Geoff started playing Shuffleboard about 1965 at the Dominion Hotel in Acton Ontario and then at the Charles Hotel in Milton in 1966 or 1967.

The Dominion Hotel Burnt down in 1978 and the league had to stop.

He then started playing in Milton in the winter of 1978 and was league President for several years.

He was a pretty easy going player and loved the game so much he would play with everyone who would ask him and continuously promoted the game.

The United Shuffleboard League originated in 1994 or 1995 which at that time had leagues from Acton, Erin, Georgetown, Milton and Oakville.



They travelled weekly to each place to play.

After the USL could no longer play out of the Charles Hotel in Milton, another venue was needed.

Geoff and his wife Audrey decided to insulate part of their garage and the league started to play there with only one board.

They were determined to not let shuffleboard fade away no matter what.

They started the league out of their house in the fall of 1993 with about 8 people.

Geoff eventually insulated the balance of the garage, installed a furnace and washroom to accommodate 2 more boards.

At the present time there are 4 boards in play every Friday night for league play and Geoff hosts OSA tournaments every month in Milton



- → He has been a huge part of organizing each of the Canadian Championships hosted by the OSA
- → He and his wife Audrey were the main organizers of the Championship when held in Milton Ontario in 1986
- → He has provided boards and every spare minute of his time ensuring the tournaments run smoothly.
- → He provides his boards out whenever someone needs extra for a tournament and supports the Royal Canadian Legion Zone, District and Provincial Playdowns.
