly in this environment and it was no surprise that she was soon captaining her own teams, which were always competitive, with well known players such as Amy Burns, Darlene Docile, Brian Burchynsky and others.

In the years that followed, Theresa was on many ANAF "Provincial Command" winning teams and she won numerous "British Columbia Open Championships" as well.

Theresa has also had success at the highest level of shuffleboard in our country, that being the "Canadian Shuffleboard Championships" where she has won the Ladies Doubles event, four times, once with Darlene Docile and three times with Joanie Millar.
