Kabal was first introduced to the game shuffleboard in his early teens when he went to Jimmy Little's corner store to hangout. They had a board setup in the store and Kabal would throw rocks for hours (until he was old enough to go to the bar). During his time at the store Don McAlpine gave him several pointers.

Kabal officially started playing board in 1972 when Ernie Webb asked him to play on his team "Jolly Green". Kabal was taken back by the fact that they had teams and a league. He played with the Jolly Greens for several years before moving on to another team.

At the 1975 Canadian Championships in Regina Kabal met Harvey Groleau and Rick Litman both from the Manitoba Shuffleboard Association. They were sitting together watching the championships and Harvey said "I will be playing in the Canadian Championships" so not to be outdone Kabal said "so will I" and at the Canadian Championships in Victoria in 1976.

Who played? As it turns out all 3 men played, Kabal in the Men's Doubles with Ernie Webb, Harvey in the Men's Singles and Rick in the Men's Doubles with Robbie Holgate.

Kabal has the great honour of saying that he has represented the Vancouver Island Shuffleboard Association (VISA) at the Canadian Championships in each decade for 50 years.
